## **COUNCIL PREPARING TO MAINTAIN ESSENTIAL SERVICES**

Greater Hume Council is preparing to maintain essential services in line with the measures being put in place by the federal and state governments to limit the spread of COVID-19 (coronavirus). Mayor Heather Wilton said, Council staff were currently making special arrangements to ensure that essential services will be maintained while the COVID-19 emergency is in place. Council has closed until further notice the Culcairn, Henty, Holbrook and Jindera Libraries and Mobile Library Services, Greater Hume Visitor Information Centre at Holbrook and Submarine Museum, Henty Customer Service Centre and postponed the Free Waste Day on 5 April. Council Libraries are currently closed to the public however, they are providing their valued customers with the opportunity to still borrow books, DVD's, magazines and audiobooks from the libraries with Click & Collect. Contact Library staff by calling, emailing or social media. Provide your name and Library Card number and Library staff will ask you a number of questions. A librarian will email you when your items are ready for collection (within 24 hours) at the library of your choice and you can return your items to any of our libraries at Culcairn, Henty, Holbrook or Jindera.

Greater Hume Children Services has put new measures in place at the centres:

Families will be asked to drop off and pick up their child/children from outside the building or in the foyer area, no entry to the rooms

Sign in / Sign out on iPad, this must be wiped, and sanitised clean after every use.

Outdoor play activities will be undertaken as much as possible following sun safety, and with the opportunity for sleep and rest outdoors, in shaded areas.

Our Customer Service Centres at Culcairn, Holbrook and Jindera will remain open, however the community is encouraged to consider alternate contact methods, such as:

Meals on Wheels and similar services will be reinforced and prioritised, as seniors across the country are urged to follow COVID-19 restrictions and stay home.

## AGED CARE REPORT

A Big Hello from the residents at Culcairn health, Well what a month this one has been.

There have been some major changes here for us in March and as I write this on the 30th of March the following is up to date information for the residential aged care section.

The first being that Culcairn MPS has gone into restricted access to non-essential visits for our residents. This means that for families and friends of our residents they are unable to visit.

Families are encouraged to call their families as much as they would like, our residents all have a phone in their rooms.

We have purchased a mobile phone that is going to be used exclusively to send families a photo of their loved ones with a message and we also are in the process of setting up a way to face time with family.

Within the facility we have had a suspension of group activities and outside visitors providing entertainment or other such programs.

We have postponed visits from non-essential external providers for example our hairdresser.

We have gone away from having the large group based activities and are having smaller activities or one to one activities.

Our families and friends have all been notified of our changes.

All of the above can change at any time, we are taking our recommendations from NSW health and the government.

I would like to thank our LHAC for purchasing each one of our residents a DVD player to have in their room. This gives our residents the opportunity to turn off all the news and be able to watch a movie, watch a music DVD or any other one we have at any time while social distancing. If you have any old time movies at home that you would be willing to donate or lend to our residents please email me and I can arrange to have them picked up.

We have stocked up on novels and talking books from the library and I would like to thank some people from the community that provided us with some of the books we were looking for. The public school is going to write to us and do some art which we are looking forward to and today we received our first pen pal letter from another facility in Swansea Wales. We will be writing back to them soon.

We are continuing on with many of our programs throughout the day, keeping in mind the social distances that are required.

### What is COVID-19

Coronaviruses are a large family of viruses that cause respiratory infections. These can range from the common cold to more serious diseases.

COVID-19 is the disease caused by a new coronavirus. It was first reported in December 2019 in Wuhan City in China.

Other coronaviruses include <u>Middle East</u> Respiratory Syndrome (MERS) and <u>Severe Acute</u> Respiratory Syndrome (SARS).

### **Symptoms**

Symptoms of COVID-19 can range from mild illness to pneumonia. Some people will recover easily, and others may get very sick very quickly. People with coronavirus may experience:

• Fever & flu-like symptoms such as coughing, sore throat and fatigue, shortness of breath

## How it spreads

The virus can spread from person to person through:

- close contact with an infectious person (including in the 24 hours before they started showing <u>symptoms</u>)
- contact with droplets from an infected person's cough or sneeze

touching objects or surfaces (like doorknobs or tables) that have cough or sneeze droplets from an infected person, and then touching your mouth or face

COVID-19 is a new disease, so there is no existing immunity in our community. This means that COVID-19 could spread widely and quickly.

