UPGRADE OF LOCUM ACCOMMODATION AT HOLBROOK MPS

We have been working really hard behind the scenes to improve our on-site nursing/locum accommodation. The project to develop the current accommodation internally into three self-contained units is now underway. Our Team at the hospital, with the support of our LHAC (Local Health Advisory Committee), have been very concerned to improve the accommodation for our agency nursing, locum staff and students.



Having good quality on-site staff accommodation is vital for the running of our health service. This short-term accommodation will enable agency and new staff to live in a comfortable, home-like environment while they integrate into a new community. In doing this we aim to retain all our staff and therefore support the day to day running of our local health service. HOLBROOK MOTORCYCLE SPORT'S CLUB DEREK RIDE 2023

Derek Lewington has been a valued member of the HMCS for many years. Involved in everything from track prep, officiating, trophy making, admin, racing, attendance at meetings, and interclub affairs.

On Sunday the 30th of June 2019, enthusiastic motorcycle rider Derek Lewington had an accident resulting in a serious spinal cord injury that would rock an entire community of Uranquinty and his family like nobody could have expected. Derek and Skye, his wife, found themselves 600km from their kids, home, family, and friends.

Derek is a father of three young kids, he adores his wife and has a loving extended family and is everybody's mate. As a fourth-generation farmer, Derek is meticulous about the holistic management of their property. His passion for farming is matched by his adventurous nature and love of traveling whether it is the Victorian High Country or the Simpson Desert. Always the first one to put his hand up or offer support, the first one to get there and the last one to leave.

Originally, HMCS ran the "Derek Ride" to assist in immediate financial assistance for the family and support adjustments needed to allow Derek to live comfortably in their home upon his return from

hospital. In true Derek fashion - once he had all he needed to get by, Derek requested that all proceeds be donated to the Charity "Angel Flight". This ride has now been running since 2019."

When Derek needed to return home it was by Air Ambulance. When they are busy, they subcontract out the flights. Derek got to talk to the pilot who owns and flies his own plane

Angel Flight was started so rural/remote patients could get to medical appointments in the city and save sick people sometimes having to drive for thousands of kilometres and with no government assistance it was not a hard decision for Derek to pick a charity to support

The 2023 ride started from the Rosewood Sports Club. After 20/30ml of rain on Wednesday and top of 20' C riding conditions were perfect.

Ben Jones headed off with his group of riders and Mark Jones sweep. Murray led out a separate group of riders with Don Belling sweeping. A mix of trails and tracks in the morning saw us at lunch amongst the forest at Carabost where Lou Lewington and Debbie had a huge spread set up with drinks and nibbles aplenty. After lunch, each group rode in the opposite direction. Ben's group threw in some extra tracks as a bonus.

Rosewood Club provided a delicious roast pork dinner and dessert that night and then it was raffle time. PLANTING PROGRESS WITH THE PUB PANEL

Holbrook Landcare hosted a dynamic event at the Holbrook Hotel on Wednesday, the 27th, which brought together a diverse group of individuals for an evening filled with cold drinks, stimulating conversations, and a focus on agricultural careers. Organized by Jess Armstrong and her team, the event featured a Pub Panel discussion that delved into the world of Hay Inc., Rural Education Program, and Ag Career Start, shedding light on the factors affecting farm businesses in their efforts to attract and retain farm staff.

The evening began with a brief presentation by Daniel Brear, the NSW Farmers Region Services Manager, who shared insights from recent events like the NSW Bale Up Conference and the Henty Field Days. One key takeaway was the shared concerns among producers in the room, highlighting common challenges faced by rural communities in New South Wales. Accommodation for on-farm workers emerged as a significant issue impacting the ability of farm businesses to retain employees.

The panel discussion, led by Jess, aimed to showcase the various programs available and how producers could leverage them to support their existing staff or tap into a fresh pool of young talent. Hay Inc.'s Sandra Ireson and AgCareerstart's Kayla Evans introduced valuable programs for local producers, though it's important to note that these programs may not fit every farm's needs. Nevertheless, understanding the opportunities they offer can be immensely beneficial to anyone in the agriculture industry.

Key takeaways included the importance of offering variety in farm roles, providing quality accommodation and competitive compensation, offering incentives for staff, and emphasizing effective communication for staff retention.

This event served as an excellent platform for discussing critical issues in the agriculture industry, with a particular focus on attracting and retaining farm staff. The insights from the panel discussion provide valuable guidance for farm businesses seeking to thrive and create an engaging work environment. The organizers expressed their gratitude to Daniel, Sandra, Kayla, the attendees, and the Holbrook Hotel for making the event a success.

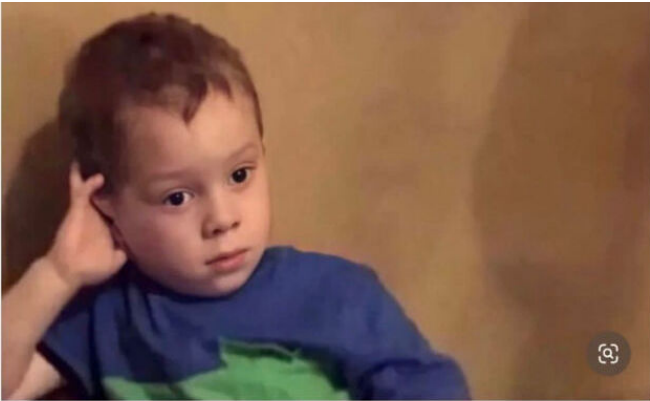

Early in 2021 the Albury City Council together with Greater Hume Council were successful in obtaining a grant to enhance the digitisation of collections of eight of the public museums in our region.

The project involved the engagement of a Digitisation Project Officer for 18 months, purchase of digitisation equipment, training of staff and volunteers from museums and the digitisation of a number of significant items from each collection.

The Woolpack Inn Museum participated in this project and I am now pleased to report that digitisation of 45 of our more significant items has been completed. Each of the items was photographed and descriptions and stories relating to their history and condition were written. PLANT PICK PLATE

Cyclamen would have to be one of the most fickle of shade loving plants. Grown indoor or out they require a mostly shaded position with plenty of natural light, however some growers suggest one or two hours of early morning sun can be beneficial. This beautiful plant will not tolerate over watering so water thoroughly then not until the soil has dried out to avoid the corm rotting and the plant dying. The Cyclamen is a winter/early spring flowering perennial providing a welcome display of glorious upright flowers in shades of white, pink, mauve, magenta and red. The marbled, deep green to purple heart shaped foliage, some with silver tones, are equally eye-catching.

Having noted these care requirements, my mother, who has never been a gardener or claims to have a green thumb, managed to grow a healthy potted Cyclamen indoors. I suspect it survived on total neglect as I have not had the same success, in my case, too much tender loving care possibly.

But a friend has found the right light position and has mastered the care of her many potted Cyclamens. Under her south facing verandah, these healthy large plants with full upright flowers tower over the decorative leaves underneath. As you walk through the gate all the vibrant floral colours and

foliage patterns that Cyclamens are renowned for are both eye-catching and breathtaking. I am so envious.

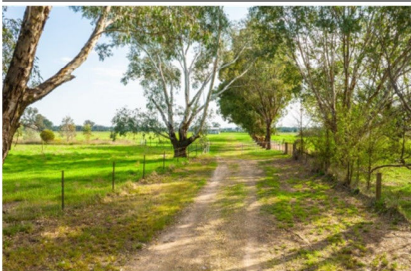
