Unfortunately, George has since died, but 150 years is amazing for any animal!

## HOLBROOK LANDCARE

**Winter Birds on Farms Survey commences soon:** Birds on Farms is a monitoring program coordinated by BirdLife Australia (BA) and implemented by citizen scientists across Victoria and NSW. It aims to address important conservation questions about bird distribution, population health and habitat use on private rural land. Importantly, the project also engages new landholders in bird identification, appreciation of their behaviour, ecology and habitat use.

Survey Dates 2021:

- **Winter – Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> June to Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> August 2021** *Any participants who would like assistance during the Winter survey period please register and RSVP with a date that suits you, by Friday 11<sup>th</sup> June. As soon as we have these dates and locations, we will attempt to coordinate a local experienced volunteer birdwatcher to support you.*
- Spring – Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> September to Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> November 2021
- Summer – Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> December to Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> January 2022
- Autumn – Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> March to Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> May 2022

**Volunteers welcome!!** If you are an experienced bird watcher and would like to be involved to assist landholders to monitor birds on their property, BirdLife Australia welcomes your contribution!

Birds on Farms collects valuable data on the conservation status and habitat use of birds on private properties across Victoria and NSW and provides landholders with opportunities to obtain a greater appreciation of the species on their land. The volunteer birdwatchers get to be part of this process and get to search for birds in previously 'unexplored' territories (albeit on a property-scale!) Surveys are undertaken quarterly, can be completed within a day, and a range of support materials are provided.

Birds on Farms southern NSW project area extends from Albury to Corowa, Henty to Holbrook and east to Jingellic. We have several landholders who have their properties set up with survey points ready-to-go but require assistance from an experienced volunteer birdwatcher. If you have friends, colleagues or family members that would be potentially interested – or perhaps you are interested in an additional property to visit yourself – please let us know if you would like to assist.

## A SMEAR IN TIME FOR BOWEL CANCER

June is Bowel Cancer Awareness Month and Judy Ross spoke publicly for the first time since her daughter Catherine's death from bowel cancer at the age of 32 years in January 2019.

She was guest speaker at the Rotary Club of Holbrook's dinner meeting on Thursday. Judy and Holbrook Rotarians are keen to raise awareness of this disease, as 99% of bowel cancers can be successfully treated if identified early. The club has provided BowelScan Kits in pharmacies throughout Greater Hume Shire – Holbrook, Henty, Culcairn, Walla Walla, and Jindera during June.

Judy talked about the roller coaster ride of being told you have a terminal illness. "It literally turns your life upside down. You feel like the control of your life has been taken away."

Catherine had been diagnosed with Stage III bowel cancer after a lengthy diagnosis in 2014 aged 28. A colonoscopy showed the tumour may have been there for several years. A sub-total colectomy was followed with six months of chemotherapy, but three months later the cancer had spread to other organs. In late 2015, Catherine underwent a major operation to remove part of the liver, both ovaries, and tumours in the peritoneum, followed by heated intra peritoneal chemotherapy.

Catherine and her partner Jamie decided to go ahead with their wedding set for New Year's Eve 2015 on Judy and Russell's property "Wongalee" – 150 family and guests witnessed a very emotional ceremony on the banks of Billabong Creek.

In mid-2016, Catherine and Jamie moved with their labrador Margaret from Melbourne to 25 acres near Birregurra. Although the secondaries returned chemo continued to keep the cancer under control. She was able to participate in two trials; SIRT (internal radiation) and chimeric antigen receptor therapy trial in 2017 which removed immune blood cells and genetically engineered them to enhance their ability to destroy tumours. Unfortunately, this didn't work for Catherine.

In 2017 Catherine and Jamie decided to be proactive and make a difference as far as awareness programs and raising funds for vital research. They discussed their thoughts with family who came on board. They didn't realise in their wildest dreams when Research4Riney was formed it would become such an incredible charity. Riney was Catherine's nickname and she decided to support three organisations: Bowel Cancer Australia, Peter MacCallum Cancer Foundation, and the Jodi Lee Foundation. Judy said this gave Catherine and Jamie something positive to focus on – they had a purpose, to make a difference.

From cake stalls, garden parties, and movie nights, to

the major event a Gala Dinner and Auction with Billy Brownless as MC raised \$250,000 which was divided amongst the three charities before Catherine's passing. Catherine was presented with a Community Fund Raising Award by Peter Mac, a great honour. Catherine was a face on the Cancer Foundation Australia's 'Never Too Young Campaign'.

Catherine and Jamie chose the Jodi Lee vision because of the fitness side, setting goals to walk and a focus on awareness through their workplace programs.

As a family Judy, Russell, Claire, Alex & Jamie are continuing Catherine's legacy under the R4R banner. For the past 2½ years they have been involved in the trekking to raise funds for the Jodi Lee Foundation.

Judy's first trek in 2017 definitely wasn't a walk in the park. She attempted the 80km track near Castlemaine and it took a long time for her to recover. She started walking the hills behind their property and soon found spots she had never seen before. This was followed by Woolshed Falls Beechworth, Nariel Park Wonga Wetlands, and the Hume and Hovel Track. Judy was prepared for the 2018 Vic trek at Apollo Bay and walked 35kms on the second day. The 2019 Victorian trek at Daylesford was in memory of Catherine. This was 80kms and Judy completed it. The Research4Riney team (over 50 people) raised \$92,708 to continue Catherine's amazing work. Part of these funds came from the Holbrook Community's Don't Drop the Ball on Health fund raiser and Judy felt very proud to present the cheque. Last month Judy participated in the SA trek in the Barossa Valley which followed the Heysen trail.

