



#### Happy New Year everyone!

It will be interesting to see what 2023 brings to the Greater Hume Council area.



- \* Due to the **Morgan Country Car Club** holding their annual Swap Meet on the **last Sunday of March** the proposed new playground and addition to the toilet block near the Skate Park will only commence in April.
- \* **Telstra** are still waiting for approval from Crown Lands to use a small amount of space on the ground before relocating the Telstra tower onto the Optus tower at the Rec. Reserve. If you are having issues with **Telstra** mobile service or **NBN** contact Telstra to put a **complaint** in.
- \* Jindera received funding from the Stronger Country Communities grant program announced by Justin Clancy of \$210,000 for **solar street lighting** in **Pioneer Dr**.
- \* It was very disappointing to know that visitors to Jindera using the primitive camping area at the **Jindera Recreation Reserve** were harassed by two different groups of teenagers between Christmas and New Year. Abusive language was used and rocks thrown at caravans in the early hours of the morning. This resulted in very negative comments being placed on the Wiki camping site telling people not to come to Jindera. Other incidents happened with a white ute being involved. **Police have been notified** and security cameras are operational.



## JINDERA RURAL FIRE BRIGADE

As an update for those **residents new to the Jindera community**, the Jindera Rural Fire Brigade is run entirely by volunteers and relies on the Rural Fire Service (RFS) Fire Control Centre (FCC) in nearby Albury to provide logistic support.

Normally equipped with three firefighting appliances. These consist of two Category 1 Heavy Tankers & a smaller Category 2 Tanker that provide frontline firefighting and emergency response. These vehicles are further supported with a 4x4 personnel transport vehicle and a multi configuration trailer.

During winter we sent one of our tankers to get a mid-life make over. Thanks to the NSW rural fires service tanker refurbish program. This tanker is now up to date with the latest safety features including LED lights, crew protection halo and much more.





#### **Local First Responders**

The brigade is also the local first responders and has capability for **Motor Vehicle Accidents**, **Structural Fires** in addition to providing support in **flood and storms**. We now have a **designated sandbagging area** at the station to save residents having to go into Lavington for sandbags.

This facility has had a lot of use this year, especially when a literal waterfall went through the house of one of our members. Quick action by our brigade family saved a lot of angst and further water damage by mopping up the water quickly and sandbagging the house for further downpours.







#### NSW health expands access to Japanese Encephalitis Vaccine

The change in eligibility criteria removes the need for people living in highrisk areas to spend at least four hours per day outdoors and clarifies other criteria to help people assess the free vaccine.

You are eligible if you:

- Regularly spend time outdoors placing you at risk of mosquito bites, OR
- Are experiencing homelessness OR
- Are living in conditions with limited mosquito protection (e.g. tents, caravans, dwellings with no insect screens) OR
- Are engaging in outdoor flood recovery (clean-up) efforts, including repeated professional or volunteer deployments

JE vaccine is available through local General Practitioners (GPs), Aboriginal health services and pharmacists.

Albury and Greater Hume Shire are LGAs of high JEV concern.

People who meet the above criteria should make an appointment with their GP, pharmacist or Aboriginal Medical Service and let them know it is for the Japanese encephalitis vaccine as they may require a few days' notice to order the vaccine.



This is a closed Comp held at the 12 mile reserve with full catering provided, massive Saturday Night Raffles and the legendary Yabby Races.




