

HOLBROOK LANDCARE

Holbrook Drought Preparedness Community Planning Workshop: HLN has secured individual funds for two events. This will be the first of the two (taking place this year), and the second to be held next year, with details to follow.

With the forecasted El Nino event in mind, this event will bring our community together to discuss ways for us to cope with the potential impacts this drought period will bring, build our resilience and support one another through times of hardship. So that, when the next drought hits:

- everyone knows what the vulnerabilities are within the community

- roles within community

- how groups can work together and with what resources to support community, and

- build stronger, better working relationships with Greater Hume Council

Leaders from across whole of community will be invited to be part of a facilitated workshop designed to set a pathway for future drought preparedness for Holbrook and surrounds. This will be dovetailed in with a dinner showcasing local provenance and ethically produced foods cooked by signature chefs.

National Soil Judging Competition - Darwin

Nick McGrath was back in his old stomping ground of the Top End Tropical Savanna late last month for the 11th Annual National Soil Judging Competition in Darwin.

Nick was a judge for the competition, which involved 70 university students and early career scientists from around Australia and New Zealand. They were competing against each other to describe and classify soils in several soil pits.

The participants spent 2 days practising in soil pits located on the outskirts of Darwin, fine tuning their skills in a range of Top End soils.

The competition day itself, was held on a Jackfruit



and Durian plantation at Humpty Doo, and the overall winner was Team Victoria (University of Melbourne and Monash University).

BOWEL CANCER TEST KITS

Are you filing your Bowel Cancer test kits in the rubbish bin or drawer? If you are, you need to stop and think. Recent surveys in our Local council area and Local Medical District show that the Murrumbidgee region, and even more importantly, the Greater



Hume Council area have a higher incidence of Bowel Cancer then the rest of the NSW population.

Any changes to normal habits should be investigated as bowel cancer can strike at any age. More and more younger (fit and healthy) people are being diagnosed with Bowel Cancer.

Bowel Cancer kits and testing are free for those aged 50 to 74 and early detection can mean the difference between successful treatment and possible long-term consequences. Kits should arrive in the mail every two years but are also available to these individuals through National Cancer Screening Register on ph 1800 627 701. Soon some testing kits will also be made available at the Holbrook Pharmacy, if you feel you would benefit from a test please drop in and pick one up.

Bowel screening is important as bowel cancer often develops without any symptoms. The cancer can grow in the bowel for years before then spreading to other parts of the body. It is important to listen to your body, be aware of changes and seek medical advice as soon as possible.

Advance Care Planning Australia

BE OPEN | BE READY | BE HEARD

Advance care planning is an important part of planning for future medical care, particularly for people who are older, have a chronic health condition, early cognitive impairment, or a life limiting illness. You may be caring for someone in one of these situations, or you may be in one of these situations yourself.

Starting the conversation about advance care planning is an important first step in ensuring a

person's preferences for future care are known and respected. Having an advance care directive ensures a person's health care preferences are known and respected when or if the time comes.

Discussions are best held when the person is healthy, formalising decisions before there is an urgent need or an emergency. It is a good idea to discuss one's wishes with a doctor as well as close friends and relatives. Knowing the person's wishes will help them if there is a need to make decisions on that person's behalf in the future.

What does advance care planning involve?

There are two parts to advance care planning: 1. Appointing an Enduring Guardian

An Enduring Guardian is appointed by a person to manage their future health care if they are no longer able to make decisions. For more information go to the Advance Care Planning Australia or the NSW trustee and Guardian websites.

2. Completing an Advance Care Directive

An Advance Care Directive records a person's specific preferences for future health care. This includes treatments they would accept or refuse if they had a life-threatening illness or injury.

An Advance Care Directive will only be used if the person does not have capacity to make decisions or to communicate their preferences.

There is no official format in which an Advanced Care Directive needs to be written. A typed or handwritten letter is acceptable but there are also forms that can be accessed on the Advance Care Planning Australia website or at your local GP practice.

Where to store your Advance Care Directive There is also no official place to register an Advance Care Directive in NSW. However, it is important that carers and other family members have quick access to it if required. Advance Care Directives can be stored in paper or electronic format by:

* Uploading it onto a My Health Record

* Including it in a will

* Giving a copy to a GP or treatment team

'The Advance Care Planning Australia' website (www.advancecareplanning.org.au) provides a range of resources and information for individuals, family, friends, carers and for health care professionals about advance care planning. On their website you will find specific resources for people living in NSW.

'CareSearch' provides easy to understand information on planning for the future when living with a serious illness. Connecting patients, carers and their families with trustworthy resources, their website includes information on Advance Care Planning, Wills and funerals.

Although these conversations are not easy to have, it is very important to plan into the future and record your wishes, and those of your loved ones, for times when significant medical decisions may need to be made.

JULY IN THE GARDEN

Maintenance Tasks: July is a good time to get out into the fresh air. Don't be scared about pruning back roses, they like a good cut back. And



when you've finished pruning them, give them a spray with lime sulphur.

Now is also the time to prune deciduous trees, including fruit trees. This not only promotes growth but pruning keeps the trees in good shape too.

July is the perfect time to feed citrus. Spray them with white oil to control the nymphal stage of bronze orange bugs and mites.

Don't forget to mulch your garden or vegetable beds. This will help prevent weeds and will feed the soil as it breaks down.

Planting: It's the perfect time to plant deciduous fruit trees while they are bare-rooted. There's a huge variety to choose from.

Fruit trees are a great asset in the garden because they provide beautiful, luscious fruit. And they have the added bonus of pretty, showy blossoms in spring, and coloured leaves in autumn. Some fruit trees are self-fertile, which means they produce fruit even if growing on their own. Peach and nectarines are good examples. Generally, others such as apples, pears and Japanese plums need more than one tree for cross-pollination to ensure they yield. When you're buying your fruit trees, get some in-store advice about this as well as the best trees to grow in your area. Plant your fruit trees in a sunny spot. Always dig a hole larger than the roots and add plenty of compost in the hole and surrounds at planting time. Also, stake your tree for support and protection against the wind.




