

The Common (or Indian Mynah is an introduced bird common in cities and towns. It has been spreading in our region over the last couple of years and we are now seeing birds in out local area. It has been in the district for a few years, usually on-farm around silos etc. Recently we have spotted it crossing the highway at Mully. Although not often a problem in the bush, it does displace native species in our farmland and is a competitor of the already limited hollows and nestboxes. Control of the few birds now may prevent them from establishing in numbers.

# THE HOLBROOK OP SHOP HAS A NEW HOME

The Op Shop, which is run by a group of dedicated volunteers, has shifted to 112 Albury Street, the former home of the town's wool stores.

It has taken a massive effort from a huge team but the stock has been unpacked and the doors will open on Monday.

Holbrook Anglican church congregation member and op shop stalwart Irene Lister has largely been responsible for organising the logistics of the move and said the new premises would offer a larger space to show off items.



"We are really thrilled with the displays and the goods we have for sale, which people can now see clearly," Mrs Lister said.

"It was a big decision to move but we are delighted with how everything looks and cannot wait to open the doors and welcome visitors."

The former Op Shop, which will continue to trade for some time to sell off existing stock, had been rented from Robert Peardon for 29 years and parish council paid tribute to Mr Peardon for providing a home for the business over that period.

It is expected the new op shop will be open for limited hours during Easter, to take advantage of passing trade.

The volunteers have unpacked a large range of winter goods which have been held over for the opening, with high quality jumpers, coats and winter wear now on display.

Income from the Holbrook Anglican Op Shop is devoted to the provision of a rector for the parish, but also acts as a service to the town by providing high quality goods at a reasonable cost.





Jay's Longest Melanoma March spanning 50 days; 2000 kms from Adelaide to Sydney, will pass through Holbrook on Thursday May 2. Jay and his team of walkers will chat with children from both schools to deliver vital sun safe messages.

Supported by The Rotary Club of Holbrook, everyone is invited for a night of Musical Bingo and fun at the RS Club on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> May starting at 6.30pm to raise funds for melanoma research, meet the team and hear Jay's story. Funds raised through Jays Longest Melanoma March 2019 will support a clinical trial combining radiation with immunotherapy for patients whose melanoma has spread to the brain.

Rotarian Jen Parer said the walkers are now underway and their progress can be tracked on http:// live.com.au/wheres-jay/ "Donations can be made to the Rotary Club of Holbrook if people would like to donate locally or they can donate directly to the charity get tax break a donate.melanomamarch.org.au/cms/Donate." Follow Jay's longest march on social media and learn more about melanoma, and information on how to get free skin checks. Although only five walkers accompany Jay on any given leg for safety reasons, people keen to the walk can email join in jaysmarch@melanoma.org.au.

Finding a cure for melanoma is close to Jay's heart. He was 32 years old when diagnosed with melanoma. A typical Aussie bloke, husband, dad, son and mate to many, he went from being a truck driver to cancer patient. Jay underwent immediate surgery and treatment and 10 years on, fighting fit and fighting for the cause to help raise awareness and find a cure for melanoma which kills one Australian every five hours. The Holbrook link: an enthusiastic member of Jay's team is Tony Locke, a cousin to the Holbrook Lockes. He is walking the 2000km with Jay and will catch up with family members during his whistle stop epic trek through the local area.
