### Update on Refreshing Rivers - Upper Billabong

in the past few months we have been preparing for the delivery of actions indicated in the Waterway Management Plan. The main priorities for the next 12 months are:

- Southern Pygmy Perch population survey to see how they are faring
- Implementing refuge pool protection in the Southern Pygmy Perch streams
- Helping landholders with Natural Capital Profiles
- Continuing to help farmers plan and implement works on waterways

The idea of a Natural Capital Profile is to help farmers navigate this new world of environmental market opportunities & understand their baseline assets, including the waterways and their condition. It will help with recognising the work that has been done already, give some basic statistics on vegetation and environmental practice, and identify potential actions. These things can help with your own farm reporting and baselining that is increasingly coming down the supply chains at you.

Our pilot program identified the needs and wants of farmers and Refreshing Rivers is giving us the tools to continue with these profiles. We are also always working on leveraging funds to help implement actions where we can. Interested? – ring Kylie 0418 198 522 to get on the list.

### WHAT IS ADVANCE CARE PLANNING?

An Advanced Care Plan records your wishes at a time when you may not be able to voice your care choices. It is an incredibly important document that eases the burden on family and health carers at a difficult time.

*Recording your choices.* In NSW, there are two ways you can record your choices for future medical care:

Appoint an enduring guardian Complete an Advance Care Directive

1. Enduring guardian. When you appoint an enduring guardian, you are choosing a trusted relative or friend to manage your health care. The person you appoint becomes your substitute decision-maker if you are no longer able to make decisions. You may want to appoint one or more adults to this role. To do this, you need to complete the Advanced Care Plan form. Download an Advanced Care Plan Form on the NSW Trustee and Guardian website www.tag.nsw.gov.au Just click on the Guardianship tab.

2. Advance Care Directive records your specific preferences for future health care. This includes treatments you would accept or refuse if you had a life-threatening illness or injury. This will only be used if you do not have the capacity to make decisions for vourself or to communicate vour preferences. In NSW you do not need to use a specific form to record your choices for future medical care. If you choose, you can create an Advance Care Directive simply by writing down your preferences in a structured way, signing and dating it. However, the NSW government has created an Advanced Care Directive form that can make the process easier. You will find it on the NSW Health website www.health.nsw.gov.au Type Advanced Health Care Directive into the search bar to find a link to all the information you will need. If a person is no longer able to make or communicate their decisions, a family member or healthcare professional can document medical treatment preferences on a person's behalf. Speak to Hospital staff if this is the case-
