Garden Art, Dance Costumes, Camper Trailer and would you believe LOVE ... our local match making service


Country Dating was also open on the day.

Overall, an amazing day to showcase the Jindera township and a great day out!



This last month the museum has seen an increase in visitors, particularly as a result of the school holidays, Easter and lovely Autumn weather. There have been more caravans on the road and our free camping spot at the recreation reserve has seen caravans stop over nearly every day.

The Easter weekend, the museum again opened the Tea Room from Saturday through to Monday with good patronage each day. Many visitors came just for a snack or light lunch as they were passing through town enroute to somewhere else.

What else can we offer in the town to encourage people to see Jindera as a destination, not just a town they pass through going to somewhere else? The town has been in the fortunate position of growing simply because of its proximity to Albury; the offerings in the town have increased to match the growth but there isn't a lot that visitors consider make the town a worth destination just to visit on a day trip.

The museum has the return of its **Campfire Night** on **Saturday 14th May**, with camp-oven cooking, spit



roast and bonfire along with the bush-band, The Swag and Billy. This is a fun night with good food and great toe-tapping music. The band brings a collection of musicians who love to play together and simply have a good time. Tickets are available via Trybooking.

The Museum again hosted Seniors Day for the Greater Hume Shire; the museum is a great location for events such as this, having plenty of outdoor space for activities and information as well as catering facilities and a great atmosphere. More folk should take the opportunity to get involved in this day which is run by the shire, free of charge to participants.

Our new All-Abilities toilet facility is well under way with the foundations, slab and framework completed. Brickwork has commenced and we will see the facility operational soon. We will need to complete additional paving around the facility and even-up the ground between the existing toilet facilities and the new structure. Additional paving within the site is also planned and a new watering system will be installed before next summer to keep the gardens and lawn in good condition over the hotter months.

There are always plenty of maintenance and up-grading jobs to be completed around the site. The men's group from the Tim Fischer Shed have almost finished installing the second windmill to the machinery area and they continue to work on refurbishing the wooden wheel cart and the Moline tractor.

The museum's **Winter Events** program will be out shortly and we are starting to look to holding our second Lost Trades Day next year. This was a major event for the museum in 2021 and we hope the next will be a major fund raiser for our new building construction.

It is with sincere sadness we farewelled one of the museum original members, Miss Norma Schulz, prior to Easter. Norma and her brothers, Armer and Roy, were involved in the museum during its conception and establishment back in the 1960's. Norma was a particularly good horsewoman and there are many photographs of her within the museum precinct involved in many of the early activities the museum hosted or organised.

Miss Norma lived at 'Granite Hill', the family property, just north of Jindera. She was involved in several other organisations in the community and although her deteriorating health had prevented her involvement in recent years, she was still a staunch supporter of the area. She will be sadly missed by many.



Business dealt with at the 20 April 2022 meeting included:

Council will engage Mainmark Australia to undertake rectification works of the main pool and baby pool at the Jindera Swimming Complex.

The Code of Meeting Practice and Payment of Expenses and Provision of Facilities to Mayor and Councillors Policy were adopted following recent public exhibition.

Council resolved to renew a five (5) year Loan Agreement with the Australian War Memorial for the Loan of Commander Holbrook's Medals.

Council endorsed the timeline to call Expressions of Interest and determine applications for funding totalling \$301,708 under the NSW State Government's Re-connecting Regional NSW – Community Events Program.

Council agreed to the proposal to dispose of the superceded town signage through an Expression of Interest process.

The draft Community Strategic Plan was approved for public exhibition and will accept submissions for the document until Friday 3 June 2022.

Council approved the application for a permanent additional special variation (ASV) under section 508(2) of the Local Government Act 1993, to include a rate peg increase of 2% for the 2022/2023 financial year in accordance with the previously advertised and adopted 2021/2022 – 2024/2025 four year budget and associated 10-year Long Term Financial Plan. This will result in additional income of \$121,154.

Council approved a financial contribution to the Avondale Place Community Care Project of \$10,000. Additionally Council will waive all Council levied fees estimated at \$34,419.

The Jindera Community Gardens Committee was appointed as a Management Committee of Council in accordance with Section 355 of the Local Government Act 1993. The Terms of Reference for the Committee were adopted by Council.

Council approved the employment of contractors to undertake the remainder of Council's Gravel Resheeting Program and approved the Natural Disaster Works Program.

Council has appointed Hutchinson Civil P/L for the Funks Pit Rehabilitation works to the value of \$417,530.00 (excl. GST).

Council authorised the General Manager to sign the Funding Agreement for Financial Assistance under the 2020/21 National Flood Mitigation Infrastructure Program for Flood Mitigation Works to be constructed at Holbrook.



The winner of the wood raffle was Mark Lynch.






