**Morgan's lookout** - a massive white granite outcrop on the Culcairn to Walbundrie Road - is a beautiful spot for a picnic with family and friends. The lookout provides an opportunity to get 360-degree views over this country. Thanks to the rain, things are looking green again right across the Greater Hume.

If you haven't been there for a while, you'll find the area has been refurbished with educational signage, toilets, picnic tables, and new lookout infrastructure. This has all been part of a project that began late in 2018. The new signage provides visitors with the opportunity to learn about our local history.



You will find information about local legend 'Mad Dan' Morgan, a notorious bushranger of the 1860s, who roamed the area. He was a very able horseman, but became involved in several major robberies. He got his name 'Mad Dan' because his moods could rapidly swing from nervousness through to rage and violence. Indeed the place is called 'Morgan's lookout' because it was the actual hiding spot that he used to evade police capture.



Greg's interests can now be further realised – grandfather-hood, photography, and railways – particularly steam engines.


He and Shirley suffered a devastating house fire recently, and it is a testament to their stature in Jindera with the support that rallied round them as they battled to rebuild their losses.

I had met John on a previous ramble and thought with his kind countenance and air of hospitality he could have played any Henry Ford or Jimmy Stewart movie role. I could even see him filling in for Tom Hanks in Saving Private Ryan

But today he looks like an extra from Oklahoma with his older man jeans, bright flannel shirt and boot like runners. I instantly picture him skipping down Jelbart road singing at the top of his lungs "*Oh what a beautiful morning*". John is compact and clear cut with thoughtful blue eyes and a ready smile of amused friendliness which I imagine arouse feelings of warmth with whomever he is dealing with. I reintroduce myself to John and remind him that I have had 2 major ops and will be taking the walk easy (is there any other way?).

John looks me up and down kindly, but I can tell his thinking along the lines of ... 'This guys gonna fold faster than Superman on Laundry day'!

The weather has considerably cooled since my initial walk with The **Jindera Blokes Walk**, but it's a lovely Sunday morning, we have set off from the footy club and I have picked my mark well. It's not long before John and I start to talk the type of rubbish men of certain ages excel in, but our saving grace is our combined selfeffacing nature as we talk down old age.

"Why is it that old people always say there is no place like home ...and then you put them in one..." John retorts, "I hope when I inevitably choke to death on gummy bears people just say I was killed by bears and leave it at that" he says with a smile. We chat about our wives and I tell him that I have been happily married for 10 years... out of 30.

John plays a straight bat and he struggles to say anything uncomplimentary about his wife, who supplies the magnificent cakes and slices to the group for our consumption after the walk. "*She's a marvel*" I say and John responds non verbally in the affirmative.

We walk past the Museum (best regional one in a 1000k radius) and I wonder aloud, "*Do you reckon if it was all kids paintings in there, Margie would display them all on refrigerators*?"

I ask John if he can feel the endorphins kicking in yet? I have asked the right bloke, John seems to know his stuff and explains "*The endorphins interact with the receptors in your brain that reduce your perception of pain*". Unprompted he continues. "*Endorphins also trigger a positive feeling in the body, similar to that of morphine.*"

Up Dwight Forest Road and a sharp turn left puts us over the footbridge. We are secure in last place and John shares with me his



enjoyment of his fairly recent move here to Jindera (remembering you have to be here 30 years to be a local). He enjoys helping his son renovate his son's house which is in another provincial town and he loves pottering around his shed and garden. (He has the best lawn outside of Kentucky USA)

John talks engagingly about his former career, high up in the stratosphere of Local Council admin. I tell John that I found it tense working at Centrelink, knowing if you got fired you would have to come back the next day!

John has had his share of tragedy and troubled times but he wears it well and accepts life's offerings and is positive and hopeful about the future.

