CULCAIRN HEALTH TALK

Culcairn Local Health Advisory Committee (LHAC) met in March to discuss important health issues for Culcairn Shire and wider community.

Priority areas for discussion were:

- 1. GP and Health Hub advocate for future Health Hub in Culcairn
- 2. Primary Care Services improve awareness of and access to primary care services in Culcairn, including dietician, podiatry and physio.
- 3. Mental Health support youth mental health initiatives
- Aged Care improve awareness of and access to aged care services

"Obviously one of our major projects will be to continue to advocate for better access to General Practitioner services in Culcairn," said Culcairn LHAC Chair David Gilmore. "This is something we've been working towards for some time, and last year we successfully secured a GP who can provide Visiting Medical Officer services to the Culcairn Multipurpose Service."

"Some of the key health priorities identified from the data we reviewed were Aged Care and Cancer Screening," said Mr Gilmore. "Our data shows that a 20% of our population doesn't have access to the internet at home, so we'd like to look at how people access information about services. funding and appointments and how we can help improve this access. We will also continue to focus on youth mental health, as we have identified this as an area of concern for our school aged students," said Mr Gilmore. "Our next meeting will focus on our strategies moving forward and mapping out how we can tackle these challenges. We will also be looking to partner with other community organisations so that we can have focus and concentrate our efforts," added Mr Gilmore. Mr. Anthony Lieschke was our main speaker in this the 100year anniversary of his family business D.E. Lieschke and Son.



IN YOUR GARDEN—APRIL 2023

After a few warm weeks in March, and a BIG RAIN at the end of the month, nights are much cooler and days shortening, so soil temps are dropping. Generally, April sees our first frosts and heaters on.

VEGIES—Summer vegies - cucumbers, zucchini, beans, and tomatoes are finishing up, so remove spent vines and tidy up beds. Some tiny or cherry tomatoes may continue in sheltered places till June. Watch out for slugs and snails and other pests on broad beans, cabbages, cauliflower etc. Dried, crushed eggshells around plants are a good deterrent. Beer in small containers (lids etc) attracts snails and slugs. It doesn't matter what strength the beer is, it's the yeast that attracts them and they happily drown! Pumpkins are slowly ripening, watch the stalk ends attached to the vine when this is dry and shrivelled, it's time to pick. This applies to rockmelons and watermelons too. It's apple and pear time now. Pears are good for eating fresh or cooked in various ways. This year I tried drying some pears, skin ON. Slice into 1/8ths, delicious for snacks with nuts. Apples dry well too. Asparagus can be planted now or in May. Be sure your ground is well drained and in sunshine. Asparagus is a perennial plant and lasts for many years.

FLOWERS-Not too late for some Spring flowering Bulbs to go in. Seeds of red flowering Flanders poppy sown now should flower in November for Remembrance Day. They are a symbol for soldiers from WW1 who died in Northern France. Check nurseries for Autumn colours of popular deciduous trees. Order now for planting in June. Hairy Panic is on the move again. I have had it around my house and garden 2 metres high (and more!!). One control method is to water, beat down and bag up (It can't come back when the wind changes!). Whipper snipping (cuts off its legs!) preventing further blowing about and it can be mown over. Fire is quick, but deadly (NOT recommended!) Roses are beautiful now so pick some and brighten someone's day.
