HOSPITAL SERVICES

Leeton Health Service includes a 66 bed hospital with five emergency department beds, 19 acute beds, four maternity beds and 38 residential aged care beds. It provides a 24 hs Accident and Emergency Department connected with Specialists through the Critical Care Advisory Service. The community is also supported by general practices, physiotherapists, dentists and optometrist.

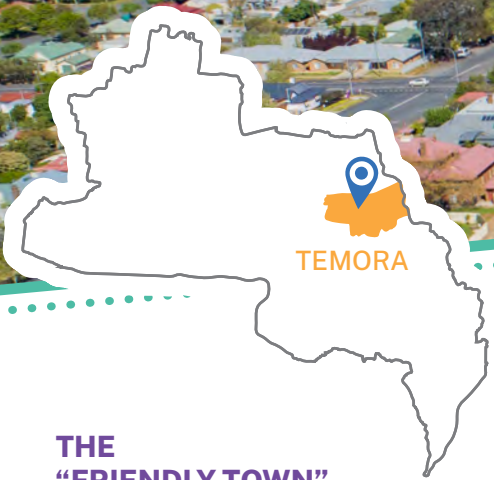

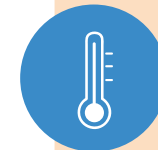

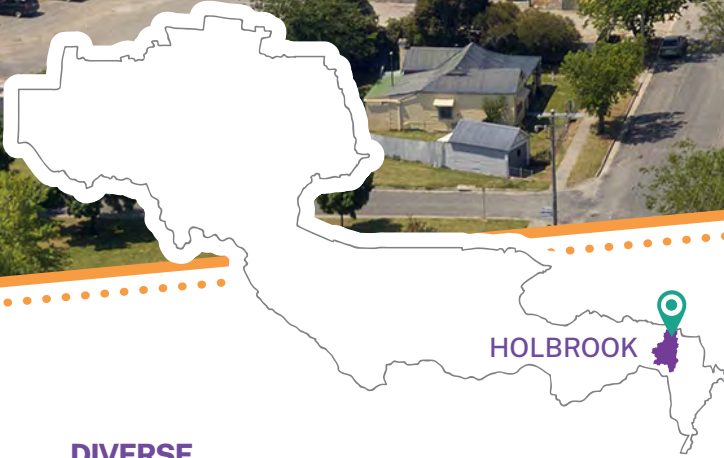

Holbrook is situated between Melbourne and Sydney on the Hume Highway. It is the centre of a richly diverse rural economy, producing beef, wool, lamb, cereal grains, pasture seed, tree seedlings, softwoods timber and grape growing.

DELIGHTFUL SMALL TOWN

Henty is in the north of Greater Hume. It is located midway between regional cities Albury/ Wodonga and Wagga Wagga. It is on the Olympic Highway and is serviced by the Sydney to Melbourne rail line.

The role of the town, as the service centre for the surrounding district, is highlighted at the Henty Machinery Field Days held in September every year, when they attract some 60,000 visitors over 3 days. Henty has a supermarket, electrical store, post office, bank, hotel, child care, and two primary schools. There's a public pool, skate park, bowels and community centre, plus a golf course.

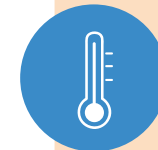
