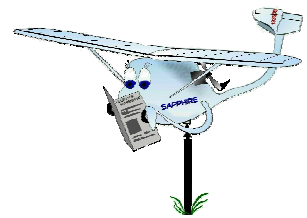

Out with the old and in with the new!

Over this last weekend, Trent, our president and technical guru has removed the old panel and system and wired in a new flash Panel and System. This new gear was partially funded by a grant received last year. It has taken quite a bit of time to buy all the necessary cabling-colour coded, connectors and switches. Much of the old gear, which has given valiant service, had been breaking down so that we were suddenly 'off air' several times in the last few weeks.

You can understand that this is a huge project for Trent Geddes. He needs to put in alternate circuits



to keep the station broadcasting while re-arranging the desk and the various controls. Last Saturday Tony used a temporary set-up for the football broadcast. Our next step is to train all the presenters to use the new panel.

Our station is almost 10 years old. We are keen to contact those who were farsighted and instrumental in setting up a community radio. We have had a large team of presenters, technicians and board members over the last 10 years and would like to hear some of the stories of that time. The Greater Hume Council has been a strong backer in that time and is continuing to be so.

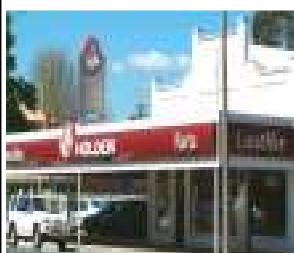

PLANT PICK PLATE

Winter is an ideal time to slip on the boots and get your hands dirty, in the garden. Fertilise, dig and mulch new beds in preparation for spring plantings and be sure to rotate your crops each year. I like to apply mulch up to 5 cm deep all year round. This depth allows for water penetration. A mulch blanket will insulate the plant roots from the winter cold and also from the summer heat. Use any decomposing mulch such as pea, sugar cane, straw, compost or newspaper which are all great, your plants and soil will



love it.

Unfortunately no amount of mulch will permanently deter weeds. I recall the gardening quote printed in the last H/H stated "A weed is a plant that has mastered every survival skill except for learning how to grow in rows. Doug Larson". So true! Weeds will forever be loathed by gardeners, yet continually receive our attention. I regularly remove weeds as I mulch to avoid working the same area twice, to save time actually. These green undesirables are full of nutrients so don't bin them, return the goodness to your soil. One method I have adopted is to leave them to starve and shrivel on top of the mulch to decompose back into the soil. Alternatively add them to your composting bin and let the microbes and worms eat them, though remove any noxious weeds. Another method is to make weed wee and drown them. Cover the weeds with water in a lidded bucket for a month or so, strain and apply as a liquid fertiliser then dilute if necessary. NOTE: Place the bucket at your back fence as the aroma is quite pungent. Oh, you had better inform the neighbours.

MEET ROTARY'S NEW PRESIDENT

Former chartered accountant Ian Davis is the Rotary Club of Holbrook's new president for the 2019-20 year. He and his wife Gail live at Old Thomond on the Mountain Creek Road, their son Tim and family are farmers at Jingellic. Ian says his sons Tim and Max call him the oldest and slow learning jackeroo in the business. Gail and Ian's daughter lives in the UK with husband Fletcher, and their baby.

Ian is originally from the Riverland country of South Australia. Grew up on a fruit block – 20 acres of dry land and 20 acres of wetland. His grandparents had won a soldier settlers block after WW1 and his father came back from WWII to plant a dryland block and was first to have a pump. Ian went on to university, gained an economics degree, became a chartered accountant and worked in the manufacturing industry for 20 years before retiring from the corporate world. Ian and Gail looked around for 12 months before coming here.

As a newcomer to the Holbrook district, Ian joined Rotary to meet new people and to give back to the community. Reflecting on the Holbrook club's achievement, he said during the last 34 years, the club has donated a total of \$340,000 with more than half going to the local community.

"Not all our activities leave a direct financial footprint such as the hard waste collection, maintenance on the hospital rotunda and the submarine picnic tables and flag shelter. But the legacy we leave our community makes it all worthwhile," he said.

