Graham has advised the last part of our electronic display boards are now in place. The signs are showing the correct temperature now that all filters are in place. The brigade will be updating the information on the signs to keep everyone informed of changes as we move through the Bushfire Danger Period.


The signs can be remotely changed for important messages and our daily fire danger ratings. Recently we have advised

Jonathon Howard, President of Rural Care Link, said, "We think if a family aren't able to make ends meet, then the kids may be missing out on things everyone else takes for granted."



She was also the State Representative and State Vice President. Amongst all her CWA achievements she also volunteered on organizations within her hometown of Rand.





JINDERA COMMUNITY FORUM

Next Meeting is at the <u>Jindera School of Arts (Hall)</u> on ***** Tuesday, March 15, 2022 *****

***** 7:30pm *****



Come and join a group of locals who are interested in our community and its people, and who would like to help improve the facilities our community offers to both visitors and residents alike.

The Jindera Community Forum held a special meeting on <u>February 15</u> with key discussions on the <u>recent</u> <u>flooding and resultant sewerage problems.</u> The meeting was held with Steve Pinnuch and Greg Blackie in attendance from Greater Hume Council.

The key points from the meeting were as follows:

FLOODING:

- January 2022 saw a number of flooding incidents with 300-350mm of rain falling during the month.
- January 28/29 was the worst downpour with the levy heading into the Watson Street drain overflowing, resulting in the flooding of a series of houses, with further flooding down-stream.
- Jindera Street in the long term a western channel will divert water away from the Watson Street drain, but it is dependent on grant monies. This work is being incorporated with the Jindera Lutheran Church 20 lot subdivision on the western side of Jindera Street with the drain planned to be behind the new lots.
- Adams Street/Jindera Street in the short-term flooding is to be alleviated next year by a proposed drain down to the Watson Street drain.
- The majority of flood water came from the Singe Road area which then travelled along Bungowannah Road towards town.
- New Pioneer Drive/Urana Street Roundabout works will incorporate improved drainage for that intersection.
- Glenholm Estate flooding of levies occurred and Council will be reviewing the upkeep of the levies to alleviate further flooding.
- Huon Street North Four Mile Creek requires clearing of dead trees and a general clean-up. Council is looking at exotic tree removal and it was suggested they review the movement of water from upstream.
- Dight Street West it was suggested that Council clean out drains to reduce flooding in the interim prior to proposed kerb and guttering.
- Molkentin Road North flooding and silting needs to be reviewed by Council.
- Mitchell and Goulburn Streets flooding generally relating to Four Mile Creek and runoff Council advised that they may need to look at lowering Mitchell to solve the problem.
- General consensus that Council needs to clean out more drains.
- G Blackie requested that residents formally report all problems in general to Council so they are aware
 of any issues.

SEWERAGE

- Goulburn Street Stormwater infiltrating sewerage system resulting in actual sewerage flooding around the affected houses.
 - In 4-6 weeks a reflux valve will be fitted on the sewer main by Council near the pump station, and reflux valves offered to all houses affected by the flooding.
 - Manhole to be changed into temporary pump station pumping into rainwater tank as interim before planned sewer upgrade.
 - New pump station when sewer upgrade occurs.
- New improved impellors on pump stations in interim.
- Smoke testing of pipes in affected areas by Council will determine where pipes are running especially Goulburn/Huon/Mitchell Streets
- Jindera sewer upgrade muted to cost \$10m in 5 years time.
- Mitchell Street South western laneway manhole to be raised due to flooding and effluent (other manholes may be considered).
- Development Applications S Pinnuch outlined the process of development applications and stressed the value of nearby residents advising Council of concerns/perceived problems when receiving advise of land developments.







COUNCIL NEWS FEBRUARY 2022

The meeting was recorded and available for viewing on Council's website https://bit.ly/35uKFxX

Business dealt with at the 16 February 2022 meeting included:

Council will write to Albury City Council seeking re-establishment of the Lavington to Jindera Shared Path Working Group and investigate funding opportunities to undertake a feasibility study.

It was resolved that Council will seek support from the Hon. Sussan Ley MP, Member for Farrer to coordinate a meeting with the Hon. Paul Fletcher MP, Minister for Communication in relation to the poor mobile phone service throughout the Greater Hume Council area.

Council endorsed the submission made to the exhibition of the Draft State Significant Agricultural Land Map.

Council granted an extension of the swimming season at the Holbrook Pool to 20 March 2022, due to the need for a closure to undertake an abnormal clean earlier in the swimming season. The pool will be available to competitive swimmers training for events until 31 March on the provision that a qualified lifeguard provides supervision on a volunteer basis.

Council approved the Development Application (DA10.2021.72.1) for a service station, signage, landscaping and associated infrastructure on land described as Lots 1, 2 and 3 in DP12560 at Railway Parade and Sladen Street East subject to 56 conditions.

Council endorsed the draft Code of Meeting Practice, which will be advertised on Council website for public comment for a 28 day period commencing Monday 21 February.

Council agreed to allocate the \$56,754 remaining from the Henty Town Improvement Reserve to the Henty Sportsground Function Room extensions and refurbishment project.

Council endorsed the draft Payment of Expenses and Provision of Facilities to the Mayor and Councillors Policy, which will be advertised on Council website for public comment for a 28 day period commencing Monday 21 February.

A proposal for a major drainage structure on

Jindera-Walla Walla Road, Walla Walla was accepted.

The construction of the culvert under the Jindera-Walla Walla Road will be included in Council's 2022/23 budget.

Council agreed to the sale of 3613m2 on the corner of Pioneer Drive and Jindera St, Jindera to the Lutheran Church for \$230,000 (inc. GST). The proceeds from the sale will be allocated to the construction of the eastern side of Jindera St.

Council will include Ashley Lane, Culcairn as part of the next Road Strategy Review and will undertake works to minimize future flooding of access.

Business dealt with at the 2 February 2022 extraordinary meeting included:

The Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program – Round 3 funds will include the following allocations, \$1.25M to the replacement of the Jindera Swimming Pool shell subject to a further report to Council on any possible treatments that may remedy the structural issues with the existing pool shell. Additionally the remainder of the available funds, \$1,038,350 will be allocated to the Balfour Street drainage project.

Council approved the recruitment of an additional town planning staff member and administration support for the Environment and Planning Department.




