Rural Fire Service NSW Southern Border Team Group 4 Brigades held their 2021 Operational Readiness/ Preparedness day at the Jindera Recreation reserve on the 10<sup>th</sup> of October. If you were around the Recreation Reserve, you would have noticed that we held the event follow-



ing NSW RFS COVID 19 safety protocols.



Southern Border Team District Manager Inspector Sandra Huer said it is great to see the Brigades attend the event to update and practice the vital skills we need to protect our communities in the Region and beyond.



The annual event brings our Group 4 Brigades together to hone their operational skills to ensure they are ready for the 2021/2022 fire season. The day had brigades work across 9 events ranging from using self-priming pumps, drafting from an open water source, using foam, a refresh of our skills at motor vehicle fires.

Crews also, updated their First Aid skills, and worked

with Reynir Potter, Fire Control Operations Officer to ensure we are providing accurate information from the incidents we are responding to during the year.

The day also included pointers on maintaining our trucks, how we can use equipment that was donated to the District during the 2019/2020 fires and ways we can position our trucks in tight spots when crews on the ground are needed to help their driver using hand signals.

You may have seen the trucks driving around Jindera looking for hydrant points to make it a bit more challenging for them, crews were only given map coordinates and had to use these to find the hydrant point.

Group Captain Brian Millar said, the day included some fun activities, sadly this year our Jindera Captain lost his long-time record of filling a bucket in 2 minutes using a knapsack.

This year the Bungowannah crew did it in well under the Captain Yensch 2-minute record. He also thanked all brigades and the Southern Border Team staff for attending, we all found things we needed practice with our brigades and as always, we learn new ways of protecting our communities for the coming fire season.

"Fire Permits return to the NSW Southern Border from 1st November" 27th October 2021

Fire Permits will be required from the 1st November as the NSW Southern Border eases into the Bushfire Danger Period.

Operational Officer Reynir Potter said: "Even though our community has had significant rainfall this Spring, landowners should not be complacent as recent rainfall has increased fuel loads especially in grassland environments. The NSW Rural Fire Service requires landowners to apply for fire permits for the remainder of the bush fire danger period (ending 31 March 2022)"

Permits outline conditions for landowners to safely conduct grass and stubble burning only and ways for landowners to prevent acidental fire escape which impact neighbouring properties. Inspector Sandra Huer, Manager of the RFS Southern Border Team, states that fire permits will only be approved during low risk weather periods. During high fire danger periods, permits are unlikely to be approved.

"To prevent our volunteers from responding to controlled burns, it is also a requirement for permit holders to notify the Rural Fire Service and their neighbours 24 hours prior to lighting their fire. Many landowners find it quick and easy to do this on the RFS website" reiterated Mr Potter.

Senior volunteers are anxious about the risk of escaped fires this season, Tocumwal based Group Officer Mark MacCullagh said: "It's pretty simple, if you don't think you can keep the fire controlled and within your property boundaries, don't light the fire"

Permit application process: All permit applications are to be made through:

Burn notifications (must be 24 hours in advance) to be submitted by the permit holder at: https://www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/fire-information/BFDP/burn-notifications (or point your smart phone camera https://www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/fire-inform at the following QR Code):



Fines apply to landowners lighting fires who do not have a permit and/or do not notify the Rural Fire Service 24hrs prior

In addition landowner's neighbours also have to be informed 24hrs prior

#### Council's Children Centres and Family Day Care are OPEN

Greater Hume Children Services has continued to provide much needed child care services through its centre based services at Holbrook, Henty, Culcairn and Walla Walla in addition to the more than 60 Family Day Care educators based across the region from Batlow to Benalla.

It's been a challenging year with the impact of COVID-19 affecting all services with the many changes, cross border issues and requirements required in order to remain open, maintain services, in addition to managing health and safety risks to remain compliant.

The Culcaim Early Learning Centre successfully transitioned to Greater Hume Children Services in July and continues to provide a full range of child care.

A new van was purchased to provide additional mobile playgroup and other services across all of our delivery areas.

With skills shortages in the early childhood education sector, staff recruitment was a key action; pleasingly, Council has appointed new Centre Directors to all centre based services.



Greater Hume Children Services Manager, Fiona Pattinson said "Our focus continues to be on the children and families and being able to provide services. Our service staff and educators have been amazing and continue to step up and meet all of the challenges that have been thrown at us and I would like to acknowledge and thank all of them for the valuable work they do on a daily basis."

Demand for services remains strong with Family Day Care having a waiting list for the first time in a long time and the Holbrook centre operating close to capacity.

We still have vacancies available for families who need the service for work and who want to maintain routines and consistency for their children.

Additionally, there are work opportunities for new educators to work with the service particularly in the Family Day Care sector.

Blackadder and Associates will be appointed to undertake the recruitment for the position of General Manager.

Council resolved to undertake works for fire breaks at the Government Dam in Henty and at the Culcairn Common. A further report will be submitted to the November Council meeting to define the quantum of works required this year with the view of developing a more strategic approach to fire hazard risks in the communities.

The presentation of the 2020/2021 Financial Statements was deferred to the November meeting as the Auditor was unable to attend.

Council resolved that in the event of one or more Wards being uncontested at the 2021 Local Government Elections that the Constitutional Referendum on whether Council should continue to be divided into Wards will be withdrawn.

Council have committed to the Henty Sportsground Function Room extensions and refurbishment and earmarked \$300,000 from Round 3 of the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Fund to the project.

Council endorsed the Burrumbuttock Recreation Reserve Proposed Multi-Purpose Community Centre project and nominally allocated \$300,000 from Round 3 of the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program to the project.

Council accepted the quotation of \$96,700 (exc. GST) from SJE Consulting to undertake an overall development plan, detailed design of lots and constructions supervision of 20 lots for Stage 3 of the Jindera Industrial Estate.

Council resolved to renew the Licence Agreement for the co-location of State Emergency Services and Fire Rescue NSW communications infrastructure on the Rural Fire Services Goombargana Hill Communication Tower site.