Mr Davis drew attention to the thousands of lives saved by two vital projects Rotary has achieved on the world scene; the eradication of polio (almost) and the Australian medical research that discovered the cause of SIDS (SUDDEN INFANT DEATH SYNDROME).

What we are doing for mental health

Australian Rotary Health is the first and now the largest non-government funder of mental illness in Australia. Since 2000, we have been tackling one of the greatest challenges facing society. In recent years, the focus has been on mental health prevention particularly for our young people.

Some factors that will help children's mental well being include good sleep habits, alcohol later rather than earlier, exercise, affection from parents and eliminating parental conflict in the home, "don't fight in front of the kids."

Rotary funded research into cot deaths, SIDS

In Australia during the 1980s, parents found some 500 babies a year had died in their cots. In the effort to tackle the trauma of cot death and following a proposal from the Rotary Club of Mornington, an initiative from Rotarian Ian Scott set up the Australian Rotary Health Research Fund in 1981.

At the University of Tasmania Professor Terry Dwyer built his research team. 10,000 babies were recruited to the Rotary funded study. Sleeping position was not their principal hypothesis, they were looking at heart rate, temperature variation but the position in which the babies died couldn't be ignored. When they compared everything about circumstances of the infants that died with those that did not, sleeping position rang out loud and clear.

Professor Dwyer's research into sudden infant death syndrome brought outstanding results so much so that very quickly the number of infant deaths fell by 80 percent worldwide. His cot death research remains one of the most successful research outcomes in the world.

Today Terry Dwyer is Professor of Epidemiology at the University of Oxford. He is asked each year to tell the whole story to post graduate students in the medical school. We owe a lot to the business-minded Rotarians who established and drove the fund in the early days.

Regional Buses

Regional Buses is a partnership between established school and charter bus operators M & M Kane Pty.Ltd., t/a Bookabus, owned by Matt and Mel Kane and A.P.Ofak Pty.Ltd., t/a Burrum Bus Service, owned by Allan and Karen Ofak.

Matt and Mel have operated a school bus contract from 29/4/13 into Mullengandra Public School from Wymah until that school closed at the end of 2017, then into Table Top Public School from Term 1, 2018. They operate a busy charter business with a 24 seater and 21 seater buses.

Allan has operated the Burrumbuttock Public School bus service from 6/3/95 and has progressively expanded to include a service from Howlong to Burrumbuttock for St. Paul's College, Walla students as well as connecting several students onto Sharp's bus to Albury schools.

On 15/1/07 Allan, by this stage married to Karen, purchased the Brocklesby Public School contract. Again a busy charter business has developed with three 24 seater buses owned.

Matt and Allan met not long after Matt commenced on a school charter and very quickly developed a strong friendship, as well as co-operating on charter jobs.

In 2016 Matt and Allan caught wind of the new Point to Point Regulations in New South Wales which covered the operation of taxis, ubers, hire cars and buses under 12 seats. There was soon an announcement of trials in Sydney for on-demand bus services, using 12 seater buses. Operators were invited to submit ideas for trials in 2017 and eleven trials commenced in late 2017.

Allan and Matt were convinced that the government would announce applications for trials in rural New South Wales. We wanted to use our long experience in operating personalised charters to provide bus services to satisfy unmet community demands.

In February 2018 the NSW government, through Transport for New South Wales (TFNSW), did announce submissions for trials of on demand bus services in rural NSW. After many meetings Matt and Allan submitted proposals for three new services in June, 2018. In November, 2018 we were rapt to see our proposal for a service linking Burrumbuttock, Walla, Jindera and Albury. We had three months to get the service up and running. This was successfully done with the service under the Regional Buses trading name commencing on 11/2/19. This operates as a booked door to door personalised service at broadly the time our passengers require from 7.00am till 6.10pm Monday to Friday. We employ two fantastic customer focussed drivers to operate the service.

This service was a success from day one and to date has carried around 1,500 passengers from a catchment population of around 3,500 people. It averages around 19 passengers a day with the busiest day carrying 43 passengers. Numbers continue to build each month with the service allowing many people in the three communities access to work, special needs schools, medical appointments, shopping, TAFE, Albury Rail and Airport and a broad range of other purposes.

