Burrum walking track upgrade approved by Council

The Burrumbuttock Community Forum addressed Councillors at the public forum section of the Greater Hume Council meeting held at Holbrook on Wednesday

17th April regarding the need to upgrade the Burrum walking track along Urana Road. There was further discussion and Mayor Tony Quinn endorsed the project with a well-worded closing argument.

Councillors voted favourably to proceed with the work which will cost \$230,000.

This will mean that a sealed path will be constructed for access by all including prams, wheel-chairs and other mobility aids. There will be some vegetation clearance needed for the project but replacement plants will be planted.

We thank the Greater Hume Council for the improvement in public amenity that this project will make to our village. We are very grateful for their support in backing this project which has been top of our community project priority list for many years.






















Following Mothers Day, we held an afternoon tea with a pamper session for our Mothers. It was a relaxing afternoon for the Mothers as the children pampered them.



















AED – Automated External Defibrillator

How to use an AED

Person may look like they are having a seizure, gasping for air, or may appear unconscious or nonresponsive.



Once the AED is on, voice prompt will direct you to place the pads on the person.



The AED will guide you through the process once machine is turned on - it also talks you through all steps that are required to complete this successfully.

Farm Business Management Workshop

Farm Business Management is an essential part of any farm business. In 2023 the Basics were covered. Now it's time to dig a little deeper to distinguish between 'paper' and 'real' farm business performance.

Murray Local Land Services is hosting a two-day Farm Business Management workshop in Holbrook.

Also suitable for new participants, these two-day workshops will help participants develop a greater and clearer understanding of farm business performance analysis using a 'model' farm. Day two will revolve around participants utilising their own data to develop high level financial performance indicators. A key outcome will be enabling participants to move away from the 'tax' mindset to a 'management decisions' one when thinking about farm finances.

PRESENTER

Paul Blackshaw is a farm business consultant with Meridian Agriculture in North East Victoria. Paul provides farm financial analysis, benchmarking, business performance, and succession planning


