IN YOUR GARDEN

Still warm and dry lovely Autumn weather. Some rain soon would be a welcome blessing.

Deciduous leaves make good mulch .To make collection easy, use a leaf vacuum. put into compost piles and add a handful of Blood and Bone. Water in well.

Colour up your garden with pots of annuals-snapdragons, lobelia pansies. Old wheelbarrows work well too as they are moveable.

Continue to plant Spring flowering bulbs. Stick the coloured plastic name tags in the ground, with the bulbs and then you will know what is planted where!

Camellias are coming into bloom now. Both Sasangua and larger Japonica varieties are popular and come in amazing sizes and colours.

As the weather cools off, bottlebrush(Callistemon) are attracting native birds to feed. More beautiful colours in the garden. Time also to sow Garlic .lt can be used raw or cooked and is a great flavour enhancer.

Mothers day: most mums love flowers in some form .While fresh bunches are beautiful, a pot of colour will last much longer, some exotic dried arrangements are available too.

Winter vegies should be growing well with the weather still being so warm . Keep watering and fertilizing, still time to plant spinach, broad beans ,kale, peas, lettuce and cabbage. Prepare ground for bare rooted roses .Still too early to prune roses yet.

LIGHT HORSE RIDE CAPTIVATES CULCAIRN CROWD

Culcairn was proud to welcome a stirring tribute to Australia's military history on Thursday, 13th March, as two riders from the Chauvel Australian Light Horse Commemorative Ride trotted into town, fully outfitted in authentic World War I uniforms.

Held beneath the leafy canopy of trees along Railway Parade, the event drew around 50 enthusiastic community members, who gathered to witness this living tribute to the bravery and spirit of the Australian Light Horse Brigade

In the shadow of the old station and silos, the riders delivered a compelling and informative speech on the history of the Light Horse—Australia's mounted infantry regiments that played a significant role in the Boer War and both World Wars. The talk covered their origins, missions, and the legacy they left not only on the battlefield but in the hearts of generations to come. "We want to bring this history back to life," one rider shared, "and we're inviting people from each community to tell us their family stories connected to the Light Horse."



Locals were encouraged to come forward with any stories, photos, or memorabilia relating to family members who served with the Light Horse. These contributions will help enrich the collection at the planned Light Horse Museum in Seymour, Victoria, and support the addition of names to the Wagga Cenotaph—an ongoing project to honour Riverina and South West Slopes Light Horsemen.

The Culcairn stop is part of a broader commemorative trail following the route of the original Chauvel Border Light Horse units, helping reconnect towns and people to this proud chapter of our shared history. The Culcairn Community Development Committee thanks all who attended and especially the riders for their powerful storytelling and dedication to keeping the Light Horse legacy alive.

UPGRADE FOR THE PLANTERS IN BALFOUR ST & RAILWAY PDE

Late last year, Sharon Wonson became aware that Hume Bank was offering grants for community improvement projects. Sharon, on behalf of the Culcairn Oasis, submitted a proposal for funding a community garden project. Her proposal was successful. After discussion within the Oasis team, it was decided that the grant money would best benefit the community if it was spent on revitalising the planters in Balfour St and Railway Pde.. Council were approached about this proposal and are happy with this beautification initiative.

Lots of advice has been taken to help in the planning for this project. The horticulturalists at Peards Wodonga were approached and freely provided advice. They made recommendations about which plants would be best for the very different growing conditions of full sun and deep shade. The plants which have been recommended and chosen have pretty flowers. When they're not in flower, the different types of foliage and leaf colours will give colour and interest. The planters will also be refreshed with a mixture of new garden soil and soil conditioner and also will be mulched.

When is this going to happen? Probably over a couple of weekends in late May.

Many thanks are owed to Sharon for taking the initiative and securing the grant and to Hume Bank for generously providing the community grant.

Probus – April Update The Next Step – Henty's Disability Personal Support Service

The Henty/Culcairn Probus group held its April meeting on April 9th at the Henty Community Centre. Longtime Henty resident Julie Colley gave the "5 Minute" presentation describing growing up in Newcastle where her father worked as an engineer for BHP and her mother was a nurse. Julie and her siblings had many outdoor experiences as children, and the family spent a lot of time at the beach in summer. Julie trained as a Music and English teacher at the Newcastle Conservatorium of Music and Newcastle Teachers College.

April's keynote speaker was Dylan Harrison (Hore), who, with his wife Rachael, founded *The Next Step* in March 2022 as a disability personal support service located in Henty. It is the only such service located between Albury and Wagga Wagga. The business began with one client but has expanded rapidly as families within the Greater Hume Shire who have a child with a disability, learnt of the services offered. Dylan's brother Daniel quickly joined the staff and now the organisation has 13 active support workers, of whom all but two live locally. *The Next Step* has 30-40 actively involved clients. Recently, through a working relationship with Henty Respite Trust, Avondale Place has become the hub for *The Next Step's* work.

As noted on its website *The Next Step's* "mission is to empower individuals living with disabilities, to live a fulfilling and meaningful life. Our mission is to create new and equal opportunities, to build life skills, friendships and improve overall capacity. We plan to do this by connecting with community, and providing quality fun-filled, group-centred and person-centred programs."

Programming has grown over the past three years and *The Next Step* now provides activities in the following areas: Community Access, Assistance with Daily Life, Short Term Respite at Avondale Place, Road to Independence Activities subsidised by Henty Respite Trust, Social Activities on Friday nights and Saturday, Social excursions for one or two days, Car Washing, and Aged Care Support. Those of us who patronise Henty's coffee shop in the morning regularly see the happy disposition of *The Next Step* participants as they gather to begin their daily activities.




PROPOSED CULCAIRN TO COROWA RAIL TRAIL

It is proposed to turn the disused railway line from Culcairn to Corowa into a recreational shared cycling/walking trail i.e. a rail trail which excludes all motorised transport. This rail trail would deliver on many points raised in the GHC 2025-2035 strategic plan that was released recently.

Currently this 76 km route within Greater Hume and Federal Council areas is a weed-infested eyesore and a fire hazard but if turned into a rail trail, it would be an economic asset to Culcairn, Walla Walla, Burrumbuttock, Brocklesby, Balldale, Hopefield and Corowa. It has been well documented from the many other rail trails (133 and counting) already in operation around Australia (as well as in New Zealand and Taiwan) that rail trails attract thousands of visitors each per year which gives rise to new business and tourism opportunities