I ask John what floats his boat most about living in Jindy (does anyone really call it that?) "*I just like the simple small-town passion that people have here and I find it very community orientated.*" I then ask, "*if you could live anywhere, where would it be*"? He replies "*This will do us for the time being, just a hop, step and a jump from The Big Smoke and we enjoy the 4 seasons you get here*!" The Autumn sun has run out of its feeble heat as we round golf club road, back on the main drag.

We have done an hours walk and it feels good and I have relished my chat with John.

John is starting to puff a bit. I ask my last question.

"*What's your favourite TV show?*" John hits me with his mega watt smile and I swear he is gonna do 'The Surrey with the Fringe on Top'. "*The Biggest Loser*" he replies. "*Ironic, isn't it?*" He chuckles all the way back to the footy ground where those delectable spouse-made slices await.

Meanwhile as I am left to walk alone, I ponder on 'irony'. A song comes to mind ... 'It's like rain on your wedding day. It's a black fly in your Chardonnay. It's the free ride you've already paid for. It's the good advice you never took.'

Later as I woof down a slice that's been forced on me, I catch John eyeing me. "I reckon your wife could get a job at the Football Club Canteen ... she's that bloody good" I say.

John smiles like Tom Hanks did when Mat Damon made it back safely in Saving Private Ryan.

# JINDERA COMMUNITY FORUM

Come and join a group of locals who are interested in our community and its people, and who would like to help improve the facilities our community offers to both visitors and residents alike.

### \*\*\* Key points from the April meeting \*\*\*

Recreation Path – GHC has allocated \$25,000 in the budget for the feasibility study.

<u>Multi-purpose stadium</u> – Plan is currently being redesigned with a Council workshop planned for May 5.

The total cost is approx \$3.6m with funding being sought 1/3 Federal Govt, 1/3 NSW Govt and 1/3 GHC.

Solar farm monies being allocated to the stadium.

<u>Urana St footpath to Pioneer Park</u> – Currently in the 2023/4 budget. The new play equipment is bringing more people now to the park.

<u>Dump Point</u> – Still planned for new off-road parking area in rec ground off Urana St. New area will necessitate tree removal, although looking to keep lemon scented gum.

Molkentin Road Intersection – Part of these works are in this year's budget, however current delays with culvert works from the recreation ground are holding up further works.

<u>Creek Street Parking opposite Health Centre</u> – GHC currently looking into options of no parking, parallel parking or other.

<u>Jindera Street</u> – Drain on western side will be reformed behind new residential blocks (facing Jindera St), being planned by the Lutheran Church.

Urana Rd and Pioneer Dve Roundabout - In budget for next year.

<u>Urana Street East Side</u> – A new shared footpath is planned in 2021/22 from Kay Drive, along Molkentin Rd and then north along Urana St through to the Village Green.

Urana Street West Side – Shared path from Dight St to Pioneer Dr is planned for 2021/22.

Jelbart Road – Roadworks have been put back due to funding – now 2022/23.

Dight Street – Kerb and guttering is planned for rec ground area.

Mitchell to Goulburn – Footpath planned from Pomegranate Estate.

<u>Urana Road Major Intersections</u> – Currently major intersections are being reviewed – Jelbart, Hueske, Hawthorn Roads.

Street Lighting – All street lights are now LED.

New Sewerage Treatment Works - \$7.5m for 5000 connections which needs to be completed within 5 years.

<u>Water</u> – Anticipated that current supply will be at capacity in 2030. Council currently looking at options with possible additional tank on western side of Jindera.

<u>GHC Draft Jindera Residential Land Use Strategy</u> – Report is available at Council office or online. Residents are encouraged to review the document.

<u>4% Growth</u> – Currently Jindera at 4% growth per year, which is high. Growth movement is expected to the west in the future. Jindera has population of 1500 in town and 2600 in surrounds currently.

<u>Playground at Rec Ground</u> – Two grants have been unsuccessful. Currently being funded by the future sale of three blocks of land in the Pech Ave area. BBQs, shelters and paths are now being included in the plans which are currently being costed. Works are hoped to be started by end of this year.

