

Inaugural Seniors Festival for Jindera 2021



Last month, in partnership with Greater Hume Shire Council, RCL ran an inaugural Seniors Week Festival here in Jindera. Thanks to the persistence of local resident, Peter White, GHS were persuaded to add Jindera to the list of communities within their Shire that were allocated funding and overall coordination of their programmes.

RCL managed the development of two separate days dedicated to Jindera residents aged 55+ yrs. The focus was on people getting out into the community to participate in various activities and have fun.

The first event was held in the tranquil gardens of the Jindera Pioneer Museum on Wednesday 14th April. The working machinery shed was open with working engines on display and some tinkering. Other activities included Chair Yoga, a Tai Chi display, Bocce, Croquet, Ukulele lessons, Creative Metal Work display and an old fashioned BBQ Lunch. The weather was perfect and smiling faces were testament to an enjoyable time.

The following week, we ran a Seniors Expo on the Tuesday at Jindera Community Hub. Activities started with Gentle Exercise in the library area lead by Colleen Lord OAM, and the day continued with a myriad of activities, including wood burning, card making, macramé, beading, beeswax wraps, wooden plane building and many other crafts, all of which can be accessed through local people and groups such as "Stitch & Chat".

There was a representative from Services NSW who was helping people with access to their services and vouchers. Rachel Proctor from The Flower Mill demonstrated flower arranging and Dr Brian Lord demonstrated how to pot up a Bonsai. Lucky door prizes were provided by Rachel, and by Jodie from Jo & Co., and a sumptuous lunch was enjoyed by all.

Over the two days we saw close to 100 people take part in these events, and RCL are already getting excited about what to include in next years Seniors Festival.

A big thank you must go to Peter White for getting this off the ground for Jindera, and the tireless efforts,

as always, of our wonderful RCL Volunteers, and of course to Greater Hume Shire Council's Susan Kane and Betty Chaloner.



ROAD CLOSURE – Jindera Street, Jindera

Greater Hume Council gives notice of the closure of a small section of Jindera Street between Pioneer Drive and Pech Avenue, Jindera.

The section of road is closed due to a new roundabout being constructed at the intersection of Jindera Street and Pioneer Drive, Jindera. It is envisaged that the time frame for the road closure will be 6 weeks, from Monday, 26 April to Monday, 7 June 2021.



Road diversions and detours will be in place during construction directing local traffic around Pech Avenue.

A healthy morning tea and a BBQ lunch was provided for all participants.



Draft Jindera Residential Land Use Strategy

Greater Hume Council recently announced the development of a draft Jindera Residential Land Use Strategy which provides the strategic framework to guide future residential growth of Jindera. The strategy was funded by NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment.

Currently Jindera has approximately 12 years supply of residential zoned land based on a take-up rate of 30 dwellings per annum since 2015.

Preparation of the strategy has been informed by stakeholder and community consultation including expressions of interest from landowners. From those engagements, the study area investigated by the strategy was set to the urban area of Jindera and surrounds bounded by Dunwandren Lane, Wehner Lane, Vine Drive, Hueske Road and including Kingston Hill and a road reserve.

The report considers the residential demand for vacant residential land. In the next 20 years, the strategy predicts that new dwellings will grow from 893 dwellings currently to 1,853 dwellings by 2041 to meet forecast population growth and household occupancy rates.



The strategy identifies proposed residential land supply for RU5 village zone which has a minimum lot size of 600m2, R2 Low Density Residential zone that has a minimum lot size of either 2000m2 or 4000m2 and R5 Large Lot Residential which has a minimum lot size of 2ha. The number of proposed lots identified is 1,178 which represent 39 years of land supply based on the current uptake of 33.5 allotment per year. The strategy has identified further potential resi-

dential land which is marked as proposed zoning (future growth). The strategy also discusses the interaction of residential land with industrial land and the need for additional open space.

The draft strategy is now on formal public exhibition seeking feedback.

The final stage of the project involves refinements to the strategy in response to written submissions and then a further report to Council to adopt the final document.

It was great to see so many utilise the lovely garden area at the museum for this occasion and to see so many support Seniors week.

The museum has a new sign which you may notice as you head northward through Jindera. It is surprising the number of people who stop and say they can't find the museum or who stop thinking it is still the general store. The Tourist Information sign seems to help draw them in so that they can at least ask the question.

We have been fortunate in the last weeks to have the return of several small groups to the museum for visitation and often Devonshire Tea. This seems to be a sign that people are becoming more willing to get back to moving about the state.

The Tea Rooms has been very busy over the last month and opening for the three days of Easter was very successful, providing another option for visitors to Jindera to stay a little longer. We all need to recognise the value of tourism to the town and district and find ways to get people to visit or stay longer when they come.

