Winners of the Weekly Times Coles Farmer of the Year competition were announced 15<sup>th</sup> February. Congratulations to all involved from Greater Hume area.

Super congratulations to Tom and Phoebe Bull of Holbrook announced overall winner - Farmer of the Year, after earlier being announced Sheep Farmer of the Year. Tom and Phoebe operate Lambpro sheep studs from Kinross Station, where they run about 6,000 ewes producing genetics for a broad client base that will this year produce a whopping 800,000 lambs collectively.

Not one to rest on their laurels, the Bulls see their newest arm of the business, Kinross Station Hampshire Downs, as a research, development and genetics platform from which to produce the best tasting lamb through a focus on breeding sheep for intra-muscular fat,



#### HOLBROOK LOCAL HEALTH ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Holbrook Local Health Advisory Committee (LHAC) met on Tuesday 12 February to discuss important health issues for Holbrook town and community. Priority areas for discussion were:

- Recruitment of a GP to service the Holbrook Hospital
- Suggestions for upgrade of the Hospital's Nurses/ Locum Doctors accommodation
- Proposed introduction of Healthy Eating/Healthy Lifestyle Program for Holbrook Primary School Children

Our community has expressed concerns about access to GP Services at our local Holbrook Hospital. Currently there are three authorities acting on the Community's behalf to address this concern. The implications for the community of not having a GP with Visiting Medical Rights to the Hospital cannot be underestimated.

Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD, State body) is working with Murrumbidgee Primary Health Network (MPHN, Commonwealth body) to look at ways to address some of these issues." said Holbrook LHAC chair Judy Wettenhall.

Greater Hume Shire Council are addressing the issue also, with our Mayor Heather Wilton and General Manager Steven Pinnuck having lengthy discussions with politicians re our situation and concerns.

Hume Medical Service are also working on the recruitment of a suitably qualified doctor to meet the Hospital needs, to work alongside the two Doctors already at their clinic.

It is worth noting that Holbrook is far from being the only town with this issue-many rural towns in Australia are faced with exactly the same problem.

We need to stress to the Community that whilst there is no Doctor able to serve the needs of the Hospital, the Emergency Department is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and in fact, presentations to the Emergency Department have been higher than in previous times when we did have a GP available.

#### **COUNCIL NEWS - FEBRUARY**

Highlights from meeting held on 20 February:

- Council refused a development application for a primitive camping ground adjacent to the Billabong Creek north of Holbrook.
- In the event that the Glenellen Solar Farm development is approved by NSW Planning (*Council is not the consent authority*), and in response a request by the developers, Council resolved to respond that it will agree to enter into a Voluntary Planning Agreement (VPA), to receive a 1% contribution of the capital investment value of the proposed solar farm. Note that the VPA will only come into effect should approval for the Glenellen Solar Farm be granted by the NSW Department of Planning and Environment.
- Council endorsed the second quarter progress report of the Operational Plan and Delivery Program. Highlight achievements in the quarter included:
- Attracting additional road funding of \$6.4 M in the first six months of the year
- Negotiating a solution and funding with Federal and State Governments to continue long day care children services in Henty and Walla Walla
- Greater Hume Children Services announced winner of the NSW/ACT Service Excellent Award
- Completion of a number of road projects
- Council will undertake a customer satisfaction survey of residents during the first two weeks of April.
- Council will apply to NSW Government to allocate \$107,451 for a purpose built men's shed in the Holbrook Industrial Estate and an amount of \$5,970 will be allocated to a project in Culcairn. The funding opportunity is via remaining funds from the NSW State Government's Loose Fill Asbestos Insulation Community Assistance Program, and the decision followed community consultation with the Holbrook community in February.
- Council's quarterly budget review to 31 December 2018, reported that the projected 2018/2019 cash surplus will be \$15,976 which represents movement of \$34,756 on the budget surplus of \$50,732 as at 30 September.

# Next Council meeting will be held on 20 March 2019 at Carabost.






supplementary feeding.
