


FIRE AND RESCUE CULCAIRN



VALE GEOFF TREBLEY

Malcolm Geoffrey TREBLEY. Known as Geoff. 10th September1940 - 18th March 2024



Geoff Trebley lived next door to me he was a wonderful neighbor and friend and knew so much about gardening and we really miss him. He was always there to give me tips on different plants and to skite about his much-loved orchids. He looked after our dogs,

two Maltese Shitzu, on many occasions. One of our dogs was called Benny, but Geoff called him Rough and Tough. Geoff made me laugh. He was the best neighbor anyone could ask for.

Geoff completed his apprenticeship in 1962 and so began a successful career in building industry spanning over 50 years. The first house that Geoff ever built from scratch to completion is the cottage visible from The Culcairn to Morven road at Round Hill.. Geoff had to ride his bicycle to the job. One outstanding achievement was when he was awarded the Victorian Foreman of the year in 2007.

Geoff and Robyn have two children Mark and Donna that has resulted in nine grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren.

Geoff and Robyn eventually purchased a home in McBean Street Culcairn and over the years Geoff converted the house into a comfortable family home. Geoff was an active participant in both local and interleague Australian Rules football and tennis. Along with his gardening and bonsai interests Geoff was quite a keen fisherman with regular trips undertaken with Nan and Pop Brand and other family members. Playing euchre and cribbage was another favourite hobby with Geoff passing on the skill to many of his grandchildren.

Around 1969 Geoff joined the New South Wales Fire Brigade in Culcairn. During this time he helped protect the town as the 1969 bushfires approached. He worked on fires at the Culcairn Central School and regular chimney fires at the Culcairn Hotel amongst others.

Almost all his 83 years saw Geoff healthy and very active with mowing lawns and odd jobs for many in town as well as for his family. In typical Geoff fashion he volunteered to repair the staircase at the old station masters house, Culcairn Museum. Whilst completing this job he set about repairing sub boards and doors for the museum.

Geoff recently became unwell, and he enjoyed lots of ice cream delivered by his son Mark to his hospital bed side. Geoff passed away peacefully with his daughter Donna steadfastly by his side.

IN YOUR GARDEN

Spring is underway and we are enjoying longer days with frosts fading. It's time to think about planting. Wait for warmer soil and frost-free nights before planting out. Adding some Marigolds to your vegie patch will give colour, attract pollinators and distract unwanted pest insects from your vegies.

Put in a few lettuces, some basil, parsley and a couple of little tomatoes. Sharing a punnet of plants with a neighbour is a practical idea. Add a few flowers to the mix. Edible flowers include violas and marigolds. Beans (bush and climbing) can go in soon too. Fertilize passionfruit now, being aware that they have a wide spreading root system. Don't forget the liquid Sulphate of Potash to promote flowers and fruit.

We've just had our Culcairn show and I hope people enjoyed exhibiting in the Pavilion. Roses are starting their Spring display. Most bulbs will have finished by now but wait till the foliage dies back and continue to water as this put's nutrients in the bulb ready for next year's flowering.

Time to find some "Open Gardens " in the area—worth a visit and good places to get some new ideas.

Burrumbuttock flower show has a wonderful display of pots, arrangements and cut flowers.

Make a Hydration station (Watering Point) for Pollinators- place pebbles in the water as landing places and a rag wicking out of the Birdbath, for the bees.

Use mulch to conserve moisture, suppress weeds and keep plants cool.



We now have **DOMESTIC ASSISTANCE** services available to clients in the Culcairn and surrounding areas. We can also assist you to participate in the community with our Social Support programme; Accompanied activities, shopping, banking, bill paying, assistance to attend appointments, friendly visiting and phone calls. The Emergency Preparedness Assistance programme is also available and a timely reminder to perhaps think about plans for the upcoming hot weather and bushfire season. Our Meals on Wheels menu has been updated for SPRING. There are now even more items for our service users to choose from. We deliver meals to our CHSP (Commonwealth Home Support Programme) clients, as well as clients of other services such as Home Care Package clients, in the Jindera area, every Thursday. Feel free to call us if you need any more information, our wonderful staff will be happy to help out!

For Commonwealth Home Support clients, meal cost starts at \$3.00 for a soup or dessert, \$5.70 for petite meals and large meals start at \$7.00. Desserts are delicious and highly recommended! We don't have the big budget advertising BUT did you know, HOME CARE clients are eligible for further subsidies on their meals from ANY Meals Provider? Home Care clients pay just 30% of the menu price and the balance, an administration and delivery fee, is charged to your package. Speak to you Home Care provider if you wish to take advantage of this service.

WHY RECORD HISTORY – PART 1

A meeting of past members and wives of Culcairn Junior Chamber of Commerce – or Jaycees as we were known, was called in July 2022 to consider if we would, or would not, record the chapter's history in the form of a book. If history had not been recorded in writing, the human race would have no 'news, books, movies or religion', and the lifestyle we live today would not exist.

We decided that when our generation is gone, nothing would have been recorded of what Culcairn Jaycees achieved, that changed the direction of our community, influenced our region, across Australia and 'surprise' worldwide.

FUTURE GENERATIONS WOULD NEVER KNOW that: -

- In 1959 we built with our hands a learn to swim pool that, for 14 years, taught thousands of district children and adults to swim.
- Educated 400 farmers directly and thousands via rural media on how to transition from sheep to cattle. Also, later a similar Leadership Development project, wool growers how to adapt to a new processing, wool classing, and marketing system.
- Influenced local government who, by tradition, based almost all their decisions around rural roads and potholes, almost neglecting their rural communities, to move to a balanced management for all shire citizens, and their urban community's needs.
- In 1965, we stopped 'Whelan the Wrecker' from demolishing 80% of our historic Culcairn Hotel. (Cira 1891.)
- Planned and carried out the numbering all homes, vacant blocks, and businesses in Culcairn.
- Organised and managed a professional five-day Business Management Course for regional business owners.
- Created a domestic tourist industry, which was opposed by our local government and ridiculed by many business leaders, that became a multi, million-dollar industry for our entire region.
- Formed a Jaycee Chapter in both Henty and Holbrook
- Repaired our neglected community cemetery, refenced and established a pine tree windbreak, planted shrubbery and employed a caretaker over a 7 year period.
