NEW CREATIVE KIDS PROGRAM

The voucher may be used with a registered activity provider for registration, participation and tuition costs for creative arts, speech, drama, dance, digital design, coding, and music lessons and activities.

The voucher can be used at any time during the calendar year it was issued. To use the voucher, give the details to your registered activity provider.






All our new leaders have taken on their roles wholeheartedly. They are working well with staff and students, helping with the smooth running of the school. Thanks Kids!

ST PATRICK'S SCHOOL



The opening school Mass and leadership badge presentation will be held on Thursday 14th February commencing at 10.00am. All are most welcome to attend.




