#### **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE UPDATE**

The Community Development Committee AGM was recently held on 20 February at the Walla Walla Sportsground, with a good turnout from the community. Daniel Nadebaum opened proceedings and Committee members were introduced, with a special mention made of Ms Leonie Carey who recently stepped back from Secretary duties after a phenomenal 16 years. Projects that the Development Committee has worked on over the past 12 months were presented, namely:

- Exercise Park a cover (pictured below) was built over the Exercise Park; cost covered by grant from Riverina Water;
- Skatepark official opening was held in April 2022;
- Water Tower Art Damien Mitchell painted a stunning artwork with completion approx. May 2022;
- Community Garage Sale was organised with money put back into the kitty for future developments for the town;
- Preparation of a list of current and future plans for Walla Walla;

2022:

- Coordinated Battery collection as a fundraiser;
- Donated prize money for Christmas Light Competition, "Make Walla Glow again";
- Working on community suggestions;
- Coordination and presentation to Council of the Walla Walla development Strategic Plan to the Greater Hume Council;
- Applied for several Grants.

The Walla Walla Development Strategic Plan, that spans proposed projects over the next 10 years was then presented. These projects have been compiled from input from the community regarding areas of concern and Wish lists. The document is considered "live" i.e. it will be referred to for plans to be worked on, updated, and amended as time progresses, and provides focus for both the Committee and for Council.

#### Submissions for absent speakers were

then read out by Daniel Nadebaum, specifically: Greg Blackie (Director of Engineering Greater Hume Council) regarding proposed works in the pipeline for Walla; Andrew Kotzur (local business owner) regarding the proposed housing development on the south end of town; Steph Odewahn (Editor of Walla's Newsletter) providing an update on the newsletter; and Drew Gibson (local Police Officer) - brief update.

Speakers onsite then presented, namely:

- Craig Wenke Rural Fire Brigade;
- Joanne Scherf Walla Walla Public School;
- Anita Morton St Paul's College;
- Al Odewahn Sportsground Committee;
- John Borchert Walla Walla Gum Swamp Committee.

The official meeting was then closed and the forum opened for questions from the floor.

Main points noted from the questions were:

- The speeding of cars and trucks through the town – raise with local Police and Council for best outcome.
- Feral cat numbers on the rise leading to decline of small native birds – contact Council rangers for best resolution.
- Replacement timeframe for trees in Market St – Daniel chasing up on this.
- Men's Shed query there is a meetup every Wednesday morning at the local café.
- Deteriorating signage within town

   refer to Council's website for resolution.
- Trucks/cars washing their rubbish into the street – raise with Council directly for best outcome.
- Walla Walla Silo Art confirmed it is both on the Silo Art trail and in this year's Calendar.



#### HENTY / CULCAIRN PROBUS REPORT

Our President Yvonne Booth welcomed us all.

Beryl Meyer took up her new position as our club secretary.

Neil and Julie Parker told us about possible phone and computer scams, and Janet Beverley gave an update on the now completed Avondale House in Henty and the anticipated occupancy certificate.

A big thank you from Yvonne and the sea men who received our beautifully knitted beanies. They are much appreciated and much needed.

Sybil Ritchie was our five minute speaker. She told of her father being fourth of ten children and eldest boy, and how he went farming at Ganmain and then went to war, and how he met his future wife, a qualified tailoress, in Glasgow. Sybil's parents were married at Ryan and her mother learned about cooking on a wood stove from neighbours. Some of the family went to school in Henty. Sybil has worked in Melbourne and Sydney, and has had two corner stores in Wagga Wagga, as well as working at the Prince of Wales motel in Wagga Wagga. We thank Sybil for sharing her family story and very busy life.

After morning tea, June Bahr introduced our main speaker Robyn Wood, whose family she has known for fifty years. Robyn spoke on falls prevention. The information from Robyn was aimed at those aged over sixty-five years, particularly the people using walking sticks and walkers which needed to be correct for a person's height and width, and discussing this with a physiotherapist. Robyn spoke of eating well, wearing well fitting non slip shoes, annual checkups, and keeping fit so we are less likely to have falls. Thirty-seven percent of injury deaths are caused by falls, and it is every one's business to prevent falls. We should have ICE (in case of emergency) phone numbers on our phone, and do gentle exercise to help ourselves, and that can be as basic as a daily 20 minute walk. After a most interesting question and answer session, Robyn was presented with a Probus pen as a token of our thanks.

Yvonne most often closes our meetings by sharing an interesting quote. Today's was "Be the reason somebody smiles today".

Our next meeting is on May 10th at the Culcairn Bowling Club, 9.30 am for a 10.00 am start.

Hope you too be will joining us and stay for lunch, with much smiling and friendship.





It is indeed a mystery why hairy panic stalk heaps are not tormenting us this year as much as last year. My theory is that there was more competition this season, so it had less places to happily grow. There are no piles across the roads, nor are there heaps on verandahs. The few small heaps which did appear were quickly and easily removed.

We have yet to have the first frost, so mowing remains a regular activity for most of us to keep grass and lawn height at an acceptable level. The 37 days we had with no rainfall did not seem to slow down grass and weed growth.

The best news of all is that bindiis are beaten at Walla Walla. It is hard to believe that five years ago, we had horrendous thick carpets of bindiis in many parts of our town. There are other weeds which are a nuisance, and need attention, but we can smile a lot when thinking of the demise of bindiis, because of the involvement of a lot of Walla Walla folk.
