There were some very high standard entries this year and the two winners, who both share the same sporting passion, were outstanding.

Not only did Kasey represent the South West Slopes and NSW in both mixed and girl sides she also represented Australia in a mixed side (4 girls and 4 boys) against New Zealand in a three-test series. Winning the series three nil. Kasey was named Best Junior Girl of the series. To represent one's country is as good as it gets and to perform brilliantly at the highest level is truly outstanding. Well done Kasey.

The Senior Sports Person for 2019 is world champion polocrosse player Lucy Grills. Lucy was a member of the Australian World Cup Team consisting of 4 men and 4 women, they won all their round games, in two of those,

Lucy developed Polocrosse 365, as well as Girl Talk which is a platform for young people to access skills, drills and knowledge. This led to her being nominated for The Women's Health Local Sporting Champion Award, which not surprisingly, she won. Both these girls are outstanding individuals in outstanding teams, and both encompass what this award represents. Holbrook is extremely proud of you both.

1. Youth, including improving skate park activities \$5000


2. Healthy catering for clubs, groups and community events, \$7000







RED BOWS – SO WHAT HAPPENED TO ALL THAT PLASTIC?


You might recall the red bow project last Christmas which featured red bows in Greater Hume's five main



towns. The project was made possible by grant funding received from the Riverina Water Community Grants program, Greater Hume Council and volunteers from Rotary Club of Holbrook, Culcairn, Henty, Walla Walla Community Development Committees, and Henty and Jindera Lions Clubs.

The plastic fabric was collected and last week delivered to David Hodge of Plastic Forests. Plastic Forests is an award winning Albury company which specialises in recycling and reprocessing of soft plastics from consumers, industry and agriculture. Council is investigating products it can buy back like garden barrier fabric and edging, bollards and car park wheel stops, because recycling doesn't work unless someone buys a recycled product.

We will keep you posted when this happens!

A healthy recipe idea: Pear & Banana Muffins

- 15 minutes preparation
- + 20 minutes cooking
- 3 serves of fruit per recipe
- Olive or canola oil spray
- 2 cups whole meal self-raising flour
- 2 cups white self-raising flour
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 150 mL low-fat natural yoghurt
- ½ cup orange juice
- 1 large banana, peeled and chopped
- 1 pear, cored and diced
- ½ cup buttermilk or low-fat milk

Preheat oven to 170°C. Lightly spray muffin trays with oil. Sift flours, returning husk from whole meal flour to the bowl, add brown sugar. In a separate bowl mix eggs, yoghurt and juice. Combine with the flour mix and fold through fruit and milk (you may need less milk depending on moisture in fruit). Do not over-mix. Spoon mixture into trays. Bake near the top of the oven for 18-20 minutes. Turn onto a wire rack to cool. Makes 24 muffins.



THE WOOLPACK INN MUSEUM NEWS

The roof restoration work undertaken at the museum in the latter part of 2019 was finalized in early December. The building is now nearly waterproof. Work was undertaken with a grant received from the Heritage Near Me Fund managed by the Federal Office of Environment and Heritage. The museum's committee was very fortunate to receive this funding and is now looking for other grant opportunities to finish the work.

At the recent Annual General Meeting of the museum's members, president Hugh Reid thanked the members for their hard work over the year ended 31 December 2019. In particular, he thanked the members who volunteer their time to enable the museum to stay open seven days a week. He also recognised Wilma Black's work in the museum's garden and Wendy Swan's project management of the roofing restoration works.

In her Treasurer's report Debbie Jones said that whilst membership numbers had increased slightly in 2018, visitor numbers were down. In particular, the number of children visiting the museum either with family or their school had declined. This was disappointing as in past years children and teachers from both schools in Holbrook visited quite often. The museum's volunteers continue to work at fund raising with market stalls and also catering for bus groups visiting the museum.

As with all volunteer organisations we are in urgent need of volunteers who will take an interest in the museum. We need energetic people with new ideas and skills to keep our museum relevant to our changing society.
