

The workshop created an enormous amount of interest from our members and will assist them with the ongoing dung beetle monitoring work being conducted around the district to help researchers identify the seasonal gaps in dung beetle activity.

ANGLICAN NEWS

The N.S.W. Covid Regulations are often being updated and we must know what they are and abide by them. The Anglican Op-shop is **not** a "Critical Service Provider" such as supermarkets, newsagencies, etc, and the Op-shop currently operates under new "Conditions of Entry".

The Condition of Entry requires that customers *must* provide proof of having had TWO Covid-19 vaccinations, or a medical exemption certificate. Inability to provide either of these means that people are not permitted to enter the Op-shop. We ask everyone to respect these requirements as our staff have had to deal with non-compliant people which has been upsetting and made life even more difficult for us.

In the Bible the letter to the Romans in Chapter 13 says; "Respect your government and abide by the laws they make." We may not personally like the decisions the Government makes however, their decisions are made to care for all people, not individuals. Someone was whinging about the rules lately and said they were not going to follow them, "I asked them if they would also drive down the "Right hand side of the highway into oncoming vehicles?" I did not get a reply. There are some rules I do not like however I will do my best to comply with the Government rules and keep myself and others safe.

PLANT PICK PLATE

Wow! Hasn't this year gone quick. As Christmas gifts are already appearing in the shops, it's time to consider suitable presents for loved ones and friends. A

some additional kudos by raising the plants cutting multiple strands below a nodule to create yourself. There is still time to prepare a pot of a beautiful hanging gift. These latter three indoor quick germinating plants.

Lettuce varieties in colours of green, lime, plum and variegated which make a colourful, edible display when grouped with Basil and Chamomile. seeding plants for young clones that have already will be no kudos. Passionate Gardener, June. germinated. Seaside Daisy, Marigolds Calendulas, Parsley and Poppies can be grouped or potted up individually for long lasting floral displays.

Other quick growth propagating methods are to pot up pups or offsets growing on the mother plant. The spherical cacti Echinocerus reproduces this way and being no fuss and low care, are an ideal gift for a novice gardener or child. Chinese Money Plant also produces pups that

emerge from the stem. Harvest these when repotting the mother by cutting a root ball carefully from the main stem. An old favourite, the Spider Plant is the easiest of all to propagate. Simply cut off the pup that hangs from the stem living gift is always welcomed so why not gain and pot up. Reproduce a Chain of Hearts by plants like bright shaded positions and to be kept Sow vegetable seeds now, such as loose leaf moist. Even the humble Strawberry runner pots up into a beautiful edible gift using this method. Take a look around your garden. There is sure to be a plant that you can raise for a Christmas gift. Alternatively, you can look around the base of self If not, there is always a nursery to visit, but there

Pam has played in winning Pennant teams in Grade 4 twice (in 1991 Pam played in the same side as her mother), Grade 2 Pennant in 2018. Pam has been very successful at District level being in winning teams of District Fours claiming 5 titles, and District Open Fours twice, with two of these years reaching State level. Pam has represented the Riverina District in the G n H (which was 6 regions from the north of NSW, played against the south) Also the Ruth Reiher, Towning Shield and Friendly Games. MEALS ON WHEELS AGM & LIFE MEMBERSHIPS

Holbrook Meals on Wheels Service Inc. A.G.M. was held on 27th October at the Holbrook Library meeting room. This year we welcomed 28 visitors to the meeting. President, Ian Harpley, gave his annual report, announcing after 12 years as President, it would be his last report. Ian is remaining as a member of the board. Treasurer Bob Langford reported a healthy year for the service with another good result. Bob has also stood down from the Treasurer's position after 12 years and is also remaining as a board member.

Life memberships were awarded to both Ian and Bob for 14 years of dedicated service to the board, including 12 years in an executive position. lan and Bob saw our service through many changes and major growth. When Bob & Ian took their positions, our service provided Meals on Wheels in Holbrook and that was all. They have overseen the expansion of the service to include Walla, Culcairn and as far as Jindera, the introduction of Social Support services, brokering agreements with other Aged Care providers to provide services on their behalf as well as many other projects such as the iPad project. When Bob and Ian joined the board, our service had 1 employee. We now have six, soon to be seven, part-time and casual employees providing services and support to people who use our services.

Presentations were also made to two other long time board members who have stood down from the board this year. Gai Langford, previous Secretary, who has been on the board since 2008 and Jill Winnett, already a Life Member, for 51 years of continuous service on the Meals on Wheels board.

Two new and very skilled people have joined our board; Monica Montague brings her Aged Care expertise to the board and Milt Golenberg brings his financial skills as our new Treasurer.

Manager, Sue reported that there was another increase in meal delivery during the emergency period and our service delivered 13310 meals during the past financial year. An increase of just under 1000 meals for the year and over 3000 more than we are contracted by the Commonwealth Government to provide! We also delivered 2794 hours of social support to the

communities we service.

Sue thanked our volunteers, staff and our generous sponsors and supporters; Riverina Water (have you seen our fantastic automatic door!), Holbrook Bakery, Holbrook RS Club, Casella Winery, Holbrook Stores & Holbrook Paddock eggs for their support throughout the year. Thanks to these supporters people who use our services receive a complete meal package and all those little extras for special occasions. THANK YOU!!

At this stage we are planning to host **our Annual Christmas party** this year. Fingers crossed we are able to do so. The event will be Covid Safe and will require people attending to be double vaccinated for Covid-19 and enter using the QR code available.

There will be some challenges in the future as the Aged Care Reforms begin to change the landscape and the way services are provided, assessed and funded. We are confident with the mix of expertise on our board we will be able to negotiate our way through the reforms and emerge with an even better service at the other end.