<u>Dight Street Roundabout</u> – Not in near future at present.

Roundabout Reflective Tape - Council has decided not to place reflective tape on the existing roundabouts.

### JINDERA COMMUNITY FORUM Cont'd...

<u>CBD Traffic</u> – In response to the Forum letter re the CBD traffic, traffic figures from December did not support a 40kph zone – 87.3% vehicles travel at 50kph or less, with 4300 vehicle movements per day (15% being trucks – 66% of these travelling less than 40kph).

Council will place their camera in the CBD to watch traffic behaviour again, especially in relation to u-turns and turning right into the Shell service station. There may be a review on the turn into the service station.

The Jindera solar farm traffic is anticipated to be 30 heavy vehicle movements per day for the 18 month construction phase. Glenellen solar farm is anticipated to be 40 heavy vehicle movements plus bus movement when ferrying staff, during construction. Overall the impact of the solar traffic is considered low in comparison to the existing traffic numbers.

<u>Rec Ground Oval Upgrade</u> – Now complete with good feedback following the first football game on previous Saturday.

<u>Village Green</u> – New sealed paths in place, with some problems from scooter riders damaging the retainer walls and sound shell.

<u>Pioneer Drive</u> – Kerbing almost finished, with southern side drain to be cleaned and new culverts going in those driveways to facilitate water movement. Roundabout at Jindera Street is starting next week and road surface to be completed.


### Jindera Community Garden Update





The cold weather is seeping into our bones and the corners of the museum. Other than for the Tea Room, a warm jumper is needed for a visit on these winter days. This is the time of year we have several schools visit as the museum remains a strong teaching resource for many educational facilities in the district and further afield.

We have also had a visit from a group of students who have English as their second language, many from Africa. They found the museum fascinating as many of the ways of doing things were similar to how they would be done in Africa still today, with machines and power luxury items. These children ranging in age from 12 to 17, spend time at the English language school for 1 year before being integrated into mainstream schools. Many are refugee's and have come from quite traumatic backgrounds, so it was interesting to impart, often through an interpreter, what life for the early pioneers was like.

Last month we hosted the screening of the movie

Mad Dog Morgan that was produced in 1976. This movie was filmed in various locations around the district and some of the scenes were filmed in the museum.

The son of a museum member was working for Umbrella Productions, the distributors of the film in Australia, back in 2019. He and another member redid footage of many of the scenic areas in this



district that were originally filmed. They were very surprised at how similar the area had remained. This footage was turned into a trailer that we also showed at the film night.

Thanks to David Hanel, all of the doors in the house leading onto the vestibule now close, so we were able to provide a snug theatre for those that attended. Rumour has it that Dan Morgan would collect his mail from the local Huon Post Office that was situated just 6 km north of Jindera. This Post Office now sits in the grounds of the museum.

The museum would like to embark on a major building project in the next couple of years but we need the Jindera and district communities help to do so.

This museum that sits in our community, is exceptional in quality and authenticity, but like all older establishments, it needs constant upkeep. The museum is owned by its members and is run completely by volunteers and we would like to ask you for your help to fund the next stage of our development.



#### Business dealt with at the meeting included:

Council endorsed the timeline and process for the recruitment of the new General Manager for Greater Hume Council. Advertising will commence in February 2022 with the successful applicant scheduled to commence on 1 July 2022.

Council resolved not to make any changes to the amendments to the Greater Hume Local Environmental Plan 2012 stipulated within the planning proposal for zoning & minimum lot size changes for the expansion of the Jindera Industrial Estate. The planning proposal will be forwarded to Parliamentary Counsel.

Council adopted the Greater Hume Council Section 7.12 Fixed Development Consent Levy Development Contributions Plan 2021.

Council approved the development application for the New Roof Structure and Deck at the Woomargama Hotel subject to conditions.

The establishment of the reference committee 'Holbrook District Community and Business Group' was endorsed by Council. The proposed Terms of Reference were adopted by Council.

