During their time in Broken Hill Mark worked as a mechanic on Nekarbo Station with 'Broken Hill Hire and Engineering' and leased the workshop at 'Kees Hill Motors'. Pam taught at Broken Hill High School and then at the School of the Air. After marrying in 1988 they continued to work and live in Broken Hill until moving to reside in Culcairn at the beginning of 1990.

Mark worked as a mechanic for 'Jacob Toyota' at Henty for nine years and did road service for 10 years. He built his own workshop 'Fitzies Culcairn' in Railway Parade opening in early 1999. It was hard work and long hours to gradually build up workshop clientele and many loyal customers remained with Fitzies throughout the years. With the progression of his Parkinson's and other health issues Mark closed the workshop at the end of 2023. He

will always be indebted to 'Biti Motors' and Malcolm Lee for the encouragement, advice and help they gave him during his time at Fitzies. The business was purchased by Joe and Roxanne Keys in 2024 and Mark is very pleased to see it is once again a thriving workshop.

The town is incredibly grateful for the employment opportunities Fitzies created. Many young people received their apprenticeships through Mark's business, their son being one of them. They were offered fantastic training and developed great friendships thanks to Mark.

Pam began teaching at Culcairn Public School in January 1990 and has remained there ever since. She states that it is a fantastic country school with an amazing staff. Her enjoyment of teaching continues as she celebrates 40 years in the teaching service in 2025. Pam has been lucky to have worked with fabulous Principals, who have been flexible, caring and compassionate to staff, students and families. All four of the Leov children attended Culcairn Public School and then Billabong High School before moving into their respective careers. In 2024 they became "empty nesters" with all four children living away from Culcairn.

They will be forever grateful to the Culcairn community for their guidance, acceptance and support of all members of the Leov family as they continue to live and work here. Mark and Pam said Culcairn has been an awesome place to raise a family, build a business and a home and they look forward to many happy years to come.

IN YOUR GARDEN

A very hot, dry summer, we are now officially in autumn, but we can expect to stay hot for a while longer, even though the days are shorter. While soil temps stay warm we can plant a few more lettuce for salads.

We are mainly looking to finish harvesting summer vegies, tomatoes, beans, zucchini, cucumbers etc. Rock melons and watermelons are doing well and pumpkins maturing nicely. Keep up the water!

Seedlings of broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, brussels sprouts can be planted now and seed of carrot, beetroot. Parsnip as well as broad beans and peas can be sown too. Green tomatoes, chilli, beans, zucchini will make good pickles as the season finishes.

Spend some time tidying up your summer garden, weed, mulch, and prepare it for an overwinter rest. Pears and apples are in season. "Gala" are in store as a new season variety now. Later maturing is the "Pink Lady". "Golden Delicious" is in season now through winter and spring. Great for cooking as they don't fall apart. Apple Pies, crumbles, and cakes are delicious uses for these fruits. Pear Relish is yummy too!

Figs are almost finished. I have jammed, dried, and made chutney. There was great excitement when I found a "Black Genoa" fig tree growing wild in a back paddock tree row. An amazing eating fig and the birds had missed it!! These figs are selling in supermarkets and fruit shops for \$2.99-\$3.50 each.

Roses—They should give us some autumn blooms if you have dead headed, watered, and fertilized since Christmas. Flowers last longer when the heat is less intense.

Dahlias - are now re flowering after being blasted by hot days in January.

Vincas - are amazing little annuals. They love the hot, dry days and will keep flowering until the frosts hit them. Well worth growing.

Sweet Peas - Don't forget to plant them on St Patrick's Day for lots of lovely blooms in spring. Start planning now for your Spring Bulb Show. Bulbs will be for sale now.

Keep on watering, one day it will rain and surprise us! Enjoy your time in the garden, Margaret Pampa

1957 Jaycees President Alan Wilson

YEAR HIGHLIGHTS

- 6TH February 6.30 am – a working bee at the CWA Community Baby Health Centre, supposed to be planting lawn, but what grew best were watermelons from the seeds of melons we had for morning lunch.
- Held seminar at Church of England Hall with Wagga Jaycee Wal Fife as guest speaker.
- Don Lowe won the area public speaking contest.
- Organised dances and sold sheep manure in Albury to aid FAR WEST SCHEME
- Formed committee to investigate condition of cemetery.
- BITI PEST CONTROL – While conducting a working bee cleaning up the Jubilee Park, several members were stung by wasps, so Bruno was called in, Equipment used – several car engines revving hard and 1 Double Barrelled Shot Gun (at point blank range)- RESULT – a lot of very angry wasps.
- Members playing monopoly at Leon Schoff's home till roosters crowed.

CWA - COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTRE

The recently built Community Health Centre in McBean Street required landscaping.

Also being the headquarters of the Country Women's Association (CWA), they asked if the new Junior Chamber of Commerce would like to help beautify the centre.

We accepted and in one day prepared and planted buffalo lawn and shrubs.

As a gesture of kindness, the CWA ladies provided morning tea and watermelon on this very hot February day.

The boys were a bit careless with the pips and what grew the best was a crop of watermelons out the front for all to see and help themselves too.

JUBILEE PARK

The park established around 1910 was the home of the town's swimming pool in the Billabong Creek.

The family picnic area had become overgrown with shrubbery, elm tree suckers and fallen timber.

As our first major community project led by Jack McLeish, Jaycees arrived with trucks, gear, and brawn. In one day, we removed twelve truckloads of not required material, almost down to water level of the Billabong.

Following this day we installed a free covered gas barbeque, tables, and seating. Much jostling and comradery set the chapter on the road to success.

We were told the Murray Grey Society started in 1962. Helen Emily Sutherland did not drive a car but rode a horse and knew animals by sight and their pedigrees too. Warren presented our Probus pen as a thank you for a most interesting talk.

We have sung "Kookaburra sitting on the old gum tree" as a round, and after a demonstration by Steve and Herb, we are sounding pretty good.

Our main speaker was Alan Rayner. He told of his family history investigations and the hazardous journey of folks to Australia.
