

## 2024 LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS

On Saturday, 14 September 2024, Greater Hume Council will conduct councillor elections to elect 9 councillors to serve for a four year term.

A constitutional referendum will also be held for electors to consider whether the Council area should continue to be divided into wards.

On Saturday, 14 September 2024 all electors will be asked to vote on two topics;

1. Voting for the nominated candidates to serve as Councillors for the ward.
2. Voting on whether the ward system is abolished or whether it remains the same.

***Regardless of whether your ward is contested, all electors are required to still vote on the referendum.***

## CONSTITUTIONAL REFERENDUM

In December 2023 Council resolved that a constitutional referendum be held regarding wards in conjunction with the Local Government Election to be held on 14 September 2024.

Electors will be asked to answer “yes” or “no” to the following questions:

**Currently Greater Hume is divided into three wards that elect 9 Councillors in total. Do you favour**

1. **Abolishing this ward system in favour of a single area consisting of all voters that elects 9 councillors?**
2. **Making no change to this system; That is three wards and 9 councillors remain?”**

If the removal of wards is supported by a majority of formal votes cast at the 2024 election, the 2028 local government elections would be conducted as an undivided area (without wards).

The following information is provided to electors in order to assist them in making an informed decision on the question to be asked at the referendum.

### NO WARDS

- All the electors have the opportunity to choose all the members of their local council.

**To vote to abolish the Wards -**

**Vote YES to question 1 and NO to question 2**

### WARDS

- All the electors do not have the opportunity to choose all the members of their local Council.

**To vote to keep the Wards**

**Vote NO to question 1 and YES to question 2**
