


1 YEAR, 1 KID, 1 JOURNEY

IN YOUR GARDEN

I have just returned from visiting family in Sweden. It was mid-summer and everything was green and beautiful. Lots of pine trees, oaks, elms, birches, and amazing pots of colour in the streets and public parks.

Many houses had window boxes and pots on balconies, decks, and verandas. The summer gardens were spectacular, but it was so nice to come home to bright blue skies, gum trees and blooming wattle.

Spring is officially here with bulbs of all colours everywhere.

Vegies

to love?

It's time now to plant carrots, parsnips, and other root crops, while the soil is still cool. Prepare the soil to a fine tilth, (no lumps or coarse gravel) Wait until after frosts for beans, tomatoes, corn to go into warmer soil. Winter vegies are maturing and need feeding, (broccoli, caulies etc.) Broad beans and peas will be ready to harvest soon.

Feed citrus trees now for delicious fruit.

September is a good time to take hardwood cuttings of Frangipani. Take a cutting up to 50cms in length. Leave in the open air for up to a week so ends can dry out and

prevent fungal infection. Put in a good potting mix and stake well as plants will be top heavy .Take care with Frangipani, as milky sap seeping from cutting is poisonous and can damage eyes and irritate skin .Gloves are a good idea.

Flowers

Clean out wood fires and put ash around ROSES, as well as some fertilizer as they prepare to bloom soon. Magnolias of many sizes and colours, white, pinks and maroon are blooming now.

I have Pansies in my Wheelbarrows and they are flowering well. Be aware of slugs and snails as they make a mess of the petals of these colourful flowers.

The Culcairn Show is at the end of this month (Sat. of the long weekend) Be sure to check your vegie patch and flower garden for something to enter .It's fun to be involved and adds to the display. You might even win a prize!

Entries need to be clean and tidy. Wipe leaves, even wash vegies-Spinach, Rhubarb, etc. and they will present well.

KITCHEN LEFTOVERS CHICKEN STOCK

Ever wanted to get more out of that Sunday chicken roast dinner. Now you can with this really simple kitchen scraps stock recipe.

Ingredients

1 Roast chicken carcass.
500g of saved onion ends (or 2 onions roughly chopped).
700g of saved carrot peelings

(or 2 carrots roughly chopped).

1/2 celery (roughly chopped, can be omitted if unavailable).

Handful of fresh herbs.

4 bay Leaves.

1 tsp peppercorns.

Directions

- 1. Place the chicken, onions, carrots, celery, herbs, and pepper into a large stock pot.
- 2. Fill pot with water until the ingredients in the pot have been covered by 2-4 inches.
- 7. Simmer on low heat for 4-6 hours while skimming the impurities off the top every 45 minutes or so.
- 8. Strain entirely and discard. Cool the stock completely and store it for 1 week in the fridge or up to 6 months in the freezer.






