#### **CDCC - Town Progress News**

With considerable change already seen in the centre of Culcairn we feel it is time for a community update to point out some of the projects already completed, and to let everyone know what is coming next.

Our biggest change so far has been the upgraded drainage in the CBD and the new footpaths. It is certainly noticeable that you don't have to wade to or from your car when it rains, which is definitely much safer and more pleasant for all. The footpaths are also a visual improvement and allow much better access to businesses along the main street.



The addition of the plaza area, with plenty of seating, will hopefully be a gathering point for our community.

With plants and trees to be put

in by the end of June the space will become even more inviting and attractive. Why not grab a coffee, have a sit, and enjoy a chat while the beautiful weather lasts?

Some concerns have been raised with regard to the surface of the street, especially with the loose stones and some unevenness. These issues will be addressed, in time, as the roads from McBean St to the roundabout, and around the corner to the end of the Culcairn Hotel will eventually be completely sealed with new asphalt. When this will actually occur is unclear at the moment, as time for the soil to settle over the new pipes and around the new trees, is required. This will then ensure that a smooth surface, that won't keep moving, is achieved. A minimum of at least 12 months, with a range of weather conditions, is needed for adequate settling.

Once the road gets sealed, the roundabout is revamped, some shelter over the plaza is installed and the centre garden is renovated the centre of town will look amazing. We just have to be a little patient.

The other big project in town is the new subdivision on the western side. The whole project is being done in 3 stages, but Stage 1 (consisting of 24 house blocks of varying sizes) is almost complete. Hopefully land will be available for sale in about 3 months, which is very exciting. Having opportunities for locals, and for new families coming to our town, bodes well for our future.

Libby wears a service bar showing deployment in East Timor and the Middle East. Libby is also a fitness instructor at the Lifestyle centre in Henty and specialises in chair based exercise. She claims that the most difficult exercise is to smile. Warren presented Libby with our Probus pen as a thank you for a most interesting five-minute speech.

We were treated to a lovely morning tea of scones with jam and cream, all especially made for us by the Henty school children. Thank you from us all. Assistant Principal Ms Erika Crevatin invited us to watch a performance of lovely singing by the children. There was a welcome to country, and then the children of Yugay (Wiradjuri for Dingo).

The kindergarten and grade one children sang a welcoming song about fish and diversity and sounding better in harmony. They did the actions too-just beautiful. We then heard from grades three and four and singing club, who are known as Gugaaay or Magpie in the Wiradjuri language.

They sang Waltzing Matilda for us and it was also beautiful.

Ms Crevatin then invited us to have a tour of the kitchen (where butter chicken was being prepared for children's lunches), library and a classroom.

Kevin Fogarty thanked Ms Crevatin and her helpers, presented our Probus pen as a token of our thanks. The Probus group then went back to Henty Club for a lovely lunch of fish with chips and salad, and lots of discussion about Henty primary school being a good place to learn about being a person.

Our next meeting is to be at Culcairn Bowling Club 8th May at 9.30am for a 10.00am start. We are hoping to have Dr Penny Vine from Upper Murray Refugee support group as our speaker.

#### IN YOUR GARDEN

We are looking for some rain at the moment for lawns and gardens. While soil is still warm, plant some carrot and beetroot seeds as well as red, brown, and white onion seeds. Winter vegies are along-broad beans, broccoli moving cauliflower are enjoying the sunshine. Spinach and lettuce are growing well too. There is still time plant peas before the colder weather. Butternuts are ready to harvest now, whilst larger varieties of pumpkin are still maturing. Wait for the vines to wither and the tops to harden before picking and storing OFF the ground. Olives are traditionally harvested on Mother's Day. Compost heaps can have Autumn leaves added to them as they break down and make good mulch. Garlic corms can be planted now. Homegrown garlic has great flavour not found in imported garlic that has been sprayed, bleached, and fumigated to comply with government laws.

Kangaroo Paws - feed in Spring and Autumn to promote multiple flowers per stem. They need lots of sunshine and good drainage. Cut back after flowering and divide now. Don't forget pots of mini Chrysies or cyclamen for Mother's Day (12th May). Still time to plant bulbs. Some of mine are coming up already but later flowering varieties can still go in. World Environment Day is on 5<sup>th</sup> June. We can conserve water and energy by growing our own food. Use mulch to suppress weeds and enable use of less water. Purchase deciduous trees in Winter, after selecting the ones you like in Autumn, as they show off their colours. Trees come bare rooted and suffer less shock when planted now. Hellebores in shady areas brighten up a winter's day. You can cut away scruffy leaves to allow the new flowers to be seen as they emerge.

Time to prune roses and plant new, bare rooted stock, I always try to buy repeat flowering and perfumed varieties. Bottle Brush (Callistemon) are flowering, and the native birds just love them. Planted with Grevilleas in your garden they are a great winter food source for the birds. Now is also time for the colour and beauty of Camellias, firstly the Sasanquas then the Japonicas.