Council approved a range of applications for submission to the Stronger Country Communities Fund, to the value of \$600,000.

It was agreed that Council will extend the Memorandum of Understanding with the Murray Regional Tourism Board for a further three years.

Council resolved the Greater Hume Australia Day 2022 community event will be held in Holbrook.

Council adopted the 2017 – 2022 Delivery Program and 2021 – 2022 Operational Plan and supporting documentation including the Long Term Financial Plan, Revenue Policy and Budget. The revenue policy outlines Council fees and charges and will be implemented from 1 July 2021. Copies of the documentation is avail-

able at the Greater Hume Council offices or website.

Council agreed that the delivery of face to face customer service functions in Holbrook will be transferred from the Holbrook administration office to the Holbrook Library. Technical aspects of the move are currently being completed and further information on a commencement date for the new arrangements will be provided as soon as possible. Saturday opening hours will be removed from Henty, Culcairn and Holbrook from 1 July 2021.

Council approved the reinstatement of the Gerogery Commemoration Hall Management Committee.

The renewal of the lease between Greater Hume Council and Wazlen Pty Ltd for the Holbrook Submarine Café was approved.

Council endorsed 4 road projects valued at 7.1m for submission to the Fixing Local Road Program – Round 3.


Council has appointed Hurst Earthmoving Pty Ltd to the Molkentin Floodway RCBC at a cost of \$311,279.89 (excl. GST)

### Mandatory changes to lodging a Development Application



The NSW Government passed amendments to the Environment Planning and Assessment Act 1979 which will require planning applications to be lodged with Council through the NSW Planning Portal.

As of 1 July 2021, these State Government changes will require customers to submit all planning applications with Council online utilising the NSW Government Planning Portal. Council will not be able to accept planning applications over the counter, post or via email. These changes provide a new era for planning across NSW with the Planning Portal providing an easily accessible, user-friendly and transparent system for lodging planning applications.

From July 1 2021 customers are required to use the Portal to lodge the full range of planning applications, including: Development Applications (DAs) including modifications;

Complying Development Certificates (CDCs);

Construction Certificates (CCs); - Occupation Certificates;

Subdivision Certificates; and

Section 68 Applications including plumbing, solid fuel heaters, transportable buildings etc.

It is recognised that some customers may find the required changes challenging and if you require assistance using the Planning Portal and were unable to find the answer within the help and support section please contact Service NSW on 1300 305 695 or email: info@service.nsw.gov.au

Council Environment & Planning staff will be available to help with some enquiries, however please note that this is a NSW Government initiative and therefore we may not have all the answers.

Jindera Anglers together with NSW Fisheries have stocked the 2 local Jindera Dams with 500 Yellowbelly Fingerlings, the footy oval dam and the travelling stock reserve dam at the Northern end of town.

Hang on for a minute before you rush off to catch them ..... they are fingerlings and the will take a year or so to get to a decent size.

This will be an ongoing commitment by Jindera Anglers to give the youth and families an opportunity to catch a fish locally (we do ask you respect the fish and use the catch and release fishing method.)

Last fishing comp was held the last weekend of May, with the majority of fishos tackling the Hume Weir where the redfin are still going strong.

The best fish winner was Leif with a ripper 51cm yellowbelly, Leif also had some redfin for a bag of 263cm. Best longest bag of fish for the weekend was Jason Boyd with 20 redfin and a small 30cm trout for a total of 648cm.

Other good bags of redfin were caught by Brent 20 reddies = 599cm, Laz 20 redfin = 597cm, Sham 14 reddies = 390cm, Donk 8 reddies = 187cm, Ricko 20 reddies = 580cm.

Some of the fishers targeted specific fish species to qualify for fisho of the year, unfortunately for most for a lot of effort the results were disappointing.

With the last comp being held at the end of June the fisherman of the year is still up for grabs. 
### PRESENTATION DAY AND GOURMET LUNCH
