BUSH FIRE DANGER PERIOD AND FIRE PERMITS

If you are planning to light a fire in the open during this time, you will need a Fire Permit.

A Fire Permit is required for burning activities during the Bush Fire Danger Period.

Fire Permits help ensure fire is used safely and minimise the danger to you, your property and the community.

So, it's time to prepare again.

Clean up around your premises

It's important to make sure that there is little tinder (not that Tinder) around to promote a fire.

Time to clean up brush and leaf litter as well as combustible materials close to your house

- if you haven't done so already.

And remember, in the event you do need us, we're going to need ready access so please make sure that you have clear access for fire trucks where driveways may be overgrown from a wet Spring.

Rural Care Link OP SHOP News

Spring is here and the Jindera Op Shop volunteers have been very busy changing the stock at the shop from winter to summer. It is refreshing to see the bright coloured clothing now when you walk into the shop as it really brightens up the day and makes it feel like summer is on the way.

During the past few winter months the shop has offered lots of SPECIALS and CLEARANCE sales and will continue to do so during the summer season as more stock arrives.

The volunteers have done a wonderful job during this COVID-19 period with cleaning of the shop being a priority along with enforcing hand sanitisation and social distancing. During this time it has been very hard to turn back parents with children but we are pleased to announce that as from October 6th 2020, children will once again be welcomed back into the shop, providing the little ones stay close to the adult they have come with. Older children will be counted as adults and need to remember that only five people can be in the shop at one time.

Donations will now be accepted from the 6th October, and we ask that everyone please follow the guidelines which are:

- **Make sure that the clothes are clean and dry; and**
- **Put all goods into bag/s which must be then put into the large receptacle bin INSIDE the Op Shop.**

Donations can be left at the shop during opening hours, and remember, the bin will be **inside the shop**. This bin will be emptied twice a day and donations taken out to our sorting room where any clothes will be hung and aired for 48 hours before being displayed in the shop. All crockery and bric-a-brac will be sprayed and cleaned before going onto the shelves in the shop.

Donations cannot be left in the large bin in outside the shop or left at the Op Shop door. These donations will NOT BE ACCEPTED and will be disposed of to land fill straight away. If you are unable to get to the shop during opening hours to leave your donation, but live locally, please ring Rural Care to see if someone from the shop is available to collect.

As the Jindera Op Shop is supporting numerous organisations, such as Homeless People, and the African Refugees, all donations go to a good home. It is hoped that now that the State Border is open, RCL can continue to support the MS Op Shop at Wodonga, and any other shops that require our surplus goods.

The Jindera Op Shop facebook page has been a great success and our thanks to our volunteers, Judy and Michelle, who look after this side of our sales. We often have articles such as beds, mattresses, special crockery, jewellery, etc., that are easier to sell on facebook. Judy also puts goods on Buy, Swap, and Sell etc., so keep a look-out for a bargain from our shop.

Living with Covid

Preparation and training go on with the Brigade conducting a Chainsaw course and Operation Readiness under Covid contact guidelines. We're now restricted to 4 persons in a truck and frequent contact sanitising is practised.

Chain Saw

In a fire situation, it is important to minimise fuel by removing trees and brush ahead of the blaze. Sometimes this is a matter of raking away leaves or bringing in a bulldozer but in others it is necessary to cut down trees. This is a specialist job which is why specialist courses are undertaken by brigades. A high standard of training means a safe workplace.

The recent chainsaw course hosted by Jindera included volunteers from Lavington, Rand, Wantigong, Mountain Creek, Tabletop and Glenellen.

Looking after our equipment: truck maintenance

The off season is the time to make sure that all equipment is ready for summer. Our most expensive pieces of equipment are the fire trucks which have all been serviced.

Grants

Hand-Held Radios

Jindera Bush Fire Brigade owes thanks to the Member for Farrer: Susan Ley for a grant which has allowed us to purchase four extra hand-held radios which will allow us to have better communications and better safety on fire grounds this summer.

Concreting the Car Park

We also thank the Rural Fire Service for a \$10,000 grant which will go towards concreting the new carpark at the rear of the station. The rest will have to wait for a while because our reserves are going to be taken up with paying for the LED community and safety sign urgently needed for this fire season

The sign

If you have followed the saga, you will know that over the last two years we have regularly and unsuccessfully applied for a grant to allow us to enter the 21st century with a highly visible and remotely programmable LED signage tower mounted at Brigade headquarters.

Sadly, the community's safety has not been deemed a high enough priority by Council and NSW State Government.

In the circumstances, the Brigade has decided that we cannot risk another year without this important community asset and we will be clearing out our financial reserves to provide the sign in time for the season.

So good news and bad news.

POSITIVE MENTAL HEALTH IS A PLATFORM FOR GROWTH

At St John's, the well-being of our students is our number one priority. Has your business been impacted by the border closures - apply now for the Southern Border Small Business Support Grant

In NSW small businesses in 13 Local Government Areas along the NSW and Victorian border will be able to apply for \$5,000 and \$10,000 grants through Service NSW.

You can apply now but only until 18 October 2020.

Albury, Greater Hume and Murray River are just some of those areas able to apply. Non-employing businesses (sole traders) or businesses that employ less than 20 full-time equivalent staff can apply for a \$5,000 grant.

Deputy Premier and Minister for Regional NSW John Barilaro said the \$45 million grant program includes two tiers of targeted support.

“The first tier of \$5,000 is for employing and non-employing small businesses, such as non-employing sole traders, that have suffered at least a

30 per cent decline in turnover as a result of the border closure.

“The second tier of \$10,000 is for employing small businesses that have suffered at least a 75 per cent decline as a result of the closure.”

