YEAR HIGHLIGHTS.

- Culcairn host to Southern Zone Conference held 21st March (registration fee - 1 pound)
- Working bees begin at Swimming Pool to clear up banks and remove old weather shed.
- Organised Ball in aid of Culcairn Hospital
- Wood working bees at Ellwood's.
- Film and table tennis nights
- Jaycee Pool pegged beginning of July.
- Concert and play in conjunction with Musical Society
- Zone Conference West Wyalong (for those who can remember)
- Pam Parry's concert (Indians and Blacks)
- Street stalls and dance
- Lois (Loo Loo) Beer nominated as Commerce Queen
- Fund raising and Pool working bees.

1959 - 60

JAYCEE LEARN TO SWIM AND WADING POOL

The NSW state government responded to the continuing high number of children and adult drownings by establishing a statewide 'Learn to Swim' program.

Culcairn was unable to be part of this program as the town pool in the Billabong Creek at Jubilee Park was not suitable for teaching.

Culcairn Jaycees researched if it was possible to construct a separate pool in the park. They sought and received offers from industry and construction operators resulting in support for equipment and donations of steel and cement. Permission was gained from the shire council to build, commencing in June 1959.

The shire engineer, Mr Alan Kerle, drew up plans and specifications for a 40 x 20-foot pool.

Community support joined in with Jaycee members. Immediately after this, Mr. Charlie Vonthien excavated the site with his large earth mover. By February 1960 the pool was completed enough to commence teaching the ninety children and adults registered to learn to swim.

With the pending 'Back to Culcairn' Easter week celebration approaching, it was decided to have special guest Miss Australia, Joan Stanbury open the pool on the Saturday. Hundreds flocked to the park for this occasion and other activities that followed prior to the football match – Culcairn v North Wagga.

Over the next fourteen years, the Jaycee pool was in continual use in the summer months, servicing learn to swim classes for district schools. Countless hundreds of children and adults learnt to swim in this superb facility.

Eighteen months after the opening, Jaycees launched a wool drive and raised almost 400 pounds, which enabled installation of a filtration plant.

IN YOUR GARDEN

Frosts are getting closer, as night time temperatures drop. Finally we had rain, and warm sunny days are aiding growth.

I still have beans flowering - the first time in all my gardening days. They are normally frosted and gone in April.

JOBS to do in JUNE.

- Tidy and compost vegie patches and plant green manure crop if not sowing over winter. Broad beans are a good crop, or a bale of lucerne hay spread on fallow ground.
- 2. Plant strawberries in a sunny well composted space.
- 3. Plant more rhubarb, cabbage, broad beans, silverbeet.
- 4. Pots of pansies and primulas are great for brightening up dull corners and entrances.
- 5. Plant a camellia japonica, flowering now.
- 6. Sharpen secateurs and sawblades to have them ready for pruning.
- 7. Reduce watering of indoor plants.
- 8. Plant alyssum, calendula, carnation, hollyhock, pansy, poppy, snapdragon, viola and wallflower.
- 9. Prepare soil for planting bare rooted roses and fruit trees next month.

JOBS to do in JULY

- 1. Plant lettuce, onion, parsnip, peas, spinach, silverbeet and turnip.
- Lift and divide rhubarb crowns and plant new ones.
- 3. Cut back oregano. mint and thyme. Pot up self seeded parsley plants.
- 4. Plant aquilegia, candytuft, carnation, dianthus, larkspur, primula, salvia, and verbena.
- 5. Lift and divide perennials, sedum, hellibores and lambs ear
- Plant bare rooted roses and prune existing ones, bush roses by about half and hybrid teas by one third.

- 7. Take out a quarter of old canes and dead wood from climbers. Roses are difficult to kill, so give it a go.
- 8. Choose a new rose for yourself this Winter "Heaven on Earth" is apricot/peach in colour and is a relatively new rose.
- 9. Fertilize citrus and camellias now.
- Enjoy the sunshine and colour in your Winter Garden.


CHERYL & HANK WEBSTER

HENTY-CULCAIRN PROBUS

The Henty/Culcairn Probus group held its May meeting at the Culcairn Bowling Club. The gathering was well attended.

The meeting's keynote speaker was Craig Broughton, who recounted the journey he and his wife Karen undertook after deciding to relocate from their Albury home rather than renovate. In November 2021, they purchased a 40-acre lot on Coach Road, which suited their needs, and started them on the odyssey of planning and building their new home. After discovering that it would cost \$80,000 to get power to the property, they investigated going solar. They thus began their adventure and challenge of building a three-bedroom off-grid home that was as passive solar usas possible.

In designing the house which looks like an old shearing shed, the Broughtons decided to use materials that don't require upkeep, including corrugated iron for the outside walls. The walls and ceiling are exceptionally well insulated, the windows are double-glazed, the whole house is wrapped, such that no air transfers from outside to inside or vice versa, and the rooms have high ceilings and ceiling fans.

Major windows face north to optimise the use of sunshine for heating. The house has polished concrete floors that capture heat during the day and release it in the evening to help heat it. The house's ambient temperature is between 18 and 20 degrees all vear. The Broughton's supplement the solar heat in winter with a wood fire and have a split system for heating and cooling that runs from their stored power as a final backup. In summer, the doors are opened to create crosswinds for cooling, plus the ceiling fans for air circulation.

The solar system comprises 48 solar panels that can generate up to 23.5 kWh daily, plus seven batteries for storage. With careful scheduling of major appliances, the Broughton's use less electricity than they generate.

The property only had five trees when purchased; however, over the past several years, Craig and Karen have planted 1,000 trees. These trees are reducing water runoff

and erosion and providing habitat for wildlife. As well, a part of the property has been fenced off as a birding area. The couple also utilise a sustainable water approach for their extensive vegetable garden and orchard. While an off-grid home is not for everyone, Karen and Craig love theirs.

If you are retired or semi-retired, Probus may be the social group for you.




