OLIVER KILLALEA - 100 YEARS YOUNG


On Saturday 10 February family and friends gathered in Holbrook to help Oliver Killalea celebrate his 100th birthday.

Oliver was born in Wagga and enlisted in the Army from 1942 to 1947 and served in Papua New Guinea (1 year), Bougainville (1 year), Morotai (6 mths), Japan (1 year) and Australia (16 mths). During this period he served with the 47th Battalion, 67th Battalion, 3rd Battalion, 2/1 General Regiment and on several other small assignments.

He moved to the Holbrook district in 1959 and spent the first 10 years at Lankeys Creek, before moving to Annandayle and finally Killandayle, where he has lived for the past 45 years.

Oliver has always been heavily involved in his local community. He is a Life member and Patron of the Holbrook Show Society, was on the Agricultural Societies Council (ASC) for 4 years, President of the Australian Poll Dorset Society and Captain of 3 different Bush Fire Brigades (Lankeys Creek, four Mile and Wantagong), in addition to being a member of the Country Fire Authority (CFA) for 74 years.

He is still keeping himself active, drives himself to attend luncheons and attend "Old Men's" meetings, while enjoying his retirement living happily on his farm. Oliver believes that some of the benefits to living in the Holbrook district include the medical support, access to a local hospital, Meals on Wheels and the Returned Services League.

Update on the Refreshing Rivers project: As part of Refreshing Rivers, we have been on the monthly water quality monitoring run on creeks around the Upper Billabong so we can get some idea of what the range of water quality is like. There are only 2 gauges in our catchment so very little data. Last week Kylie and Jo also took eDNA samples to get a snapshot across the catchment of what might be living in the creeks - with lower water levels - hopefully easy to detect and maybe even uncover the Platypus' secret hiding place! We are still interested in hearing any sightings or info - call Kylie 0418 198 522. This monitoring is supported by the NSW Government's Environmental Trust in partnership with Murray Local Land Services

PLANT PICK PLATE

Productive gardens are in full swing at this time of the year. Apples and summer citrus require harvesting, tomatoes are ripening on a daily basis while sweet corn, cucumbers and pumpkins have plumped up and are maturing. The quick growing vegetables such as spring onions, lettuce and radish provide light summer salads. All this delectable bounty available for our plate is also attracting a variety of bugs into our gardens.

An array of insects, whether it be flying, crawling, sucking, wriggling or chewing will devour ripening produce in no time at all. Some of these bugs are in my garden which subsequently piqued my interest in alternative natural pest control methods and products.

It is well known amongst gardeners that the aroma from Marigolds and Basil will deter pests and that a beer bath will attract snails and slugs who then drown in the sweet liquid. A sprinkling of borax will kill ants and of course there are many variations to add that claim to be most effective.

Homemade garlic spray is used by many and again variations using chilli or onion mixed with soapy water will halt chewing and sucking bugs when applied regularly. I plant sacrificial Nasturtiums amongst my vegetables as alternative bug food with some success. A lesser known natural control is a bath of cooking oil to attract earwigs with the addition of soy sauce for increased effectiveness. I am yet to try this but maybe it will also attract the slaters infesting my garden.

The only sure way to exclude bugs from any garden is fully netting the whole area which is not always practical. At present, I plant extra and am prepared to share a little of my produce with the bugs.
