Mayor's Message

Standing Together in Challenging Times

As we embrace the cooler months, our community remains steadfast in facing one of our greatest challenges—ongoing drought conditions. Whilst we have had some rain, we are now in a green drought. With a combination of low rainfall and cold temperatures this has a significant impact on crop and pasture growth. In drought-affected areas, winter often brings additional challenges—soil moisture remains low, and colder conditions can stunt recovery efforts. And sadly, we are now competing with Victoria, South Australia and now flood effected northern NSW for stock fodder.



As of 16 May 2025, 7 of our parishes were drought declared, the rest 'drought affected' in Greater Hume. The Government doesn't view a drought as a natural disaster, that it's a natural part of the Australian climate and hence they focus their funds on managing the risk. We disagree with this stance and believe the policy needs to be changed to encompass more practical help on the ground. Council is actively working hard through advocating our State and Federal government agencies ensure your voices are heard.

As agriculture is our Shires main industry, it affects all of us in some way. Our farmers, local businesses, and families are feeling the impact. I encourage everyone to play a part by supporting local businesses or simply checking in on a neighbour or mate. Small actions make a big difference.

This season is a time for unity, hope, and community spirit. We are very fortunate to live in such a wonderful area full of community spirit and we will continue to stand together, adapting and finding solutions that will help us endure.

- · Upgrade of 5 bridges along Jingellic Road
- · Burrumbuttock Walking Track Upgrade
- Building of the playground at the Henty Recreation Ground
- Road Rehabilitation and Kerb & Gutter and Drainage along Swift Street, Holbrook (between Young and Hume Street)
- Kerb & Gutter and Drainage upgrade along Balfour Street, Culcairn
- Road Rehabilitation and Kerb & Gutter/
 Drainage along Dight Street, Jindera
- Street Light installation at the Hueske Road and Urana Road Intersection in Jindera

Community Projects Update

Below are updates on some of the community prioritised projects currently being implemented:

- Brocklesby Funded by Brocklesby Pub Fund Replacing 4 tennis courts.
 This project has now been completed.
- Brocklesby Focus Group's Blacksmith Park upgrade. The Installation of AWTS toilets has now been completed.
- Culcairn Moving of the Pedestrian Railway Bridge. Now awaiting Inland Rail Contractor to relocate bridge, then refurbishment will occur. Latest Information from Inland Rail is that the relocation is now likely to occur in early 2026.
- Holbrook Holbrook Dog Park Bindis have been sprayed and removed and reseeding has occured. Council are
 thrilled to announce that the Holbrook Dog Park has been completed. There are ramps, tables, chairs and running
 water located within the park as well as dog bags and bins for convenience.
- Holbrook Levee The Holbrook Levee works have now been completed.

Local family friendly things to do this Winter

As the winter chill settles in, there's no better way to stay warm than by uncovering the rich tapestry of history woven throughout Greater Hume.

This season, step into the stories of the past on a captivating History and Heritage drive, a perfect day (or two!) of discovery, nostalgia, and regional charm.

Begin your adventure in **Culcairn**, where the elegant Station House Museum (open Saturdays only) tells the story of the railway era. Wander

through rooms adorned with original floorboards, iron lace-work, and curated memorabilia that capture the spirit of a bygone time.

In **Henty**, discover a true hub of historical experiences. The Headlie Taylor Header Museum and Ed's Old Farm Machinery Museum showcase the region's agricultural ingenuity, while the Observer Printery Museum offers a fascinating peek into the early days of print. Don't miss Dales Mini Museum, tucked beneath the local IGA and brimming with quirky local memorabilia.

Make your way to **Holbrook**, where three distinct museums await. The Woolpack Inn Museum brings pioneering life vividly to life with its transport, household, and machinery exhibits. The National Museum of Australian Pottery houses the country's largest collection of early Australian pottery. And of course, no visit is complete without exploring the iconic Submarine Museum, home of the mighty HMAS Otway. Watch the engaging hologram show and discover how this unexpected naval giant came to reside in Holbrook.

Round out your heritage adventure in **Jindera** at the Jindera Pioneer Museum, one of the finest rural museums in NSW. Nestled among historic buildings and beautiful gardens, it boasts over 25 themed rooms that bring German settler life, historic shop fronts, and 19th-century domestic life to vivid detail.

Prefer to stretch your legs? Take a walk along one of Greater Hume's Heritage Trails in Burrumbuttock, Culcairn, Henty, Jindera, Walla Walla or Woomargama, each trail rich with stories, landmarks, and glimpses into the past.

Whether you're a history buff, a curious traveller, or simply seeking a cosy escape from the winter chill, Greater Hume's museums and heritage trails promise a journey filled with discovery, inspiration, and country charm. So bundle up, hit the road, and uncover the stories that shaped our region, one town, one treasure, one museum at a time.

Culcairn Library Refurbishment

Greater Hume Council are excited to announce that we were the recipient of Public Library Infrastructure Grant funding from the State Library NSW to upgrade and refurbish the Culcairn Library!

The purpose of this project is to improve and refresh the current Culcairn Library and turn it into a space that suits the needs of our community. This includes -

- A dedicated youth space, including technology.
- · Improved dedicated spaces within the library.
- · New shelving and library furnishings.
- Refurbishment of the existing space with lighting, painting and new flooring.

Many of the exciting renovations have already been completed, including the construction of a new meeting room and youth space, installation of a new air conditioner and the painting of the Library space.

Up next is the installation of new flooring. In order to successfully lay the new flooring, Library services will be unavailable for a short period of time. The Library closure will take place from 2pm on Friday, 11 July and we will re-open the new space on Tuesday, 22 July. Make sure you come into the Library prior to the closure date as the borrowing limits will be increased to help you stock up over this period.

The Customer Service area will be relocating while the flooring is installed into the Committee Room located at the front of the Council building from 8.30am Monday, 14 July 2025 until 4.00pm Friday, 18 July 2025. All Council services will remain accessible during this time.

Please note that during this closure period, the public toilets and Services Australia area will also be closed to the public.

Over the next month, pop into the Culcairn Library to watch the development of the refurbished space!

- Notification 24 hours prior to burn it is a legislated responsibility of the landowner.
- Notification required in case someone calls 000 so our duty officers can quickly contact the landowner to confirm if a fire truck is required, or not.
- Fines apply to landowners lighting fires who do not have a permit and/or notification to RFS 24hrs prior.
- Landowner's neighbours also to be informed 24hrs prior.
