A flower stall and plant sale is held once a year. There are 28 local volunteers who work various shifts between 10.00am – 3.00pm Mon – Fri and 10.00am – noon on Saturday.



PLANT PICK PLATE

I am of the opinion that we have all had enough of the cold and wet winter we are still experiencing,



but I can see changes for the better. As I do my garden walk I am observing that Mother Nature is signaling an early spring.

Always early to bud, my ornamental weeping apricot has budded earlier than in past years and is now in full flower displaying a mass of pink blooms. This coincides with the early yellow gold blooms of the Acacia wattles along the roadsides which give me a pick up knowing we are moving into spring. My raspberry plants also felt the need to sprout, poking their leafy noses out then discovering it was too cold and retreated. The insects have also been fooled. I found one lonely hoverfly in my productive garden. Maybe he was a scout, fooled by the sunshine and testing the temperature then also retreating.

Discovering these early signs, I have commenced the planning of my spring crops. Raised garden beds have been installed in the wet areas of my garden. This fully utilises this area and will increase production. Seeds have been ordered and received, some are different varieties of vegetables I want to experiment with but I will still plant my favourite true and tested very productive varieties.

The "Kakai" pumpkin is grown for its seeds not flesh which when mature I will dry and store my own pepitas. Zucchini "Black Beauty" is a more compact plant with smaller fruit and beetroot "Mini Gourmet" is as its name suggests a smaller quick growing beet. I have also selected a seed collection of sprouts and shoots (mung beans, alfalfa, broccoli and pea shoots) to grow in a jar. I am just now awaiting the sunshine. Passionate Gardener. June.


HOSPITAL AUXILIARY


HOLBROOK PUBLIC SCHOOL




the Holbrook Library. The children loved these experiences as they got to
