CULCAIRN LIBRARY REFURBISHMENT

Greater Hume Council are excited to announce that we were the recipient of Public Library Infrastructure Grant funding from the State Library NSW to upgrade and refurbish the Culcairn Library!



The purpose of this project is to improve and refresh the current Culcairn Library and turn it into a space that suits the needs of our community. This includes -

- A dedicated youth space, including technology.
- Improved dedicated spaces within the library.
- New shelving and library furnishings.
- Refurbishment of the existing space with lighting, painting and new flooring.

Many of the exciting renovations have already been completed, including the construction of a new meeting room and youth space, installation of a new air conditioner and the painting of the Library space.

Up next is the installation of new flooring. In order to successfully lay the new flooring, Library services will be unavailable for a short period of time. The Library closure will take place from 2pm on Friday, 11 July and we will re-open the new space on Tuesday, 22 July. Make sure you come into the Library prior to the closure date as the borrowing limits will be increased to help you stock up over this period.

The Customer Service area will be relocating while the flooring is installed into the Committee Room located at the front of the Council building from 8.30am Monday, 14 July 2025 until 4.00pm Friday, 18 July 2025. All Council services will remain accessible during this time.

Please note that during this closure period, the public toilets and Services Australia area will also be closed to the public.

Over the next month, pop into the Culcairn Library to watch the development of the refurbished space!

We look forward to the final result and the opportunity to provide our community a new and improved library!

WHY RECORD HISTORY PART 8

1960 President Ron Gardiner.

YEAR HIGHLIGHTS.

- 17th April – The official opening of the Jaycee Learn to Swim and Wading Pool by Joan Stanbury, “Miss Australia”, and carnival at Park
- Rabbit Shoots – shot hundreds and unloaded them at a freezer, but who was the “BUNNY” when a pair of pyjamas and a pistol appeared at the door?
- The Bachelor chapter breaking up, Engraved “Sugar bowls” price set at 30/- to be presented as wedding presents to members.
- State conference in Canberra, where Ron Gardiner was nominated as Riverina Zone President
- Organized car trial
- Held dances, street stalls, “Lucky and not so Lucky” envelopes.
- Many blistered hands after big working bees at Pitson’s wood paddock
- Ruffled stud pony in aid of Spastic Centre
- 2 teams in night tennis competition
- Average attendance at meeting 15 - 24 financial members
- Conducted Pakistan Relief Appeal – had Pakistan Army officer as guest speaker.
- It may not have been duck opening but a big “STORK” landed on the top of Bruno and Lois’ chimney. – (see article in Great Events & Memories)

BACK TO CULCAIRN – EASTER 1960

In June 1959 a public meeting was convened by Jaycees and the Park and Swimming Pool Committee to flush out ideas on how to raise funds to improve facilities for the ever-increasing caravan and camping visitors. Also, how to improve the swimming pool in the Billabong Creek.

It was decided to stage an Easter week ‘Back to Culcairn celebration’ in 1960. As a major fund raiser, a Queen Competition was organised with four candidates representing,

- Commerce - Lois Beer Rural - Betty Crawley
- Services – Osanna Biti District – Colleen Schoff,

to commence activities on November 1st, 1959.

The event itself was planned to include a football match, sports carnival with a grand parade, ecumenical church service and a monster ball on the Monday night, at which the Queen’s group who raised the most money would have their Queen named the “Back to Queen”.

During this period, Jaycees were building a learn to swim and wading pool in Jubilee Park and were responsible for the Commerce Queen fund raising activities.

A central committee researched and forwarded invitations to thousands of past residents around Australia and overseas.

By chance the ‘back to’ Secretary Archie Hoare, came across a Mr. B.J. Dowd, the chairman of Dowd and Associates, annual sponsors of the Australian Spastic Council, Miss Australia Quest, lunching in Jubilee Park and mentioned what was happening at Easter. Mr. Dowd was so impressed he said, “if you require a special guest, I could arrange for the newly crowned Miss Australia, Joan Stanbury, to spend Easter at Culcairn”.

Hundreds of past residents returned for the ‘Back to’ celebrations and contributed to the fund raising.

In the months leading up to Easter the four Queen candidates’ committees ran a myriad of fund-raising activities.

Throughout the event the Jaycees were given the task of looking after Miss Australia, who was home hosted with the ‘Back to’ chairman Keith (Dick) Smith and wife Joyce.

The Easter week went off splendidly in fine sunny weather. Joan Stanbury was delightful and friendly to everyone. She opened the just completed Jaycee learn to swim pool, presented the football to the umpires at the Culcairn V North Wagga match, played a roll in the naming and crowning of the District Queen Colleen Schoff, as the winner, at the grand ball on Monday night.

OUTCOME

Almost 12 thousand pounds was raised from the ‘Back To’. The Park and Swimming pool committee and Jaycees, supported by town tradesmen, voluntarily built a park ablution block and home for a caravan park manager.

Again, with volunteer tradies and townfolk, several hundred metres of cement steps were formed and laid down to the eastern waterline of the creek swimming pool.

The Jaycees, led by Alan and Ian Dunn, took on the 200+year old red gum on which a new high

diving tower was to be attached, by cutting it down to twelve feet. A cement platform was laid on top with safety rails, making it a great photo keepsake.

Night flood lights were added to the pool.

Before most homes had television and air conditioning, many families spent the hot summer afternoon and evenings picnicking, swimming, and socialising here.

On completion of these projects the Park and Pool Committee handed ongoing management to the Culcairn Shire and disbanded the committee.

A 16-millimetre film of the entire Easter event was made by a former resident, and long-time proprietor of the Central Café, Mr John Stevens. (This was later transferred onto DVD)

The Culcairn Show will be held on Saturday the 4th October this year.

The **Cooking Section of the show pavilion**, called Section O, has 24 classes as well as a school student's section. The school kid's section is available from Culcairn Public and St Joseph's Schools in early September and is also published in the show schedule at the back of the booklet.

The cooking classes have a brief description in the schedule and will be the same in 2025 as they were in 2024 if you still have that schedule.

Each exhibit in cooking is to be **displayed in an oven bag**, NOT FREEZER bag, with the slip of paper with class and exhibit number stuck to the oven bag. These slips are provided by the show secretary 1 week before the show with a copy of your entry form for correct information transfer.

People exhibiting cooking have the opportunity to be awarded the Gwen & Allan Fifield Award for the most successful exhibitor in cooking, worth \$50. In 2024 this award went to a school student.

The building will be owned by Greater Hume Council who are working closely with Culcairn Local Health Advisory Committee to develop plans to refurbish the building in preparation for the Health services.

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Aged Care Reforms

You may have heard by now that the introduction of the new Aged Care Act has been deferred to 1 November 2025. This delay will give the government, providers and consumers more time to understand and prepare for the changes.

Thank you to all those who have gone through the process of ensuring you are registered with My Aged Care AND have a referral for services you are receiving. I know it has been difficult for some of you to receive the wrong information from the government helpline and registration desk, but we do appreciate your perseverance!

Ensuring that all CHSP clients are assessed by the specified date is crucial for the seamless continuation of services and alignment with the upcoming reforms.

The delay will not effect our CHSP clients. You will continue to receive your services as usual. One change in the reforms, which will effect some services, is the expectation of reasonable client contributions. You will notice some minor changes to the way we ask for a contribution rather than a “donation” for group activities.

We are committed to using this delay in a way that benefits all our consumers, so please don't hesitate to reach out if you have any questions or need assistance to prepare yourself for the coming changes.