That is why the staff at Greater Hume Children Services took to the world of digital communication to help support the young children using the service to understand Covid 19. The hope was to break down the fear and present the information in a way that children could relate to. Hovell, (the name given to the bird on the Greater Hume Children Services logo) got together with some of his friends to tell a story about the virus. The story described Hovell's friends getting sick but more importantly it described how sad and worried Hovell was feeling about the virus – something the children might be able to relate to.



When did you last visit the Museum?



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COVID-19 restrictions have changed the way Council can run its monthly meeting. Councillors attended the September meeting held at Holbrook, observing social distance rules.

You can view the recording of the meeting at <https://bit.ly/35uKFxX>. Members of the public were not able to attend the meeting in person but the meeting was live streamed.

Cr Heather Wilton was elected to the position of Mayor for the next 12 months until the next local government elections in September 2021. Cr Doug Meyer OAM was elected as Deputy Mayor.

Council will continue to hold the monthly meetings at Holbrook Library Complex while COVID restrictions are enforced. Residents can bring forward issues to the council by providing a written statement, which is distributed to councillors and read out prior to the commencement of the meeting. Statements should be provided by 5pm on the day preceding the meeting.

Business dealt with at the meeting included:

Council resolved to seek quotations from real estate agents active in Culcairn, Henty and Holbrook to list four vacant land parcels, with funds generated from the sale of land to fund the shortfall to progress the upgrade of recreational sportsground playing fields in Culcairn, Henty, Holbrook and Jindera, with the overall project valued at \$1,585,333. Later in the meeting Council appointed two tenderers to undertake the rehabilitation of playing fields.

Council received a report on the review of ward boundaries. Council has redrawn its ward boundaries to ensure compliance with the Local Government Act 1993 to ensure that the variance in electors does not vary more than 10% between wards.

Council resolved to hold a constitutional referendum at the next local government elections for electors to consider whether the Greater Hume Council area should continue to be divided into wards, or that wards be abolished.

A report on the draft financial statements was presented. In response to auditor's advice, a revised snapshot was supplied at the meeting which has meant that a one off provision for remediation of landfills and quarries has resulted in a net operating result of -\$3,470,000. This extraordinary item will not materially impact on future budgets. Later in the meeting, Council received a detailed report on the requirement that it must make

provision for the rehabilitation of four landfills and four gravel pits in their financial statements. Council will be required to create a cash reserve for the future cost of rehabilitation in forward budgets.

Regrettably, Council will take over control of the running of three community facilities. Local communities have struggled in recent times to recruit volunteers to fill vacancies of these section 355 committees. Carabost and Walbundrie Halls and the Morven Tennis Club grounds will return to be operated and managed by Council.

Council received an update report of Council's response to the Coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic and its impact on operations.

Council accepted offers for the sale of two allotments in the Holbrook Industrial Estate.

Council also resolved to undertake a range of measures to rehabilitate the Funks Pit, near Jindera.

Council resolved to appoint Hutchinson Civil to undertake the Coppabella Road Reconstruction Stage 2 project at a value of \$4,769,891 (excl GST). Council received \$7M funding for its share of the project from the Restart NSW Fund. Works include realignment and reconstruction of 7.7km section of Coppabella Road. In July, Council appointed Nelmac Pty Ltd to construct a new bridge over Back Creek which also forms part of the project. To expedite the works, Coppabella Road will be closed to through traffic between Maginnity's Gap Road and Short Cut Road from early October through to March 2021. Residents in the area are being informed of the road closure.

- a break in again at the Jindera storage sheds at the Industrial Centre
- tools removed from a trailer
- attempted break in at the Jindera Pool
- a very loud party still going at 4.00 am at the Travelling Stock Reserve
- hoon behaviour in the Watson/Creek St area.

Who knows what other incidents have occurred.

Years ago Jindera had an official Neighbourhood Watch group meeting regularly under the guidance of a police officer.

An update was given monthly about crime statistics in the area and advice about security etc.

Whether or not there is an official gathering like this it is up to all residents to unofficially be good neighbourhood watch people.

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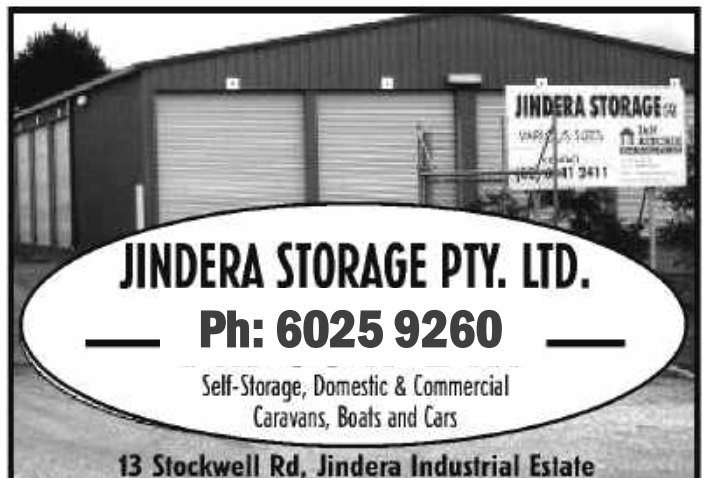
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Stitch and Chat Craft Group

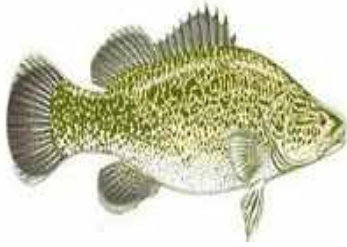
