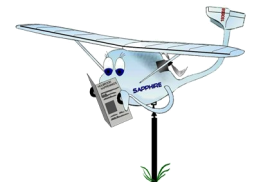

Experience: HLN had the opportunity to give one of our members a complimentary ticket to the "Thriving Women Conference" in Wagga on August 14 & 15. We were delighted to receive interest from so many of our members and, after reviewing them all, Melinda McCrohon was selected as the recipient.

Melinda had a great time at the conference, attending the talks given by the various keynote speakers and other presenters, and networking with other attendees. Melinda kindly sent through the following summary of her experience:

"The Thriving Women's Conference held in Wagga Wagga was a remarkable tapestry of empowerment, weaving together the strength of women connected through agriculture. Against the backdrop of green and gold (not just canola, but those captivated by the black and white ball), women from diverse walks of life came together, forging bonds that mirrored the resilience of the land they nurtured.

The event commenced with an inspiring Welcome to Country by Auntie Cheryl Perith OAM, acknowledging the deep connection between women, land, and culture. Her presence evoked a sense of unity, bridging the past, present and encouraging our futures together.

The conference's keynote speakers, Leigh Sales AM and Olympia Yarger added their distinct threads to the narrative. Leigh's eloquent discourse on overcoming challenges resonated deeply, reminding everyone that strength arises not from avoiding adversity, but from facing it

head-on. Olympia recounted her wild journey developing her own business based on solving waste issues using sustainable practices. She emphasized the importance of sharing your vision with those who work alongside you. Nurturing your staff and supporting them to realise, not only your dream but theirs too.

As the conference unfolded, it became evident that the energy was not confined to the venue; it reverberated across our diverse landscape. The event captured the extraordinary power of unity and the infinite potential that sprouts when women connected through agriculture come together to share, uplift, and flourish."

She comes to us with a Landcare background and has been working as a Local Landcare Coordinator, Community Support Officer, and Project Officer for the past 8 years in the Murray Region. Prior to this, Judy worked in natural resource management and community engagement, she is also the co-founder and coordinator for the local Woomargama National Park Volunteer Group.

A total of 9 Landcare and producer groups across the Murray region, with HLN as the lead, will work together to deliver a range of projects, events, initiatives, training, capability building and small-scale community infrastructure projects to assist local people prepare for future droughts. Our partner organisations are Corowa District Landcare, Yanco Creek and Tributaries Advisory Council (YACTAC), Ricegrowers' Association of Australia, Western Murray Land Improvement Group, Southern Growers, West Hume Landcare, Riverine Plains and Hay Trees on the Plains Landcare.

Judy will be engaging with key stakeholders to support the delivery of the FRRR projects in line with the community's preparedness priorities.

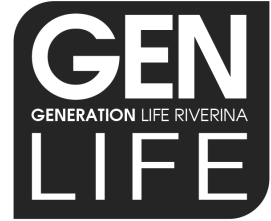

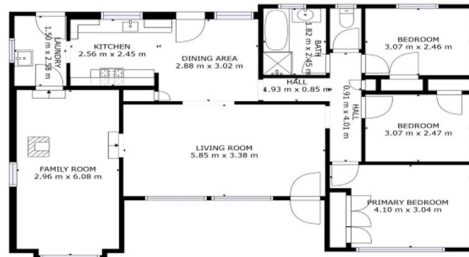