One of our concerns for the future is how we increase the numbers of people who want to visit the museum. We can continue to develop this wonderful place but we need to have the benefit of people coming to visit, to make it worthwhile. We have to continue to find ways to increase our visitation, to find other ways to make the complex appealing and we have to find ways to target the audience who want to come.

It is astounding the number of people in Jindera, in Albury and the surrounding area that have never been to visit the museum, and it is without doubt, one of the best around.


Over the coming year we hope to raise funds for a new complex that will be built in front of the present Cottage Crafts and will provide some muchneeded space for several new developments at the museum.



COUNCIL NEWS April 2021

Highlights from meeting held in April at Holbrook.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, Council currently permits 10 people to attend the public gallery. Meetings are recorded and available for viewing on Council's website https://bit.ly/35uKFxX

Council will continue to hold the monthly meetings at Holbrook Library Complex.

Business dealt with at the meeting included:

Council resolved to advise the developer of the proposed Glenellen Solar Farm that it accepts the Voluntary Planning Agreement offer, subject to public exhibition and consent to the development being granted by the Independent Planning Commission.

Council agreed to further amend the plan to allocate funds raised via the development consent levy which is applied to all development consents and place the new plan on public exhibition for comment.

Council granted approval for a two lot subdivision in Urana Street, Jindera.

Council formalised a policy which reflects a long standing practice of making plant and equipment available for community projects/events out of hours at no cost providing the community organisation negotiates with a regular Council operator to volunteer their time and is subject to sign off by senior management.

Council will call for expressions of interest for communities to host the 2022 Australia Day event.

Council resolved to place the 4 year Delivery Program and annual Operational Plan and Budget on public exhibition, commencing 26 April 2021. The 'business plan' guides the operation of the council and the expenditure of ratepayers and grant funding for the forthcoming year. A total expenditure budget of \$45,212,498 is projected with a General Fund surplus of \$10,218. Whilst some sectors have been impacted by COVID, because of falling revenue streams and increases in expenditure outside its control, the Council will increase rates by 2%. Council will continue to provide relief and support to ratepayers suffering hardship, due to bushfire or COVID impacts.

Council committed to transitioning the Culcairn Early Childhood Centre to Greater Hume Children Services effective 1 July 2021. Parents can be assured that ongoing services will be available and Council and CECC are working hard to ensure a smooth transition. Child care services at Culcairn include long day care, after school program and a preschool program. Hours will remain the same and Council will work with parents to ensure transfer of all current enrolments to meet the needs of families.

In relation to the report to reconsider closing a council road, Council resolved to defer the matter until the May meeting and to undertake a councillor inspection of the road, the subject of the road closure application.

Council will contribute \$25,000 towards a formal study of a proposed Jindera – Lavington Shared Path project.

An unnamed road at Lankeys Creek has been named King Parrot Lane, subject to no objections being received during public consultation.

Council has appointed Hutchinson Civil Pty Ltd to create the Walla Walla Swamp Shared Path at a cost of \$336,990 (excl. GST).

Council endorsed a modified organisational structure for the Engineering Department.

Hours will remain the same and Council will work with parents to ensure transfer of all current enrolments to meet the needs of families.


In recent times when childcare services within Greater Hume have no longer been able to operate under the traditional community led model, Council has responded

Community Choices Program

2021 Information Sheet



Essential Energy's Community Choices program is open again, allowing people across rural, regional and remote NSW and parts of Southern Queensland to vote for grassroots causes that can do with some extra support.

A total of \$175,000 will be shared by eligible groups across 20 zones in our network area, with funding of up to \$2,500 per successful group.

Eligible charities, registered not-for-profit groups and community groups can nominate themselves, or be nominated, from 12 April 2021. Full details are at essentialenergy.com.au/choices

How much money each nominated organisation receives is determined by how many community votes they receive via the online voting platform. The entire process can be completed online - from nominating to the community voting, which makes it an easily shareable and COVID-safe way to raise funds.

This year, Essential Energy has introduced an additional Small Communities category. Local groups within our footprint who are in towns with populations of less than 20,000 people can nominate for this additional category, boosting their opportunities for funding if they are relying on a smaller voting base than groups located in large communities.

Last year, more than 120 organisations shared in the total funding, which was used for everything from local Dragon Boat Clubs to Equestrian groups supporting kids and community outreach programs like Meals on Wheels and Legacy.

Louise and the team have been busy delivering food to many locals experiencing hardship as a result of COVID-19. Since April, they've supported more than 1,000 families, seniors and stranded international students and most say that the pantry's deliveries are the difference between eating and going hungry. This shows the value of these community organisations like the Byron Community Pantry, and we were pleased to be able to lend a helping hand through our Community Choices program.


