# Famous murder mystery *The Mousetrap* by Agatha Christie is dramatically bought to life in Jindera by students of Saint Mary MacKillop College

Over the weekend of the 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> of June, the Jindera School of Arts Hall came to life with a production of Agatha Christie's *The Mousetrap*. This murder mystery is the world's longest running play (performed multiple times per day in London since its debut in 1952).

The play's enduring success can be attributed to the complex and entertaining mix of characters, in addition to Christie's ability to keep the audience guessing as to which of them it is who 'dunnit'. In short, 8 strangers get snowed in at an English countryside guest house, only to learn that one of them is a murderer. The play is both entertaining and suspenseful and leaves you (or me anyway!) kicking yourself that you missed key pieces of evidence that might have enabled you to solve the mystery before the final reveal.

The Jindera Hall was the perfect location for our play. Its rich history and quaint features helped us to create the atmosphere we wanted for a holistic theatre experience. We sus-

The cast was largely comprised of students from **Saint Mary MacKillop College**, with a few additional actors coming from the local community. The show was well received by the audiences and it was a great joy to witness the growth of each of the actors throughout the entire process, particularly in the culmination of the three fantastic performances we saw. They should all be very proud of their achievements.

We would like to thank the Jindera Museum for their generous support in lending us props and furniture, as well as Olivia Hanel, the president of the School or Arts Hall for allowing us to stage the play there and for kindly permitting us keep the set



pended fairy lights from the ceiling and extended the stage over the two sets of stairs, so as to include the two existing doors as part of our set. In addition to this, we decided to match the paint colour of our set with the interior of the hall, thereby creating a sense of unity and bringing the audience into the space. Over the long weekend prior to the show, we constructed our set, complete



in place – leaving the door open for a potential reprisal of the show down the track!





# Cake Stall Favourite

# Jelly Cake Recipe

*Ingredients* 

4 cups SR Flour

4 eggs

2 cups castor sugar

160 g butter

2 cups milk

½ teaspoon vanilla

2 pkts strawberry jelly Desiccated coconut



#### Method

Beat eggs. Add milk. Continue beating and add sugar and vanilla. Mixture should be creamy looking. Add melted butter followed by the flour until well mixed.

Place the mixture into patty cake papers filling halfway.

Bake in oven 160 degrees for 10 to 15 minutes fan forced until golden brown. Wait until cool before taking papers off.

Make jelly using both packets and 2 cups of boiling water. Mix well, add 1 cup cold water. Refrigerate until the jelly has just started to set. Dip cakes in then roll in coconut.

Place on tray in the fridge for a couple of hours. Half the cakes and fill with whipped cream.

These can be frozen with the cream in.

Mixture makes 40 approx.



> the Furphy and Farrer Collections.






We will also visit Cactus Country, Australia's largest cactus garden that has won several tourism awards recently.


