
## ACTIVE AND RESPONSIBLE CITIZENS

## A letter of thanks from the President:

As president of the Jindera Rural Fire Brigade I would like to thank every individual and every organisation who has so generously donated to us this fire season:

**Dominoes Pizza** made a large donation of \$5,000 which we are putting towards a thermal imaging camera. This camera will greatly improve our fire fighting capability by indicating the location of "hot spots" to enable us to reach the seat of a blaze quickly...Thank you Dominoes!

The employees of **Overall Forge Pty Ltd** (Ettamogah) held a morning tea and raised \$480 - with which we purchased tungsten carbide chainsaw chains, primarily used for felling problem trees on fire-grounds

The **Jindera Swimming Pool Canteen** donated \$152.50. We used this money to purchase wedging equipment, also used for felling problem trees on the fireground... Pool Canteen, great job!

Two Vietnamese Buddhist organisations have kindly donated to our cause:

- **Quang Doc Monastery** - Donated funds for a Samsung Tablet with software to enable real time "in vehicle" mapping. The monastery also donated funds for an Astrien "in vehicle" global positioning unit
- **Quang Minh Temple** - Donated funds for a Husqvarna 575 XP chainsaw (which has already seen much use)

Early in the fire season the **Jindera IGA** combined with the **Jindera Public School** to provide us with huge supply of bottled water (almost 1,500 bottles)

Due to a hiccup in our normal supply chain, we were very short of supplies so this water was a god-send. Fire fighting is thirsty work and crews consume many bottles during the course of a fire. We divided the bottles up between our neighbouring brigades, as they were also seriously in need of the wet stuff. Thanks heaps IGA and Jindera Public!

The brigade has also received many donations - some of them very substantial - from private citizens in our community (most of them wishing to remain anonymous). To all of you thank you so very much

February started disastrously with one of the clubs favoured fishing areas being devastated by a black water event, with total devastation of fish in an area between Jingelic and the Hume Weir as well as other areas in the upper Murray region.

Jindera Anglers provided 2 boats and crews (Ricko, Gary, Brown, and Trev and crew collected 3 meat tubs of big dead, stinking Murray cod, trout cod, yellowbelly and a cray, also 100's of carp were dead. Between Lavington and Jindera we had a trailer load of dead fish in a 12 mile stretch of river. A curious thing was there were no small fish found, whether the pelicans had a feast, or they outran the danger??? There was only a small time when the water had a seriously bad oxygen level and we are hopeful that once the fire areas settle down with new growth a restocking plan will rejuvenate this rejoins water ways. The event was caused by huge rains in the house creek catchment that joins the Murray river at Jingelic, the flood released the ash and debris from the fires in the region causing the low oxygen water problem.

The water was oily black and the stench was unbelievable.

There has been a lot going on with Jindera Anglers hosting the South West Anglers Club Annual Meeting on the 2<sup>nd</sup> February then a week later 10 members contesting the SWAA Buckingbong competition near Narrandera.

We caught over 100 Murray cod plus a many trout cod however most were undersize and at the pointy end of the day the rascally rabbits from Corowa won the day. Jindera reps Graham Lyons, Ricko, Fred, Ben and Matt Gesswein, Tom Mackie as well as the Bradbury tribe all caught lots of fish a great effort considering the falling river and the damp weekend.

Unfortunately, that same weekend our Anglers Club lost one of our favorite members in Stuart Montgomery (wombat), Wombat passed away quietly after battling ill health for some time.
