

NSW Rural Fire Service now offers an online portal for landowners to advise that they are planning a burning off.

- Notification 24 hours prior to burn - it is a legislated responsibility of the landowner.
- Notification required in case someone calls 000 so our duty officers can quickly contact the landowner to confirm if a fire truck is required, or not.
- Fines apply to landowners lighting fires who do not have a permit and/or notification to RFS 24hrs prior.
- Landowner's neighbours also to be informed 24hrs prior.

Community Projects Update

On Wednesday, 9 November 2022 Greater Hume Council held a meeting in Culcairn with community organisations from throughout Greater Hume region. The meeting was to hear from community groups about their plans for the future of their relevant communities and to start to develop a list of prioritised projects whether current or long term that may be funded by Council or through grant/funding opportunities or other agencies. A comprehensive list has now been developed. Below are some of the community prioritised projects currently being implemented:

- Brocklesby Funded by Brocklesby Pub Fund Replacing 4 tennis courts
- Brocklesby Focus Group's Blacksmith Park upgrade (including placement of Plane Silhouette and Brocklesby railway sign).
- Jindera Community Forum Fencing of dog park.
- Culcairn Balfour Street and Railway Parade drainage upgrade, footpath
 improvements/treatments, kerb and guttering, ramps into various businesses, street
 footpaths.
 trees, installation of a plaza (in front of the Council Chambers). This project is being
 jointly funded by the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program 2023
 and Crown Reserves Improvement Fund.
- Culcairn Moving of the Pedestrian Railway Bridge.
- Henty Funded by the Stronger Country Communities Fund Round 5 Grant -Cement path between Ivor Street and Alan Street to enable access to Henty Memorial Park.
- Burrumbuttock Supporting the Tennis, Netball and Football Club's to seek funding for the proposed multi purpose community hub.
- Burrumbuttock Jointly funded by the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program 2023 and Crown Reserves Improvement Fund - Installation of new toilets and septic system at Burrumbuttock Recreation Reserve.
- Burrumbuttock Funded by the Stronger Country Communities Fund Round 5
 Grant Install new lighting to Burrumbuttock Tennis Courts.

Local family friendly things to do this Winter

Stay warm and dry inside our amazing Museums this Winter. Spend some time reconnecting with the past as you learn about our rich and varied history. You can visit all of our Museums on the ultimate History and Heritage day drive;

Start off the trail at the Doll Museum and Historical Treasures in Gerogery. This Museum is housed in a charming historical church and has a fantastic

display of dolls, teddies, prams and collectibles dating back to 1880's to see.

Make your next stop Culcairn for a visit to the Station House Museum. This Museum is a tangible reminder of the great railway expansion of the last century with early railway memorabilia on display, the two story brick building with its beautiful wrought iron and stairway, together with the original floors and ceilings, presents one of the best examples of a building of its type in Australia.

A stop in Henty will take you to quite a few Museums. The Headlie Taylor Header Museum and Ed's Old Farm Machinery Museum will give you a great insight into the agricultural history of the area. Also in Henty, the Observer Printery Museum and Mini Museum will take you back in time with a collection of printing memorabilia and so much more.

In Holbrook you can step back in time and experience the pioneering past in the Woolpack Inn Museum, as well as see an extensive display of early transport and machinery used in the district. You can see the stunning collection of 19th and early 20th century Australian Pottery at the National Museum of Australian Pottery. Don't forget to find out why there is a Submarine in the middle of a town 400kms away from the nearest ocean as you dive into the Submarine Museum. Watch the

3D hologram and explore the submarine components and mock areas of the submarine interior.

Next up is the Wymah Museum. Located in the old Wymah School, this Museum offers a selection of rotating local themes and includes pioneer family history, the origins of Patterson's Curse, Wymah Ferry and much more.

Your final stop will take you to the Jindera Pioneer Museum, which will give you a window into our German heritage and life Pic Jindera Pioneer Museum on the land over 150 years ago. Spread



over two acres of lovely grounds, with over 25 rooms and galleries, see the impressive collection of shop articles, furniture and household goods. Or if you prefer to walk and take in your history, try our historical trails in Burrumbuttock, Culcairn, Henty, Jindera, Walla Walla and Woomargama.