#### How to seek medical attention

If you are sick and think you have symptoms of COVID-19, seek medical advice. If you want to talk to someone about your symptoms, call the National Coronavirus Helpline for advice.

National Coronavirus Helpline

Call this line if you are seeking information on coronavirus (COVID-19). The line operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

To seek medical help from a doctor or hospital, call ahead of time to book an appointment.

You will be asked to take precautions when you attend for treatment. Follow the instructions you are given. If you have a mask, wear it to protect others. Stay at least 1.5 metres away from other people. Cover your coughs or sneezes with your elbow.

Tell the doctor about:

- your symptoms
- any travel history
- any recent contact with someone who has COVID-19

## **COUNCIL OFFICES SHUTDOWN**

Due to the Australian Government's restrictions introduced to minimise the impact of COVID-19, Greater Hume's Customer Service Offices will close to the public from 5pm Friday, 27 March 2020, until further notice. Council staff will continue working at each office to ensure essential community services continue to be provided. However, the offices will not be open to members of the public for face to face enquiries. The closures impact Council offices in Henty, Culcairn, Holbrook and Jindera. "I want to reassure the community that staff will still be available and Council encourages residents to utilise a range of online options, or have your enquiry dealt with over the phone" said General Manager, Steven Pinnuck. ## **Coronavirus (COVID-19)**

The COVID-19 outbreak has been declared a Global Pandemic by the World Health Organisation (WHO) and it continues to create massive disruption across the world. Greater Hume Council is working with government agencies to monitor the situation and ensure an adequate response plan is in place for the community. Mayor, Councillor Heather Wilton said "I want to assure residents that Council is implementing plans to ensure the continuous delivery of essential services such as supply, sewerage water services and garbage collections. "Part of that plan has been the identification key staff and seeking agreement to from work alternate locations, in the event that a Council office needs to be shut down. Council is also ensuring that key staff have the capacity to work from home. Council is closely following advice from the Australian and NSW State Governments in relation to events and access to Council operated facilities. Residents will be informed about any changes regarding the availability to Council services and facilities if and when the need arises, and as decisions are made in response to the evolving situation. offices are closed to customers. 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## **IN YOUR GARDEN - APRIL**

Autumn colours are with us again. Colours deepen as the nights become colder. The reds and yellows of Maples, gold and purple of Pears and Tallows will soon be everywhere to enjoy.

It's Walnut time again. If I am lucky I might find a dozen walnuts on my 50 yr. old tree. The white cockatoos invaded and cleaned up most of them!! I guess there's always next year.

For those of us in isolation at this time the garden is a good place to spend time.

With some rain and warm days there is lots to do. It is still warm enough to plant spinach, beetroot and carrot seeds. Broccoli, Brussel Sprouts, cabbage and cauliflower plants can go in now too. Winter lettuce will grow well too.

Potatoes are ready to harvest now but wait until after frosts before planting more (see August).

Early Butternut pumpkins should be almost ready to use. I am watching mine carefully. Later varieties need longer to mature and a frost or two will help.

Parsley has seeded and is coming up now. Dry some basil, thyme and sage for use in winter soups and stews.

While the soil is still warm sow some onion seeds. in rows or as a border. Red, white or brown all do well.

Roses are beautiful in Autumn. It's not as hot, so the blooms last longer on the bush. Keep dead heading for more flowers over a longer period. "Chartreuse de Parme" is a musky scented pink/ purple French rose with large, full blooms, looking great at the moment. Another great cutting rose is the red, long stemmed "Grandpa's Rose". Most nurseries have their 2020 order forms out now. with a June delivery date. Online garden centres have catalogues out now too, with some great bargains on spring bulbs.

For native, bird attracting plants for the garden, try Correas. A great range of different styles, frost free and drought tolerant. Dark green foliage and pretty pink, red, cream or white flowers. It's worth

Hard wood cuttings of lavender and rosemary are easy to grow now. I take a 4" piece, strip off the bottom leaves, dip the end in honey and put in a pot.

Even in these challenging times we can enjoy growing things, in the garden or in pots.