In April 2019 we were rapt to receive approval from TFNSW for a group of services commencing from Holbrook.

We had just over two months to get these services up and running and we commenced operation on 1/7/19.

The services operate as follows:

Monday and Wednesday-Return service commencing in Holbrook around 7.30am connecting Morven, Culcairn, Gerogery and Gerogery West to Albury. Returns from Albury around 2.30pm.

Tuesday and Thursday -Return service commencing in Holbrook around 7.30am, connecting Morven, Culcairn, Henty, Yerong Creek-The Rock, Uranquinty to Wagga. Returns around 2.30pm.

Friday. Return service commencing in Holbrook around 7.30am connecting Woomargama, Mullengandra to Albury. Returns from Albury around 2.30pm.

We have employed a fantastic, customer focussed local driver, Sean Atherton, to operate the service.

Again the service is door-to-door from each town served to whatever destination in Albury, Wagga or any other town served. In Albury and Wagga we also offer transfers between different destinations. An example is a passenger who has an appointment at Albury Base Hospital at 10.00am. That finishes at 11.00am and we can transfer that passenger to Lavington Square for shopping. That service is included in the fare.

Fares are real value for money and include concession fares and RED card fares for seniors at only \$2.50 for all day travel.

The service is a partnership between Regional Buses and Transport for New South Wales and is operating under a six month trial. Further periods of six months up to a maximum of two years are available.

We urge the communities to use the services to guarantee operation of this service.

Matt and Allan welcome feedback from the communities and will use that feedback to get Transport for New South Wales to alter the service to suit our passengers demand. Please do not hesitate to contact us.

PROTECTING YOURSELF AND OTHERS AGAINST FLU

Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD) is urging people who have flu symptoms to postpone visits to hospitals or aged care facilities until they have completely recovered.

"It is important the community takes seriously the risks associated with the winter flu season, said Director Public Health Tracey Oakman.

"The flu season is here and it is important that people, particularly vulnerable people, take care with regard to influenza. The flu virus is especially dangerous for elderly people, pregnant woman, Aboriginal people, very young children and people with underlying medical conditions," Mrs Oakman said.

Mrs Oakman reminded those visiting friends and family in the hospital or aged care facilities to practice good hand hygiene by using the alcohol based gel or foam provided to reduce the spread of germs.

"Over the past few weeks, there has been an increase in influenza cases in the area notified to the local Public Health Unit, and presenting to the local Emergency Department. We have also seen a number of cases in aged care facilities. In susceptible people, flu symptoms can quickly progress to become life-threatening," Mrs Oakman said.

In general, the flu is worse than a common cold, and symptoms such as fever, body aches, extreme tiredness, and dry cough are more common and intense, and often start suddenly.

Colds are usually milder than the flu and symptoms generally develop over a longer period. While vaccination is the best protection against flu, there are some simple steps to help infection spreading, such as:

- ♦ Wash your hands regularly with soap and running water
- ♦ Turn away from others and cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough and sneeze, if a tissue is not available cough or sneeze into your elbow
- ♦ Avoid close contact with people who are coughing or have a fever
- ♦ Stay at home if you are sick and keep sick children at home from school and other activities.

Concerned parents and families can seek health

advice and information via the free Health Direct Australia service, staffed by registered nurses 24-hours on 1800 022 222.

Flu shots are also free under the National Immunisation Program for pregnant women, people over 65 years of age, Aboriginal people and those with medical conditions such as asthma, diabetes and heart problems.

The NSW Government is spending a record \$22.75 million on statewide immunisation programs which will assist with flu prevention this season. This includes \$2.6 million for free flu shots to children up to five years of age and a \$1.5 million immunisation and influenza awareness campaign. The NSW Government has invested about \$130 million in the 2018-19 Immunisation Program budget, including Commonwealth and state vaccines.

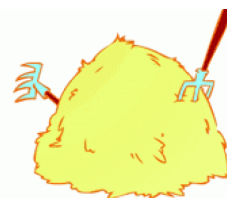
