The Annual Murrumbidgee Local Health District Excellence Awards were presented recently and two much admired Holbrook local community members were amongst the Finalists. Joanne Casey, a central figure at the Harry Jarvis Wing for over 30 years, was a finalist in the Staff Member of the Year and Judy Wettenhall in the category of Volunteer of the Year, for her commitment and work on the Holbrook Local Health Advisory Committee (LHAC).

Jo, as she is warmly known, was recognised for her years of service caring and advocating for the Harry Jarvis Wing residents, supporting and collating much of the accreditation work required at the MPS and supporting and helping orientate the many new staff members that come to the Holbrook Facility. This dedicated work along with her wonderful ability to lift the spirits of residents and staff alike celebrating any occasion with fun and flair (usually in fancy dress) make her a most valued member of staff.

Judy has quietly given 17 years as a volunteer to the Holbrook LHAC committee (16 years as Chair) supporting Health Services in the district. This included working with council to secure doctor services for Holbrook, and then advocating for training programs to qualify these new doctors so they can work at the hospital. She was steadfast in securing funding to build and then fund new rooms and beds at the Harry Jarvis Wing. She also had a large role to play in organising forums on 'Ageing with Grace' (on aged care services) and supporting High School programs in resilience.

They both attended the awards dinner held in Wagga Wagga on June 16th with close friends and family. It is a testament to their commitment to the district health services that they were recognised in the small group that made up the Finalists for these awards.

Up until the rain recently there were a lot of carp getting about in the Upper Billabong and we know the Ten Mile Ck went quite murky as they worked their way upstream. What happened to the Carp virus they were all talking about, I hear you say? Well thanks to Finterest we can get an update.

As part of Refreshing the Upper Billabong Waterway Management Plan there is an action to investigate ways to reduce carp numbers in our waterways. As the Upper Billabong is unregulated (no dams or weirs) there are no specific points at which control such as carp cages or anti-carp structures could be effectively placed. We are relying on direct removal or something like the virus to do this job. It could be a great time to get out with the fishing rod and do a bit of removal yourselves!

PLANT PICK PLATE

Whilst flicking through a magazine, turning the next page my eyes popped, my mouth



watered and my taste buds exploded in anticipation. "WORLD CHOCOLATE DAY – 7th JULY". No, I was not reading a food magazine, rather a gardening article highlighting the introduction to Europe from South America of chocolate in 1550. A celebration of the Cacao plant (*Theobroma cacao*) from which the ripe beans within the pods are harvested to create luscious chocolate.

My enthusiasm was somewhat deflated when I read further. The Cacao plant only grows in the tropics so the authors story was to encourage gardeners to plant something that was chocolate related, either in name or colour to celebrate this unique day. What! No chocolate indulgence!

Once my emotions calmed, I focused on the tropical plants which I have growing indoors. These require a little more TLC especially during the cooler months to maintain a moist tropical atmosphere as heaters can have a detrimental effect causing leaf edges to turn brown. Grouping plants together over saucers filled with pebbles and water can rectify this in addition to regularly water misting over the whole plant to increase humidity. Move plants away from heaters, draughts and direct sun then test the moisture level of the soil and water only when needed. Do not to allow the roots to sit in the draining water. My Umbrella plant (*Schefflera*) has been infested by mealy bugs in the past so I regularly inspect the underside of the large leaves for these sap sucking insects which secrete a sticky sugary substance which in turn can attract black sooty mould and ants. A soapy cloth wipes away the bugs and the dust leaving glossy leaves.

After pampering my indoor plants, come 7th July I will celebrate with a luscious chocolate indulgence.

Recently, seven members of the Holbrook OM-NI Group had the privilege of seeing pre-WW2 aircraft engines assembled and how they were made.

We visited the Bunn Brothers workshops and hangar at Bungowannah on Friday 9th June. Four cylinder and six cylinder inline engines were before our eyes. Some parts are still available worldwide in Australia, Great Britain and North America. The engines were made by De Havilland and Lycoming before and after World War 2.

After morning tea we saw rare vintage aircraft in the hangar and the work is involved in re-building and restoring aircraft. The intricate makings of wooden and fabric aircraft wings and fuselages was also shown, explaining exactly what is involved in the work. A fascinating few hours thoroughly enjoyed by all our members.

Afterwards, we enjoyed lunch at the Jindera Hotel and then spent time at the Old Wagners Shop – the Jindera Museum - before heading home. It was a great day out for our members.

Halve Waste Cloth Nappy Rebate 2023

WILDLIFE STORYTELLER

Rotary Club President, Murray Jones, welcomed guest speaker Peter Rowland, a wildlife writer and photographer, working at



Holbrook Landcare, to our weekly dinner meeting. Peter feels a strong connection to oceans and recalls a passage from “Jonathon Livingston Seagull” -

“Overcome space and all we have left is Here. Overcome time and all we have left is Now.”

Peter was born in Australia to a Canadian mum and an English dad. At 18 months, the family returned to the UK – the gift of his childhood was living close to oceans, woods and country lanes in southern England.

His Canadian great grandfather’s slide collection, found in a cedar box, opened up the magic world of photography in general and birds in particular for Peter. Returning to Australia aged 15, and thinking about a career, there weren’t many openings as wildlife presenters or rangers. At 16, he started work in the bird department at the Australian Museum surrounded by stuffed animals, bird and animal records from the early settler days and onwards; and stayed there for 20 years.

Realising he wanted to focus on wildlife and birds in a more active way, he met Tim Flannery, a well known science communicator, paleontologist, author, conservationist and activist. Peter changed direction, and worked on the bird specimens that Tim collected in New Guinea, discovering new species along the way, and writing his findings in scientific publications.

“This got me interested in writing 15 books on Australian wild-life and the photography that went with that,” Peter said.

Peter showed us amazing photos of ocean birds, Australian bush birds, bird watching, birdlife in New Guinea, and wildlife in Japan.

POLOCROSSE SEASON IN ACTION

Albury-Holbrook Polocrosse Club has been very busy since the start of the 2023 season back in March.
