Morven Solar Farm – December Project update

The Morven Solar Farm is a proposed solar farm and battery energy storage system (BESS) located in the Greater Hume Shire Local Government Area, approximately 11 kilometres north of Gerogery.

Since our last community engagement sessions in June this year, the team has been continuing to prepare the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and incorporate the valuable feedback received into the draft Project design.

We heard that the community was concerned about fire risk and have been working to refine some of the impact assessments, including the hazard impact assessment, biodiversity impact assessment, and some of the Project design features to address this feedback.

We are looking forward to sharing the preliminary outcomes of the EIS studies and the refined Project design with the community early next year. Your feedback during this period will help us finalise the EIS ahead of its lodgement later in 2026.

We will ensure the community is kept informed on the progress of the studies and future engagement opportunities, and encourage you to continue to share your thoughts and questions with us by:

Met at Culcairn Bowling Club on 12th November 2025.

We had Margaret and Yvonne as our five minute speakers and they told us of having been volunteers with Frontier Services and finding out the realities of work experience with remote ministry. They told of long hours, much travel and meeting lots of isolated people who were very glad to have company.

Our main speaker was David Dunbar. He told of having visited the Five Stans; Kazakhstan, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan, Tajikistan and Kyrgyzstan.

To go to these places, part of the old Silk Road territory is not easy. An invitation is needed and people go as a group tour, not individuals.

The photographs included a city where buildings were covered in white marble, the roads wide and with white cars and wide footpaths and dome tops of buildings were turquoise colours.

Red indicates wealth and school uniforms are red to reflect the thought of future wealth from education.

There was a fortress and talk of the Silk Road and the digging of ruins and beautifully built and painted railway stations.

We learned about nomadic people living in yurts and the food which included lots of vegetables, eating horse meat, but not pig.

Local people felt that good food, a warm place to sleep and people around them was an ideal situation.

We thanked David for an amazing speech and yes please, like so many of our speakers, we would love to hear of more of his travels.

December is our Christmas meeting at Henty Club and pre booking is needed.

We meet January 14th 2026 at Henty 9.30 for a 10.00am start.

IN YOUR GARDEN DEC 25/JAN 26

Commiserations to my fellow gardeners who lost lots of their summer vegetables and flowers to the frost on November 12th. It wiped out tomatoes, cucumbers, pumpkins etc AND my dahlias, which were budding! At least the seedling sellers will make another dollar as we replant.

By now your garden should be well mulched and ready to face the summer. Watering had been necessary due to low Spring rainfall.

Strawberries are bearing well, with exceptional flavour. Lettuce can be planted now for a continuous harvest. Prune Wisteria now to allow for new buds in Winter.

December 22nd is the Summer solstice, time to harvest and hang garlic.

In January, plant out seedlings of broccoli and cauliflower.

Hydrangeas are blooming well now. They are often grown on the southern side to avoid the hot sun.

Pots of Petunias flower well over summer. Pots can be moved to where colour is needed.

Vincas are another pretty Summer annual. They also self seed well.

Prune Salvias in January and they will flower again in Autumn.

Mozzies like it damp and wet, so not too many about this January(hopefully!). Mozzie spray for around windows, doors and outside areas. Mix together well 3 cup Epsom Salts,1 can beer, and 1 bottle of cheap mouthwash.

If Rabbits ring bark young trees and shrubs, bind them up with banana skins.(the trees, that is!)

Mulch and water are important over summer and more mulch means less water used. Merry Christmas and Productive Gardening in 2026.

It occurred to me that it would be nice to be able to give you an idea of how your donations may be used. In July I contacted


Andrew Mackinlay, the manager of the AlbWod Cancer Centre Trust Fund who was able to verify that up to that

time CCforC had donated \$6190.40 from the collection's inception in July 2021- (now \$6490.40 since the Oct collection) stating that that amount would go a long way towards funding "a state-of-the-art chair for Genesis Care patients to receive radiation therapy.

This chair places people in the correct position so that they may have the radiation done in comfort. Without the chair it would mean each patient is in an uncomfortable position for a long period of time which can have other side effects." Andrew went on to say, "The chair itself costs around \$8,000, So to contribute over 75% of that is a fantastic effort".

Well I agree with that but let's see if we can get to the full 100% - keep those coins coming folks.






