FORGOTTEN TRADES FESTIVAL at the Jindera Pioneer Museum

Ever wondered what life was like 100 or so years ago? The opportunity arose to find out when the beautiful grounds of the Jindera Pioneer Museum came alive last Sunday February 26 with the Forgotten Trades Festival.



The event highlighted bygone ways of bygone days and visitors got to see old crafts such as basket weaving, felt craft, spinning, weaving, calligraphy, jewellery making, hand shearing, rope making and wood crafts to name a few.

Museum president Margie Wehner said the idea for a forgotten trades festival was born during Jindera's 150th celebrations and the museums 50th anniversary in 2018, with the second event held in conjunction with the opening of the Tim Fischer Working Machinery Shed in 2021. This will be the third festival held and the museum's first major fund-raiser to help raise capital for the new building project.

"The festival was an idea that came from members, and it seemed a good idea to champion any of the skills and trades of people from this early era of pioneering in this district," said Margie, a third generation local. "Many people have no idea how long it takes to do or make many items that were used in this era. "It is easy to forget in our fast-

"It is easy to forget in our fastpaced world where everything is



so readily available that many items had to be made by hand or you had to just do without them."

One of the aims of the event was to provide visitors with the experience of seeing things made by hand or from scratch. "We want people to appreciate the efforts that people had to

make just to get by day by day and contemplate how difficult



and contemplate how difficult life often was for people back then. It was a slower form of living than we experience today because often many things took so long to make or build, you took your time or were more precise, so you went slower and steadier."

During the event, which was held between 12pm and 7pm, visitors were able to talk with operators and see demonstrations of many old skills. Old machinery was also in operation and the museum's butter maker, Dot, produced several batches of butter for visitors to taste or take home. "Many of these skills are also part of the heritage that we want to preserve and so the skills that go with that shouldn't be forgotten," said Margie.

"We often don't know when we will be without

something, so it is important for us to be able to know how to do it or make it when we can't just buy it. "When you are making or creating something from scratch





you always know what goes into it - there is no concern for quality or additives, so the trades you will see are earth skills, pure and simple."

We are particularly grateful for the amazing hard work of the many volunteers who worked tirelessly throughout the day, and the fabulous support from those featuring Forgotten

Trades and hand crafted wares. The museum hosted over 1700 people in the afternoon with exhibitors were very pleased with the interest and enthusiasm shown by those visiting.

All who attended were entertained by great music from White Line, the Albury Ukulele group and a great piano accordion player.

Workshops were highlighted and visitors encouraged throughout the afternoon by





the wonderful Steve Bowen, who graciously supports the museum whenever asked.

As the museum's first major fundraiser for its new building project we thank all the volunteers, exhibitors and all who attended to make the day so successful.







Annual Donation Request

I am sure the majority of landowners will have received correspondence from the Jindera Rural Fire Brigade this week for the **annual donation request**.


There has been an increase of over 200 landholders in the Jindera Brigade area over the last 5 years, which is indicative of recent subdivision and new housing activity. This increase places a greater demand on the brigade and the volunteers who keep it running. Approximately 25% of landholders respond to the Brigades request for a donation and this response is vital to keep the brigade functioning effectively and safely.

Your Donations Provide Our Equipment

The RFS pay for a baseline of **essential equipment**, such as tankers, radios, protective clothing, along with fuel and repairs.

The Jindera Brigade directly covers a lot of other expenditure that lifts its operational capability. In recent years that has included things like the following:

- Additional hand-held radios
- Pagers
- 🖀 Thermal Imaging camera
- Station maintenance costs
- Ttems of minor equipment
- Food for the first stages of extended deployments
- Improvements to the Station
- Car park improvements



First Responders

The Jindera Brigade is of course the first responder locally, the nearest assistance is an additional 15 minutes away. The early stages of any incident (whether it be fire, motor vehicle accident etc) are arguably the most critical, where early intervention can make a massive improvement to an outcome.

Become a RFS Member

As February has been unusually quiet this year with one grassfire and one motor vehicle accident, the captain has kept the members busy updating and maintaining the trucks and equipment.

We are always looking for new members so please *feel free to drop in* and have a chat if you see us at the station. We have many roles that you may be able to assist with that do not involve getting into a fire truck, and believe me, some of us do struggle.

Maintenance days for March are currently scheduled for Saturday 11th and 25th from 8.00am to approx. 10.00am.

Although the weather for the summer period has been mild, the additional rainfall has ensured a significant fuel load remains around the Jindera area that are drying out quickly and March is a traditionally dry month. 
