After which the auction kicked off and it did not

disappoint, with so many generously donated quality auction items and keen bidders in the spirit of benefiting a worthy cause (or four).

their experience. Not one of the book week titles, but one of the favourites this week, was The Koala Who Could! This is a story about a little koala who was too scared to come down out of his tree but when forced to the ground is met with such love that he is no longer scared. The children learnt some



new facts about koalas' secret powers and made a very cute koala hand puppet.

The library was also buzzing on Thursday morning with 44 parents, carers and children for a special Book Week story time. Dom read The Sloth Who Came to Stay and showed children the special bird with secret powers and a big shell where children could hear the sound of the sea. The children made a secret power mask.

INDOOR AIR RANGE IN HOLBROOK

Shooting sports offer the opportunity for people of all ages to enjoy a safe and exciting sport. My experience with target shooting dates back to 1986, when I won my first Australian Title. From there I went on to be part of the 1990 Commonwealth Games team. Having competed in 7 Commonwealth and 2 Olympic Games, I am still shooting competitively 35 years later.

Target shooting requires concentration and a steady hand. People of all ages from 12 years to 112 years old can enjoy the sport. There are categories of Paralympic Indoor Shooting for wheelchair shooters and those with a disability. Able bodied shooters compete alongside Paralympic shooters – the aim being that ALL of us are included in the sport. Men and women shoot the same matches, and shooters are graded into sections according to ability – a

handicap system, similar to a golf handicap can be applied, to level the playing field.

Shooting has taken me around the world. from World the Championships in Moscow, the Athens, Olympic Games in competing Cuba, Delhi, Manchester all very exciting competitions.

I am looking forward to establishing an Indoor Air Range in Holbrook, so

that I may pass on my experience to local shooters, and hopefully see some of them aspire to international success. I am currently training towards the 2019 Oceania Shooting Championships, to be held in Sydney in November. These championships will decide on Olympic quota places for the Tokyo Olympic Games next year.

LAMB AND BACON CASSEROLE

5-6 Chump Chops, flour, 30g butter, 2 tblsp oil 125g bacon pieces, 1 large onion, 1½ tbsp extra flour, 1 tsp Worcestershire Sauce, 1 Tblsp Tomato Sauce, 1½ cups cold water, 1 Chicken stock cube.

Dust chops lightly with flour seasoned with salt and pepper. Heat butter, add chops, brown well. Remove chops and place into a casserole dish. Add peeled and chopped onion and chopped bacon to pan, sauté until onion is transparent.

Put onion and bacon mixture over chops in a casserole dish.

Add extra flour to pan, cook until brown.

Add water, worcestershire sauce, tomato sauce, crumbled stock cube, salt and pepper.

Stir until sauce boils and thickens, reduce heat and simmer 1 minute.

Pour over chops, cover, bake in moderate oven 1½ hours, or until chops are tender.

Serve with mashed potato and mixed frozen vegetables. Suitable to freeze. *Happy Dining Gayl*


Ian Scobie, the 4th member of this group, was not able to attend the lunch. Ian served in the Royal Australian Navy for the duration of the war.


Planning is also well underway for the Holbrook Landcare display at the Henty Field Days, which are now less than a month away.

Free entry to Field Days!! Billabong P&C will once again be manning the Eastern Gate at the HMFD from 17th-19th September. 




