

So, as you can see, the Committee hasn't been idle, and the members are all working very hard to give the community the best service they can.



Suspecting that they were Magpie Geese I took this photo, consulted my Bird Book, and 2 Friends of Jindera Wetlands with more knowledge about birds than I have and they confirmed my suspicion.



A cooler and wetter start to the season than last year. Our farmers are generally looking happier and much fuller dams on properties mean that local brigades are generally better prepared this year for those fires which will inevitably eventuate.

We can only hope that the 2020/21 season continues in this vein but there is no guarantee and so it's important for us all to prepare for the possibility of worse times later in the season.

Tree Fire at Pony Club

The Brigade recently attended a tree fire opposite the Pony Club which provided a timely reminder of the need to be prepared and act quickly to minimise risks. The Captain has pointed out that the tree had started to burn down into the roots and once that happens it can smoulder for weeks underground, unnoticed until a hot summers day.

Clean up around your premises

So, while your brigade is preparing for the season with equipment checks and training, we need all landholders to clean up brush and leaf litter as well as combustible materials close to their houses. So please attend to this if you haven't done so already.

Bookings for both workshops can be made via Trybooking.





We are now counting down until the opening of the pool on the 14th of November! **blankets**. It is hoped that these assets will work together to maintain a comfortable water temperature

The Pool Committee have already been busy working with Council on tweaking the opening hours to increase opening hours on weekends.

We will now be opening at 1pm consistently on Saturdays AND Sundays throughout the season.

In addition to our late closings on Fridays and Saturdays of 8pm, you now have more opportunities to plan a gathering for lunch or dinner down at the pool.

Bec and Lee-Ann will be running the kiosk again this year – either purchase something from the range of food on offer, or BYO and use our free barbeque facilities.

The Committee is also delighted to have our \$100,000 NSW Government Stronger Communities Grant fully spent. In addition to the new solar heating installed last summer, we now have solar

blankets. It is hoped that these assets will work together to maintain a comfortable water temperature throughout the season. Our shade sails and umbrellas provide sun-safe places for people to relax.

In addition to the access steps, **a hoist** has now been installed. A wheelchair is also available to use on the ramp or hoist – just ask the lifeguard. If you know anyone who has difficulty with pool access, please invite them to use our facility. Prior notice would be appreciated so that we can organise for a second person to assist with transfers if required.

January *Learn to Swim* classes are already heavily booked, and Kim Dibben will be running swimming lessons again on Saturdays.

Council have a **Covid Safe Plan** in place to ensure we all feel confident attending the pool in these uncertain times.

COUNCIL NEWS OCTOBER 2020

Highlights from meeting held in Holbrook - October 2020

COVID-19 restrictions have changed the way Council can to renew unused road leases. run its monthly meeting.

Members of the public were not able to attend the meeting in person but the meeting was recorded and available for viewing on Council's website https://bit.ly/35uKFxX

Council will continue to hold the monthly meetings at Holbrook Library Complex while COVID restrictions are enforced. Residents can bring forward issues to the council by providing a written statement, which is distributed to councillors and read out prior to the commencement of the meeting. Statements should be provided by 5pm on the day preceding the meeting.

Business dealt with at the meeting included:

Council received a presentation from Council's external auditor regarding the financial statements to 30 June 2020. Council was the 11th General Purpose Council to submit the financial statements to the Office of Local Government.

Council approved a change of use for a property on Yankee Crossing Rd, Henty from a bulk grain storage to metal fabrication business, subject to conditions.

Council resolved to apply for funding via the Bushfire Community Recovery and Resilience grant which will include a small community grants program, commercial catering equipment for the proposed Holbrook Sporting Complex Amenities Building, lining the ceiling of Lankeys Creek Hall, four satellite phones and provision towards PA system at the Jingellic Pavilion and flood lighting at the Jingellic Hub.

Council also received several reports regarding the closure of unused roads across the shire and took steps

Council resolved to accept a submission from Essential Energy to upgrade 863 streetlights across the shire to LED lighting, which will provide brighter lighting in streets and a significant energy saving going forward.

Received as a matter of urgency, Council agreed to forward correspondence to management of The Daily Advertiser asking that newspaper organisation to consider making that publication available at the same time of day as that of The Border Mail.

Council received an update report of Council's response to the Coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic and its impact on operations.

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