Burrumbuttock School Students visit local farm to look for Squirrel Gliders

Burrumbuttock year 3-6 students had a special excursion to visit Justin and Lisa Burn's farm to help monitor Squirrel Glider nest boxes installed in revegetation areas along Burrumbuttock Creek.

Project Officer for the Burrumbuttock Squirrel Glider LAMP Project Lou Bull said 'this area of revegetation is now maturing enough to

support Squirrel Glider's which is why we selected this area to install nest boxes. Even though the quality of the plants are good enough (eg they are flowering and there are lots of insects) there a few trees with hollows, which means there is no where for the Squirrel Gliders to rest and shelter in during the day. '

The nest boxes were installed in 2019 and are part of a monitoring program involving 11 local landholders and some roadsides. There are 150 boxes across all of these sites. It was with great excitement that the first nest box the students looked in had not just 1 but 2 Squirrel Gliders. This particular nest box had been installed by Justin and Lisa less than one year ago to add to the other nest boxes at the site. Lisa said 'this is the first time I have actually seen a Squirrel Glider, I can't believe it is in the box we installed'.

Lou said 'by installing and monitoring these nest boxes we are able to get an understanding that if we can create quality habitat (food and shelter ie hollow like structures) the Squirrel Glider's will stay in the location and breed. This gives us confidence that Squirrel Gliders have a long term future in our local environment'.

- Installation of a low level bridge/causeway at the access road King Parrot Creek off Jingellic Road, Lankeys Creek.
- Installation of a culvert under Urana Road/Molkentin Road intersection, Jindera.
- Underground stormwater drainage installation in Balfour Street, Fraser Street and Railway Parade, Culcairn, including full reconstruction of the footpath in Balfour Street and Railway Parade.
- 1.5km rehabilitation on Jingellic Road (approximately 19km from Holbrook).
- Upgrade drainage in Adams Street, Jindera (from Jindera Street to Watson Street).
- Jacob Wenke Drive Stage 2, 10 Lot Subdivision, Walla Walla.
- Brocklesby Balldale Road Reconstruct 4km from Brocklesby Goombargana Road to Woodland Road.
- Coppabella Creek Bridge replacement.
 Reconstruction of flood damaged bridge over Coppabella Creek, Coppabella.
- Shoulder reconstruction at various locations along Tunnel Road, Woomargama.
- Headwall repair to the culvert on Bungowannah Road (1.8 kms to the east of Boxwood and Bungowannah Road intersection).
- Gravel resheeting on local unsealed roads as per Council's Capital Works Program.
- Heavy patching on various local roads.

Help with the Regional Seniors Travel Card

After assisting many seniors who struggle with computer use, staff discovered that seniors can simply call 13 77 88 rather than using a computer to obtain this Card. Eligible seniors must be receiving the aged pension or be a Commonwealth Seniors Health Card holder and be living in a designated regional area of NSW.

You will need to have your personal details at hand, including address and phone number plus the number and expiry date of your pension or healthcare card.

Applications for 2023 (Year 4) open on 23 January 2023 and close on 30 November 2023.

The regional seniors travel card provides eligible seniors wih a \$250 prepaid card to help ease the cost of travel. You can use the card at certain retailers to pay for pre-booked NSW TrainLink regional trains and coaches, fuel and taxis.

FREE Home Library Delivery Service

If you're a person with a disability or an older person who experiences challenges getting to and from your local Library, then the home library service is here to help you borrow books, audio books, CD's, magazines and DVD's.

Once you have joined any of the Greater Hume Council Libraries or are already an existing member, contact a library staff member to discuss the types of books and/or other resources you wish to borrow. Staff will then deliver items directly to your home, free of charge. They will also collect items that need to be returned.

Save Power Kits

Contained in an easy-to-carry case, Riverina Regional Library's Save Power Kits will help you identify the biggest energy users in your home.

Each kit contains a power meter to measure the energy consumption and running costs of your appliances, a thermometer to ensure your fridge, freezer and hot water temperatures are set correctly, an infrared thermometer to find where heat is lost or gained in your home, a stopwatch to time shower and tap-flow rates, plus a how-to guide. After recording your results, the kit provides handy tips and suggestions that you can use to develop a personalised Home Energy Action Plan.




