ROTARY PROVIDES HEART STARTER FOR HOLBROOK

Rotarians Scott Beattie and Milt Golenberg installed the defibrillator machine at the Holbrook Ampol Service Centre on Friday November 12.

The Holbrook Rotary Club received a \$1 for \$1 grant from Rotary District 9790 to purchase the defibrillator. Scott as Community Service Director identified the right type of defibrillator for our purpose — it has audio and visual cues regarding its operation. On opening the unit, an alarm will sound for a short period and then clear, simple instructions assist with its use.

Club treasurer Milt Golenberg said the defibrillator was located at the Ampol Service Centre (former

Caltex) because it is the only business open 24/7.

"Our Rotary club is responsible for the upkeep of the machine including batteries which will be purchased and installed each Melbourne Cup Day," Scott said.

FIRE RECOVERY IN LANDSCAPE BUT NO INVENTORY OF SPECIES

Landcare's Kylie Durant suggested to local Rotarians that we live in an amazing part of Australia – beautiful landscapes, forests, wildflowers, and fauna and it's all at our doorstep.

Kylie mixed business with pleasure when she took off by bicycle to take-a- look at the bushfire landscapes and how much they had recovered in the Upper Murray.

She described it as a big bush trip, 250kms over 6 days through Woomargama National Forest trails, River Road, McPherson Plains, Tooma River Gorge, Powerline Road, and Black-Jack, where a lot of the Upper Murray streams begin.



Kylie witnessed alpine landscapes where hot fires have been too frequent and not much seed left so undergrowth but not a lot of trees. Then there were amazing areas of recovery – Woomargama National Forest, Mountain Creek Road, River Road: "recovery beautiful, wildflowers amazing," she said.

She talked about the impact of fires on arboreal mammals – the Greater Gliders; as well as Rednecked wallabies and the Swamp wallabies; the Macquarie perch at Mannus (still there but low in numbers) and the Gang-gang cockatoos that appeared to have moved further down in search of habitat and food.

There were no brumbies and no past inventories on the impact of fire on species, so we don't really understand what has been lost. The good news is that Holbrook Landcare received a \$500K grant to help landholders with wildlife habitat recovery.

Our annual Christmas Raffle has kicked off with tickets being sold last Saturday. We will be at



My saving grace is that this new cultivar of Hydrangea is frost tolerant and will withstand warm temperatures and morning sun.



LEST WE FORGET – PRIVATE JOHN M. CARRINGTON

Private John "Jack" Carrington was born in December 1900, the fourth son born to Henry and Annie Carrington. Eager to join his two brothers Douglas and Gordon who were serving overseas, and to fight beside his fellow countrymen, Jack enlisted in the Australian Imperial Force in mid 1916 by putting up his age. He passed recruiters although he was only fifteen at the time. Jack embarked in November 1916 destined for France to join the 3rd Australian Infantry Battalion who had arrived earlier that year. For over two years the battalion took part in operations throughout regions in France and Belgium.

On the 23rd August 1918 Jack was killed while going up from support trenches to the front lines. The stretcher bearer who came to his aid, a friend of Jack's stated that he had died from a concussion due to the forceful blast of a shell that had exploded close by. He was not killed instantly. A witness claimed he was unconscious until he passed away. Private John Carrington was only seventeen. He is buried in Heath Cemetery in France with the epitaph that was given to all three of the Carrington sons lost to the First World War: Just Safe In God's Home Port He Is Not Dead. By JRM
