Greater Hume Council welcomes Evelyn Arnold to the position of General Manager, for a five year term, following an extensive recruitment campaign.




Mayor, Cr Tony Quinn said "whilst Greater

Pension Concession

Receive your rates notices via email

If you hold a Pensioner Concession or a Department of Veterans Affairs Card you may be eligible for a concession on both your rates and water. The Concession is available only on your primary residence and your pension or DVA card must reflect this address. Please note that NSW does not grant concessions on Health Care cards. If you are receiving a rebate on your rates it will automatically carry over onto your water account.

To apply, complete a Pension Concession Application and attach a copy of your Centrelink Pension Card. Your application will then be processed by our Finance Team and an amended rates notice will be sent out to you.

Pensioner Concession Applications can be completed electronically or downloaded via #greaterhume website or collected from one of Greater Hume's Customer Service Centres.

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
