AUSKICK IS THRIVING IN JINDERA!

The noise of happy, active kids can again be heard coming from Jindera's Footy oval every Friday evening. Auskick is up and running again this year and the kids are loving it.

Auskick is a fun program for kids for 5 to 12 year



old's. During weekly sessions, our kids not only practice footy skills but learn about cooperation, team work and gain selfconfidence. It's not just the kids who get to participate. The parents and carers who are volunteering each week are benefiting from being actively involved.

Last year, Jindera Auskick, was recognised as the one of the fastest growing centres

with the highest female participation in NSW. This year registrations have again increased from 120 to 140 Auskickers. Wow.... Where have all the kids come from? With thanks to our sponsors, Sancon Civil, Red Airconditioning, Redi2hire, Taylor Your Body and Sportspower we were able to purchase more playing jumpers and the equipment necessary to cater for so many kids.

We have five groups lead by our dedicated coaches to ensure that every child gets a go. With kids grouped by ability level, they practice their skills and finish the session by playing a mini AFL game. At the end of the night,

lucky kids receive encouragement awards, then its sausage sizzle time before heading home.

Whenever possible during the home and away season, we organise fun games to play against other Hume League Auskick teams. Sometimes its first thing in the





morning or else they show off their skills at halftime of the senior's game, where they can play in front of a big crowd and cheer on the Bulldogs.

This year, planning is underway to organise a trip for our Auskickers to the MCG to watch an AFL match. Jindera Auskick is hosting a **Comedy Night/ Auction fundraiser** on the **9**th **of July at Thurgoona Golf Club**.

The very funny Bev Killick is headlining, supported by

FoodShare



Rural Care Link is now an agency for Albury Wodonga Regional FoodShare and can access their Community Pantry Vouchers, for people in need.

FoodShare's Community Pantry program was developed in response to the evolving impacts of COVID-19 to support people in the community experiencing financial hardship.



This program offers a choice between collecting a food hamper, which is packed by their volunteers, or visiting the FoodShare Shop, located in Wodonga, to individually select from their range of gro-



cery items. These services are accessible by purchasing a Food-Share voucher, which provides excellent value for people in need.

Depending on availability, the shop and hampers contain food staples such as fresh fruit and vegetables, long life milk, fresh and frozen protein as well as non-perishable food such as cereal, muesli bars and canned food. Frozen prepared meals and some household items are also available as well as dog and cat food for pet owners.

Pet Owners

Thanks to the wonderful support of the Albury Volunteer Branch of RSPCA NSW, Rural Care Link is able to offer community pet owners in need with vital help for their pets.

FREE Suicide prevention Workshop

Break the Stigma Around Mental Health, Suicide and Asking for Help

Would you know how to tell if someone you love was thinking of suicide?

In Australia we lose 9 lives to suicide each day. Studies show that between 80-85% of Australians will be touched by suicide at least once in their lifetime. Suicide is also the leading cause of death for individuals aged between 15 and 44 years of age. Does that shock you?

C. Jones Training is a business dedicated to breaking down the stigma around mental health, suicide and asking for help. Based in Holbrook NSW, our plan is to educate the greater community around suicide to ensure we have the tools to assist those we love who may be struggling.

Break the Stigma (Delivery of CALM Care) is a ½ day suicide awareness/prevention workshop that educates the community on how to respond to suicide risks in loved ones.

Participants learn;

- The facts and Myths around suicide
- How to spot when a person may be thinking of suicide
- How to ask about suicide
- And how to access services to assist the individual
- And so much more.



During the event at this world class museum, small campfires burnt in tubs around the site, many keeping the camp-ovens hot until eating time arrived.


Damper accompanied this great feast and billy tea was on hand for anyone interested although organisers can report most preferred a drink of a different colour and temperature!

tings, power connections and outside concreting the last of the requirements to be completed. We should see this project operational by the end of this month.


Several larger maintenance jobs need attention and ways to bring the Glenellen school to the site are being considered.


Going into winter members should take the time to check your boat/trailer for wear and tear and give them a good maintenance check.
