THE BALD ARCHY PRIZE


The Bald Archy exhibition is heading to our region, and the Culcairn Community Development Committee (CCDC) is seizing the moment to spark creativity close to home. We're running a cheerful Colour-In Challenge exclusively for students at Culcairn's two primary schools, culminating in a family-friendly prize night in Holbrook on 26th September. It's simple, welcoming and designed to help our kids say, "Art is for me."

The Bald Archy is famous for playful portraits and big personalities, which makes it a perfect springboard for young artists. The challenge keeps things easy and fun: each student will receive a colouring sheet inspired by the exhibition's cheeky spirit. It's free to enter, low-pressure and a great way to link what kids make at school with an exhibition they can visit.

Every child who has a go will have their artwork displayed in Culcairn. Teachers tell us that simple art activities like this lift confidence, calm busy minds and give students a chance to show personality in their work.

Prize Night will be short, lively and welcoming for families. Finalists' works will be displayed, age-group winners will be announced, and prizes will focus on practical art kits and supplies so children can keep creating long after the event. Expect a colourful display, plenty of photos and a proud moment for our young artists. Most importantly, it gives Culcairn students a direct line from what they make to what they can see in an exhibition.

The CCDC thanks our principals, teachers, school staff, parents and volunteers for getting behind this idea. We're proud to keep opportunities flowing to Culcairn kids and to celebrate their creativity in a warm, inclusive way. Keep an eye on school newsletters and The Oasis for finalist details.

WHY RECORD HISTORY Part 10 1962

President - Neville Lowe.

YEAR HIGHLIGHTS.

At the Changeover Dinner to conclude the year, the President stated that the rewards for Jaycees were self-development, friendship, self-respect, and the respect of the community. 'I know that each of us has gained some, if not all of these rewards during this year.'

The Chapter had completed <u>twenty-six</u> <u>projects,</u> increased membership to 23, had a financial turnover of 2,800 pounds and achieved 100% membership participation.

Some projects were:

- Concluded an eleven-week course in public speaking, meeting procedure and debating, which was open to citizens.
- Participated in Zone debating and oratory,
- Raised finance through appeal and appointed cemetery caretaker,
- Supplied wood for pensioners.
- Erected district map,
- Guttering on Pensioners Hall
- Erected tables in Caravan Park
- Sponsored 5 boys to holiday camp in Sydney.
- Conducted the Shire's first <u>TRADE AND</u> <u>INDUSTRIAL FAIR.</u>
- 14 members attended conferences including 4 to the JCI Multinational Conference in Melbourne.

TRADE AND INDUSTRY FAIR

Jaycees were aware that many residents shopped out of town, mainly facilitated by improved roads.

The chapter interviewed commercial owners/managers in Culcairn and Walla Walla to seek views and ideas on how to influence residents to buy locally. Collective feedback suggested an event be organised to showcase locally available goods and services.

Jaycees decided to stage a three-day Trade and Industry Fair in Culcairn at the Memorial Hall and adjacent land (beside and opposite the Hall).

As patron bait, Jaycees secured one of the largest miniature train exhibits in Australia, (40 x 15 feet), as a feature attraction.

"The kids brought their parents".

OUTCOME

The 3-day event headed by Jaycee team, Alan Dunn, Norm Jeacocke and Doug Crawley, was a huge success. Over 1500 people attended.

Exhibitors clocked up sales exceeding 20 thousand pounds and later reported increased ongoing income.

The exhibitors asked Jaycees to stage similar events annually or bi-annually, however the chapter were committed to other projects.

Most of the population are young people, with children going to school in two shifts to use school buildings to advantage and enable educated people to lift the country from poverty.

We saw a most amazing photographic presentation, and the traditional scarf, the chroma which is locally woven from cotton and has multiple uses including as a towel.

Kate presented our Probus pen as a token of thanks.

We have morning tea with lots of talking and many stay for lunch at the club after the meeting.

Our meeting last month had Margaret Pumpa as a guest speaker. She told us how to present flowers for the upcoming Culcairn Show.


Next meeting will be at a member's garden, to talk all things Show and spring.

IN YOUR GARDEN -September

We are having some beautiful days now, longer, with fewer frosts, so the ground temperature is warming. Some rain would be welcome as more ongoing moisture is needed.

VEGIES. It's still too early for beans, tomatoes and cucumbers. Perhaps put tomato seedlings in small pots in a sheltered place, ready to plant out when frosts finish (early to mid October). **RHUBARB** can be divided now. Use good compost and some old manure and it will grow vigorously.





LAWNS. Spray for broadleaf weeds if they are a problem. Look out for Onion weed (Oxalis).

You can paint the strappy leaves with a

phosphate based poison (Roundup). Avoid using near Roses, as it affects the leaves and slows flowering.

CITRUS. As most citrus are nearing the end of their fruiting time now is a good time for a light feed. Citrus need trace elements to ensure sweet fruit and thin skins.

Grow some **BORAGE**. This plant is loved by bees who are attracted to its blue flowers. We need to encourage these important pollinators in our gardens.

ROSES Clean out your wood fire heaters, and spread ashes around roses. Add some fertiliser, and everything is ready to go for spring flowering.

Plant up a **SPRING POT** or **BASKET** with small plants, Lobelia, Allysium and Pansies. Add Ivy or Lambs Ear for a colour contrast.

Enjoy Spring flowering bulbs over the next few weeks. There are many colours, shapes and sizes of daffodils. Dutch Iris in blue, white, yellow and multi are good to grow with roses.

Culcairn Show October 4th. Enter some nuts, citrus, fruit and vegies. Help to "make a show"