Recently Catherine and Jamie's much-loved labrador gave birth to 7 puppies. Catherine had been keen to train her labrador to be a therapy assistant dog in hospitals, but this was not to be. Judy and Russell's daughter Claire has taken on the task. She has taken one of the pups called Mabel (she and Judy share her), and is being trained as a therapy dog in the school where she teaches. Mabel is doing well and passing her tests when the therapy dog trainer comes to visit.

## iPad SOCIAL ISOLATION PROJECT

The Holbrook Social Support iPad social isolation project is now drawing to a close. Started in June 2020 the project has run for 12 months providing iPads, internet data and personal support to learn how to use the devices to seniors in our community affected by the Stay-At-Home orders during the initial Covid 19 outbreaks.

Eight iPads were used in the project. Participants learned to use the devices to make face to face calls to family and friends via Facetime, Skype, WhatsApp, etc, play games, do banking and shopping, take photos, watch movies and TV and many more things!

Ruth, our iPad support worker said "Video calls are also a fantastic way to see your children and grandchildren when they live so far away. The iPad has the ability to adapt to many platforms like WhatsApp, Zoom, Skype and Messenger, among others, to allow for video calls, depending what your family members use. The ability to send and receive photos is also an option. Messages or emails can be sent to arrange specific times that suit all family involved, with options to schedule family members on different days, this can help with feelings of isolation and give you something to look forward to. I recall a lady asking me "how much do I owe you?" wanting to know how much the video call cost to a family member that day, as it was much enjoyed. I informed her service is run over the internet and that Meals on Wheels have applied for funding for the cellular network and that her iPad was using this provided service at no cost to her. "

Some of the participants used their iPads to connect to family living interstate and even overseas. In one case after not having seen their relatives face to face for 30 years. One person participating in the project said "I really enjoyed Ruth's visits because I wanted to understand everything we talked about. I learnt not to be afraid of video calls, especially for my wife, speaking to her family overseas." "Ruth is

a very good teacher" he told me.

Participants keep their iPads at the end of the project. The only cost to them ongoing if they do not have NBN internet at home will be the data charges from their mobile internet provider.

While the iPad Social Isolation project has now finished, we are planning 2 other exciting new projects, "Cooking for 1 or 2" and also "Sconversations". Both projects will launch in July/August and will involve small groups coming together. "Cooking For 1 or 2" will be just what it says, a small group cooking sessions learning affordable and simple recipes suitable for 1 or 2 people. We will cook and enjoy a meal together at each session. At the end of each block of sessions participants will have some skills and recipes to be able to cook meals at home. "Sconversations" is a weekly morning tea group set to commence in July. Aimed at people who wish to come together and talk about issues of the day, maybe share a hobby, and enjoy scones and conversations. Sconversations will be held in Holbrook and Culcairn.

# Becoming a Councillor



## Councillors - ordinary people with an extraordinary passion for their community

On Saturday, 4 September 2021, Greater Hume Council will conduct councillor elections to elect nine councillors to serve for a three year term.

A constitutional referendum will also be held for electors to consider whether the Council area should continue to be divided into wards.

### Why stand?

If you care about what happens in your community, want to improve services, make the roads safer or support local businesses, consider becoming a councillor.

By standing for council, you'll have opportunities to:

- help your community
- improve infrastructure
- improve planning and amenities
- build engaged communities.

Being a councillor provides an opportunity to represent your community's views on vital decisions that affect people's daily lives. It is also an opportunity to develop new skills and work with a diverse range of people.

Councillors serve their communities by listening to people in the local area and then representing those views on council.

### What's it take?

To stand for council, you'll need:

- passion, commitment and time
- an interest in your community
- an interest in local government
- to be prepared to learn and be accountable
- being able to talk to people in your community and take account of different views when making decisions
- time management and organisational skills
- problem solving skills
- teamwork skills.

You need to be able to commit time to reading council business papers, attending meetings and representing council at some events. The time you need for this will vary across the year, but it may be 5 to 10 hours each week.

### What you will need to know

If you're thinking about standing for council, you need to know about:

- responsibilities of councillors
- conduct and behaviour
- where to get help.

## What support will you receive?

Once elected, you will receive council-based training and other support to help you understand and be successful in the role.

Greater Hume Council meets expenses and provide tools to help councillors carry out their role. Council also provides support to help councillors who have young family members, a disability or other special needs.

To recognise what councillors do for their community, they receive an annual fee from the council (paid monthly). The annual fee paid to a councillor is \$12,400 per annum. The fee is counted as income for tax purposes.

## How do you stand for election?

To be eligible to stand for election you must:

- be at least 18 years of age and an Australian citizen
- live or own property in Greater Hume Council area
- be on the electoral roll
- not be disqualified from standing from office, e.g. if you have committed certain offences.

A proposal nominating you as a candidate then needs to be submitted by:

- at least two eligible people enrolled for the same ward or area you are being nominated for, or
- a registered officer of a registered political party.

**You must complete some forms and officially lodge them between Monday, 26 July 2021 and 12 noon on 4 August 2021.**



## Information for Candidates

Candidates and groups must register with the NSW Electoral Commission (NSWEC) before accepting political donations or incurring expenditure for an election.

All candidates and groups must appoint an official agent at the time of registration and notify the NSWEC of the agent's appointment.

Registering for an election is a separate process from being nominated as a candidate for an election.

The Electoral Commission NSW provides advice about becoming a candidate and registering to vote in the election.
