WELCOME TO CULCAIRN





ABOUT THE BUSH

Who gives a hoot?



I've been seeing the odd dead Boobook Owl or Tawny Frogmouth on the side of the road or on the edge of bushland lately. I'm hoping it's just natural attrition or unfortunate encounters with vehicles at night, but I have

also been seeing Facebook posts about various owls found sitting on the ground in daylight – behaviour not typical of owls.

It seems that some are victims of secondary poisoning caused by eating mice that have ingested baits. Not all rodent baits get passed on through the food chain — some of the slower-acting ones like Ratsak Double Strength or Racumin



are First Generation poisons and do not affect animals that eat the poisoned rodent, but fast-acting Second Generation poisons such as Talon, Mortein and Fast Action RatSak should be avoided as these can pass through the food chain and kill birds of prey like owls, kestrels, kites and

hawks.



We have at least 6 different owls in our region – most of you will have heard a Southern Boobook (aka Mopoke) calling or the shriek of a Barn Owl on still nights, or perhaps heard the "woof woof"

call of a Barking Owl when camped beside a river. Owlet and White-throated Nightjars and Tawny Frogmouths, though not technically owls, are also nocturnal birds of prey in our region – all of whom provide mouse control services for free and add awesome diversity to our night-time soundscapes. Next time you buy mouse baits, spare a thought for our wonderful owls and raptors, and avoid baits with Brodifacoum, Bromadiolone or Difenacoum as the active ingredient. Thanks for giving a hoot! SUICIDE PREVENTION WORKSHOP

Break the Stigma - June 25th 2022 Would you know how to tell if someone you love was thinking of suicide?



In Australia we lose 9 lives to suicide each day. Studies show that between 80-85% of Australians will be touched by suicide at least once in their lifetime. Suicide is also the leading cause of death for individuals aged between 15 and 44 years of that shock "C. Jones Training" is a business dedicated to breaking down the stigma around mental health, suicide and asking for help. Based in Holbrook NSW, our plan is to educate the greater community around suicide to ensure we have the tools to assist those we love who may be struggling. Break the Stigma (Delivery of CALM Care) is a ½ day suicide awareness/prevention workshop that educates the community on how to respond to suicide risks in loved Participants learn:

- The facts and myths around suicide
- How to spot when a person may be thinking of suicide
- How to ask about suicide
- How to access services to assist the individual
- And so much more.

"Break the Stigma" workshop will be held on Saturday 25th June 25th 2022 at the Culcairn Bowling Club from 9am to 1.30/200pm.

Eleanor's father became a superintendent of police in 1956, and in 1964, a commissioner of Police. He was the first Commissioner to come through the ranks in the Northern Territory. VALE... JEAN VALMA BARKLEY BORN 26/8/47....DIED 15/4/22

Jean was brought into this world by her parents Arthur and Edna Schaeffer and was delivered at Grenfell Hospital NSW. Jean settled down in a little country town called Bimbi, where she went to school over in Quandialla with her two older siblings, Hilton and Betty. Later as she grew up her family moved to Griffith NSW, where the rest of her siblings were born- Sue, Robert and Ena. When Jean was old enough she went back- packing in India before coming back to Australia, working in New Zealand then moving to Western Australia to work on a farm. In 1973 she applied to enroll in the Australian Army, went through WRACC School and then onto Job Training at Randwick Transport where she qualified as a Transport Driver, completing nine years service before her discharge.

Bruce first met Jean during her Army career at Randwick and 26 years later they met by chance again. Bruce was living in Wodonga at the time and both their 25 year marriages had recently broken down. Jean wanted to come to Wodonga to visit her eldest sister Betty, who was in the Wodonga Hospital. Bruce told her he lived on the corner block of the Hospital. From there life went on and they married in Lake Macquarie at a little Scout Group Hall on the foreshore of Wangi Wangi on 20/11/2004 and on New Year's Day 2006 they moved to Culcairn.

On Good Friday 15/4/2022 they travelled up to Wangi Wangi Lake Macquarie to catch up with Jean's family, especially to see her son Austin. Luckily her eldest son Nathan was close by and Jean spoke to him for about ten minutes before she collapsed and died. Jean three boys are Nathan, Jarrod and Austin. Between Jean and Bruce they have 12 grandchildren.


