Try to have about 6-8 cups (1 cup = 250ml) of fluid a day and remember, fluid is more than just water. You can count milk, juice, soup, custard, jelly, tea, coffee etc. Note: Alcohol is not counted. It does not help to hydrate the body. Sorry.

#### HENTY-CULCAIRN PROBUS

Met on 10<sup>th</sup> January. We were welcomed by our President Yvonne Booth OAM and then were advised of the death of our member Ron Gardiner.

Herb has made a clever chime to guide us in our minute of silence. Thank you Herb, no doubt Ron would have appreciated such thoughtfulness. Our theme for the day was with an Australia Day emphasis.

Tables were decorated with flags and native greenery. Thank you to Jan and her helpers, a most pleasant thought. We started with a clever dittie, spoken and sung too, called God save the Thong.

Then we had Mary with a poem "I am a Nation", followed by discussion about the Cherry Ripe Bar being 100 years old, and there were samples, which was another nice thought, thank you. Our five-minute speaker was Ian Lieschke.

Ian was born in Australia and attended the Merri Merric School, Henty and St. Paul's for secondary school. After school finished for Ian, he went to visit cousins in Perth and learned to drive a big tractor pulling 2 x 18 discs. Next Ian flew home and did fruit picking at Shepparton. He travelled to New Zealand and then Brisbane, Adelaide, and Kangaroo Island. Yvonne presented Ian with our Probus pen and congratulated him on his exactly timed, five-minute speech.

Next was a poem called Green and Gold Malaria, read by Julia Collie (poem is on computer read by author Rupert McCall, for those who would like to share). Morning tea was tiny lamingtons with jam and cream, and Vegemite biscuits, added to our usual lovely Arnott's biscuits.

Our main speaker was Aaron McCarthy who shared the speech with his wife Tahnee.

They told of Aaron's rehabilitation after having a farm machinery accident, where he had the lower portion of his leg removed. They told of overcoming adversity and turning it to advantage. We saw footage of Aaron learning to walk with his new prosthesis.

There were much thanks given to those who raised funds to assist—to family and friends, the farming community and emergency services.

Aaron had been an A grade tennis player and now plays from a wheelchair, as he does basketball and football. He has a particular interest in Para snowboarding using a special prosthesis for action sports.

Aaron's goal is to be sports person of the year for Lockhart Shire Council. He shows great resilience and determination, as does his wife Tahnee, his children, and the extended family. They support fund raising for Para Athletes. Aaron still has his farm and can do most jobs required.

Kevin Knoble presented Probus pens and a thank you from the club for Aaron and Tahnee for sharing their story of great success in rehabilitation after a most serious injury, we do wish them well.

In February on the second Wednesday, we are planning to meet at the Culcairn Club, 9.30am for a 10am start. We are hoping to have a police person to talk about scams. Do hope you will join us for an interesting day.

#### IN YOUR GARDEN - FEBRUARY 2024

Some hot, sticky days, with showers, have proved uncomfortable for people, but given ideal growing conditions for fruit and vegetables.

Figs are ripening - time for eating, drying, and jamming this delicious fruit.

Agapanthus - that beautiful blue or white summer flowering perennial, has unfortunately been classed as a weed. It loves our climate and has been known to escape into the bush, replacing native species. Aggies are great plants that require little care but be careful where you plant them in your garden. Available in many shades of blue, as well as white. Also available in miniature varieties. More blue flowers with Plumbago, another tough shrub.

Time to prune Geraniums now. Cut out the dead wood and straggly pieces and trim to shape and you will be rewarded with a healthy bush and lots of great flowers in Spring. Water in a high Potassium fertilizer for good results.

Don't forget the Buddleia or Butterfly Bush. Many shades of blue, purple, mauve, maroon, and white are available. Great for attracting pollinators.

February 14<sup>th</sup> is St. Valentine's Day. Probably the most romantic day of the year. Red roses are certainly popular. Some on long, slender stems present well (Grandpa's rose) as a single rose and others (Papa Meilland) make a nice bunch.

Summer vegie patches should be bearing well now, beans, zucchini, cucumbers, and tomatoes are doing well for me, especially my "feral "cherry tomatoes, which seem to come up, uninvited everywhere and resist fruit fly as well! Pumpkins are setting and growing fast. Watch out for powdery mildew with all the humidity. Spray leaves with a mix of 1-part full cream milk in 9 parts of water. Mulch has played a big part in weed control and water conservation, so is worth the effort. Sow seeds of brassicas now, or plant seedlings out in the garden, - protect from slugs and snails, by surrounding plants with crushed eggshells. These plants should grow well and mature early. Still time to plant beans, tomatoes, and lettuce.

Stay cool, mind the Mozzies, and enjoy your Garden. Margaret Pumpa


