'Cold humanity is our concern, people caring about other people.'
There are millions of people in the world suffering extreme cold. In 1992 Wrap with Love began with the idea to help as many people as

possible by providing warm Wraps to ward off hypothermia and in the past 23 years have sent more than 400,000 Wraps to people in over 75 countries, including Australia, with the help of hardworking and generous volunteers.

Most of us can knit and sew. Just one square provides one twenty-eighth of warmth, and collectively, twenty-eight assembled squares create one whole warm and sheltering Wrap.

A Wrap With Love personal wrap comprises 28 squares, 25 cm x 25 cm (10 inches x 10 inches) sewn together in 4 rows by 7 rows to size 100cm x 175cm (40 inches x 70 inches) completed. A Wrap can be knitted, crocheted, machine knitted or woven, with wool, acrylic or lined patchwork.

A 25 cm (10 inch) square uses approximately 50g of 8 ply wool.

Finished wraps, squares and yarn are sent to us by our craftworkers and community helpers from all over Australia.

Some people just knit the squares, some knit and sew together and some just sew together, so drop off whatever you do to us and we can complete the Wraps.

This August the Wrap with Love group in Culcairn will be receiving your donations of knitting and crochet. Squares or completed wraps can be left at the Holbrook Library.





LEAPING LOG ENDURO

This years Holbrook Motorcycle Sports Club Leaping Log Enduro took place at Col and Cassie Bickley's "The Pines" on April 15th.



A terrific field saw the best roll up of Seniors the series has seen in many years.

Enduros are extraordinarily fun and challenging. Even if your results are so-so, just finishing in one piece is incredibly rewarding.

Sometimes referred to as "Cross Country" or XC, hare scrambles are raced on natural terrain and the track at the Bickley's can certainly be a challenge. The terrain includes rocks, roots, water crossings, mud and steep hills. Racers start on rows based on the class they are racing in. Each row goes off in intervals, starting with the most advanced groups to reduce passing as much as possible, since courses include narrow woods trails. Dead-engine starts with the riders standing in front of their bikes holding the bars and where your bike must be turned off and started only when the flagman raises the green flag. Racers will typically race between two and a half and four hours, getting as many laps in as possible, as fast as they can. Racers with the most laps and shortest elapsed time win.

The track had been expertly laid out by the Jones mob who have had many years of experience.

Overnight and a huge downpour saw rivers form on the tracks from the day before. But a group of hardy souls fronted up for the Ride Park Day on Sunday. They had a great morning with access to the previous day racing tracks and a trail ride thrown in as a bonus.

Thank you to the local Holbrook Fire Brigade for catering and to the Wagga VRA for first aid support. Also to our sweep riders who took care of the riders throughout the day.

PLANT PICK PLATE

Prior to the onset of Winter, gardeners should prepare their patch for the cold change of the next season. There are many tasks to undertake in the home garden, from tidying up



to encouraging consistent growth of the winter plantings. I have prepared my productive garden as much as I can at this stage by undertaking the following jobs:

- ⇒ Frost covers to be placed over sensitive plants, especially young citrus as "Jack" is not far away.
- ⇒ Mulch all plants, especially seedlings to retain soil warmth, encourage growth and reduce weeds.
- ⇒ Be vigilant in controlling snails and slugs. A night patrol with a torch works well.
- ⇒ Regularly inspect citrus and roses for sap sucking insects leaf miner, aphids and thrip. Spray Citrus with white oil and roses with pyrethrum.
- ⇒ Continue to water potted plants that have been placed under eaves and verandahs and those with large canopies preventing rain reaching the roots.
- ⇒ Rake up fallen leaves to add in your compost bins for a nutritious friable material ready for spring applications.
- ⇒ Once leaves have fallen on deciduous trees prune to required height, remove crossover and damaged branches while they are bare and visible.
- ⇒ Take cuttings of your favourite perennial plants to extend your garden supply or to give away. Place in a warm environment until roots are established.
- ⇒ Fertilise all plants that are currently in production, whether it be vegetables, fruits or flowers on a regular basis throughout their productive period.

Much of my garden is becoming dormant and going to sleep, however there is still life and production. I enjoy taking a garden walk to observe and react to the changes the next season brings.

Electric Blankets

Test before use. If there are any abnormalities or hot spots they should be replaced.

Wheat Bags
