### \$11.5 million in donations have helped Aussie farmers

the NSW Red Cross office recently reported.

All funds raised for our Help Aussie Farmers Appeal have now been distributed to farmers and their families in drought-affected parts of Australia.

A total of 7,452 grants of up to \$3,000 were distributed and they have helped farming families relieve financial stress caused by the drought.

Families used these grants to pay for essentials such as household bills and rates, to cover school fees and vehicle costs and to pay for groceries.

Grants were provided through our distribution partners: the Country Women's Association (NSW, Qld and SA), Rural Business Support (SA) and Rural Financial Counselling Service (Vic).

In the last 12 months we responded to 48 emergencies, from drought to bushfires and house fires, floods, cyclones and acts of violence.

## New Wellness Program Supporting People Recovering From Cancer

With the support of Dr Bailey Lang, (Osteopath and Exercise Physiologist, from Sports & Spinal, Albury), Sophie Rohde, (Exercise Physiologist, from Kinetic Medicine), and Colleen Wilson-Lord OAM, Rural Care Link Inc will have exercise classes for cancer survivors twice a week at the Hub in Jindera.

These classes will be especially designed to assist with recovery and support wellbeing during and after treatment. The exercises will allow the body to start to repair and re-build the immune system. The exercise programs will be designed for each individual person attending the class based on muscle strength, mobility, and flexibility.

Depending on the type of cancer you have or had, the team can create an individualised program to assist your body into recovery. Everyone must have an assessment before commencing, so bookings need to be made to see one of the Exercise Physiologists.

There are only 12 places, so don't delay.

**Recreation Path**—The recreation path is gaining momentum thanks especially to Cheryl Ingrey and her fellow bike riders. 





The Year 3/4 students have been gathering data about the foods in our lunchboxes. They used the data to investigate healthy options and sustainable food production.

A fabulous spread was again provided by the catering ladies and friends of the museum. Thankyou to all who assisted in anyway to make the day such a great success.

The museum members are looking to add a working steam engine shed to the display area and design work and placement ideas are underway. Some changes will need to be made around the machinery area to accommodate the new structure and a whole of site plan for the area will need to be developed. This was a recommendation of the strategic planning process that was undertaken in August and it is hoped we will be able to get this underway in the near future. Fundraising is underway and donations for this project are always welcome.

A new brochure for the museum will be available by the start of November and we will place this at various locations within the township to encourage our local residents to visit. Coming up to the Christmas and holiday season many locals will have visiting family and friends and the museum is an ideal local highlight to show to visitors. This can be incorporated with the Jindera Heritage Walk

which provides information on many of the local businesses and locations within the township over 100 years ago. The heritage of the town is something as residents we can all be very proud of.

On Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> November the museum will host the Murray Valley Sanctuary Refugee Group major fund raiser for the year. This group help to provide airfares for those who are seeking to relocate to this area. The museum will again host their Twilight Tours in late November. 

### COUNCIL NEWS OCTOBER 2019



Highlights from meeting held on 23 October at Culcairn.

In response to a Notice of Motion submitted by Cr Lea Parker, Council resolved to form a committee to look at the formation of a promotional group for the benefit of the Greater Hume Council area.

Council received a presentation from Brad Brohun of Crowe regarding the audit of the 2018/2019 Financial Statements.

Council authorised the General Manager to provide owners consent to make the development application for the Culcairn Solar Farm which involves laying of a cable in Cummings Road and unmade Council dedicated roads.

Council will place on public exhibition the draft Local Strategic Planning Statement which is a document that sets the framework for Greater Hume Council's economic, social and environmental land use needs over the next 20 years. The Greater Hume LSPS is a succinct and easy to understand document that permits Greater Hume community members to contribute and understand the future direction of land use in their area. It identifies nine planning priorities and explains how each of these are to be delivered, monitored and reported upon.

Amendments to the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 introduced a requirement that Council prepare a Community Participation Plan (CPP) which will explain how a planning authority such as Greater Hume Council will engage with the community across their planning functions. Council resolved to exhibit the Plan for a minimum period of 28 days.

Interested community members can view the above mentioned planning documents on Council's website or view copies at Council offices.

Subject to the concurrence of Department of Planning, Infrastructure and Environment, Council will approve a dwelling entitlement on land on Walla Walla Jindera Road, Walla Walla subject to 28 conditions of approval. Council's resolution follows an earlier Notice of Motion by Cr Knight and subsequent Council report and resolution in relation to the legitimacy of the request to remove restrictions imposed by the former Hume Shire under 88B of the Conveyancing Act 1919 which prevented the erection of a dwelling on the subject land.

Council agreed to refund \$793 to the Holbrook Early Learning Centre for DA and construction certificate fees for the covered walkway and pergola.

Council resolved to not accede to the request to make a financial contribution towards the traffic management costs for the 2020 Holbrook Triathlon, on the basis that it would create a precedent for other events held across the shire.

Council resolved to continue the current drought relief package to residents until 30 June 2020. Those residents whose residence are not able to be connected to reticulated water supply will be eligible to access Council operated standpipes at Jindera, Burrumbuttock, Brocklesby, Gerogery and Culcairn. Eligible residents can obtain an electronic key with potable water supplied to them at the reduced rate of \$1.70/kl. Also contractors delivering potable water to residents of Council will be charged \$1.70/kl for water delivered for domestic use. Information is available on Council's website or contact Council.

Council will call for expressions of interest to lease a 20ha parcel of Council for the purpose of grazing in Baird Street, Culcairn for a minimum period of 24 months commencing 1 February 2020. This will advertised in the near future.

Council received a report on the progress of the Henty Rail Crossing Project, a \$7.2M project funded by Australian and NSW governments and Council. Due to the size of the project, GHD Pty Ltd has been appointed to manage the project on behalf of Council. At this stage, Council is aiming to complete the project by December 2020, subject to the timing for the approval and construction of the rail components of the project. Other preliminary works also to start in November involving fencing and tree removal. Olympic Highway re-alignment road works will commence in January. Council also resolved to accept a proposal from Riverina Water for the construction of 1.1km of 300 mm water main to commence during November.

Council accepted a tender in the amount of \$167,685 (excl GST) from Hurst Earthmoving to undertake kerb and drainage works in Hume Street, Holbrook.

Council accepted a tender in the amount of \$165,900 (excl GST) from AP Delaney & Co to undertake kerb, drainage and associated roadworks in Market Street, Walla Walla.

Council has appointed NSW Electoral Commission to conduct the next local government election timed for Saturday 12 September 2020.

The next Council meeting will be held on 20 November at Henty.

#### **Greater Hume Shire** Solar Plant Awareness Group Residents

There are prime agricultural land areas in Greater Hume Shire that are being targeted for four proposed large-scale solar plants, on farmland that generate a high gross value of agricultural productivity in our shire. The solar plants are planned with two on the outskirts of Jindera (Glenellen), one at Walla Walla and Culcairn, they have a minimum size collectively of 2739ha or 6768 acres, and all dwarf the townships nearby.

We are not against solar renewable energy, and we recognise the importance of renewables for our future generations, we need better planning to avoid conflict of land usage and investing in infrastructure that uses areas not as productive and offering those landowners an opportunity to earn an income on their lands.

The Jindera Solar Plant (519ha) Environment Impact Statement has now come on Public Exhibition from 16 October until the 13 November giving residents the opportunity to have their say with a submission by either online or by post. On the 7 November there will also be an opportunity to attend the Jindera Hub with the NSW Department of Planning and Environment so please attend for further information concerning this proposal.


